Christ has Risen!



Alleluia! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed, Alleluia!

One of the many things I love about our church season is that it keeps going! For example, in the secular world, Christmas is done and over with in one day. After the presents are all opened, many secular minds are let down because the "fun" is all done. Likewise

with the secular world's view of Easter... After the eggs are all found and the chocolate is all eaten, the only thing the world is left with is a tummy-ache!

But not in the church! In the church, we get to celebrate Christmas for weeks. The same goes for Easter. Even though the buzz of Easter Sunday has gone away and some of the fanfare has indeed vanished, we're still in the season of Easter! The joy of the resurrection of Jesus is far too great to be contained on one day, however special our celebration of Easter may be. The glorious news that Jesus was not in the tomb, that He has risen, never to die again takes up an entire season on our church calendar. Have you noticed the colors on the altar and on my stole? They're still white. Our hymns are still hymns proclaiming the resurrection. Our worship services are still services of Easter joy!

We get to celebrate Easter not just for a day or two, but for a whole SEASON! And during this season of Easter, we are able to stay fixated upon the Easter resurrection of Christ and to view it from many different angles, and from many different sides - much in

the same way you would with a beautiful diamond; turning it around and around to gaze upon its beauty from so many different sides and angles.

One beautiful facet of Easter we can view is the resurrection appearances of Christ. Late in the evening on Easter Sunday, Jesus appeared to two disciples who were walking on the road to the town of Emmaus. These two men saw Jesus, but didn't realize it was Jesus. They saw Jesus walking right next to them, but they didn't realize this was the resurrected Jesus. They were staring right into the brilliance of the Son of God's face, but they did not realize this was the Son of God. They walked and talked with God, but didn't even realize it.

But then all of this changed. As soon as Jesus took bread, gave thanks, broke it, and gave it to them - a veil fell away from

their eyes and they finally saw Jesus for who He is; the Passover lamb who is risen from the dead and whose reign will never end! I pray during this Easter season, and every season of the church year, that our eyes will never deceive us. Look upon Christ as the one who was slain, but now who lives and reigns forever and ever. Gaze upon Him as you would a many faceted diamond always seeing the different ways He loves you, comes to you, keeps His promises to you, and how He will never fail you.

As of April 1, a quarter of our journey through 2019 has finished and I wanted to give you a status update on Fellowship for the first quarter.

A good way to measure our vitality is how we are living up to our mission of sharing God's love and grace through our words and actions. When we follow that mission, we follow God's will and do his ministry here on Sawmill Road. So, how are we doing for the first quarter? The new Council is working on leading the congregation in our mission. We are developing focus areas for our respective ministry areas and generating new ideas of how we can best deploy our resources. Council is an exciting place right now and I hope you sense that excitement.

The planning for the Amazing Grace Day Camp is well underway and we are taking enrollments. We already have 14 campers signed up. We are working on getting a date for Pumpkin Patch for the fall that will



focus our resources on the most important part of the patch. We are doing a lot of fellowship activities, such as the Easter breakfast, host boards, men's and women's nights out to build our relationships that help us come together in our faith family.

The energy level in the congregation is high and positive. This is evidenced by the fact that we have had a significant number of visitors in the first quarter who are now attending regularly. Our visitors and others that we talk to and hear from, tell us that they are impressed about how much ministry we do for our size.

Council is working on improving our ability to invite people to Fellowship and welcome them when they come. We put together some business-type cards to use to invite people to our church. They are out on the table in the narthex. Please take a few to give away. We have done some mailings of invitations to come to visit Fellowship. I see how the energy of our members rises welcoming visitors when they come to Fellowship and our visitors have noticed, too.

On the financial side, we are in pretty good shape. We started the year with a balance in our operating fund of \$6,058 and we ended March at \$8,001. Our goal is to increase our benevolence and ministries. If we maintain this momentum we can increase that in next year's budget. We have identified some additional savings, too. We changed our insurance carrier and reduced our annual insurance bill by over \$2,200. We identified a change to our One-Call-Now subscription that willl save us \$200 per year.

There are lots of opportunities to share God's love and grace. Please consider your talents and assets and how you can support the mission and ministry of Fellowship. And, don't be afraid to try something new. We have teams that need your help. What team(s) fit your passions and interests?
