"Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us." Romans 5:1-5 NRSV

In April, I wrote that the Executive Committee and Council is working to insure that Fellowship continues to do our mission during the coronavirus. We thought things would be starting to get clearer by now. Unfortunately, as we have just postponed restarting worship services, we seem to still be in the middle of it. As mentioned in my last article, we continue to keep an eye on how we keep Fellowship going.

When this was starting, we had heard a church consultant predict that if a church is closed for 4 weeks, it could expect to lose 20% of its income. If it was closed 8 weeks or more, it could lose 30%. So, we planned for that kind of impact. In late March, we applied for a forgivable loan under the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP). Unfortunately, we were not approved before the funds ran out. Then, there was a second round in mid-April under the CARES act. We applied to our bank again and were approved for an \$18,000 forgivable loan on May 1. The program is intended to help payroll expenses and we have used it for that purpose. It was intended to help us cover those expenses in case we saw the impact predicted by those consultants.

We've been fortunate that our income has only dropped 5% to 10% so far. That is mostly due to lost facility use income. Generally, our members have managed to maintain their giving to Fellowship. THANK YOU! That has really helped the congregation. Now, with the delay in restarting, we have a cushion to tide us over until the coronavirus situation stabilizes again. We hope that that happens soon. The proceeds from the PPP will continue to help us cover our payroll and other eligible expenses as this drags on.

We will be applying for forgiveness of the loan once we reach the end of the forgiveness period. We should meet all of the criteria. We hope to have most or all of it forgiven when we complete it. In the meantime, we have managed to keep some of our missional work going. We were blessed with a Blessing Box out front to help our neighbors with food and other supplies. I know some people have contributed to that. If you'd like to help out, you can drop off non-perishable food items in the box out in front of the church. We also held a food drive for the Smoky Row Food Pantry, subsidized by an action grant from Thrivent Financial. And, of course, we are publishing our worship services on the internet where they are receiving more than 100 views each week. Hopefully, many of those are reaching people who are not regular attendees of Fellowship.

I know these are difficult times for everyone, both for church and personally. As we used to say in the 70s, "keep the faith." Eventually, things will get more normal.

I would like to provide you with the current look of Our Church. I wish I had a video as we have accomplished a lot of behind the scenes work. I want to thank Mike and Bruce for spending the hottest Saturday morning of this year (LOL) to help stain the wood Cross on the entrance side of Our Church, also the bench by the entrance and the basketball bench. We also were able to organize and re-paint the back shed (which looks awesome).

If you have not been by Our Church lately, please take some time to pull in and drive by. We worked with Cody (the team that cuts our grass) on a reasonable bid to complete our landscaping project. And I must say it looks fantastic, a spectacular make-over of the first impression any of you will see and any potential new parishioners in the future when we get through our current Covid-19 situation. The inside of Our Church was deep cleaned to high standards for preparation of potential future services. When the curve begins to flatten again, we will meet back together. As we all know, the recent increased cases of the Virus has prohibited us from getting back together. We installed hand sanitizer stations in strategic locations. We also separated the rows of seats in the sanctuary by removing every other row for safe distancing so we will feel comfortable when we can get back together again. And by the way, the inside of Our Church also looks spectacular.

Some future projects

- 1. Looking for bids to replace the basketball hoop that had the glass shattered about two months ago. I did not realize that this may be around \$900 to replace.
- 2. This one is a project we must do. I am asking if any of you know of some personal painters and or a reputable company. We need to paint the Narthex, the restrooms, the hallway going back to the classrooms and our gathering area. We have to have Our Church looking upgraded and fresh for our own satisfaction and also for new potential members when they visit our congregation. - 3. We had to replace a compressor coil on the office air conditioner, and this week we will be repairing the sanctuary side air conditioner at a cost of \$2600 due to a blown compressor.

That's about it, on the positive side, Our Church is ready to get back to normal as I know we all are – if any one needs any thing and or can help, give us a call, and if you do get a chance please drive by and check out the landscaping. Many thanks to Bruce for donating your time and helping with the flower planting, weeding and watering, it is truly appreciated. And also to Mike for your time. John

We'll continue to monitor the COVID-19 situation to inform a decision about our eventual return in in-person worship services.
