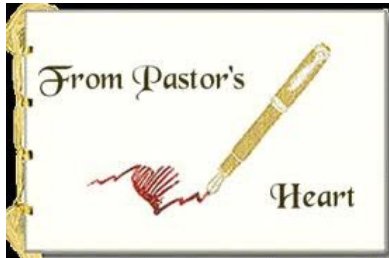

As many of you know, the ELCA Churchwide Assembly recently adopted a resolution that, among other things, declared the ELCA a sanctuary denomination. So what does this mean exactly? Here are some comments and talking points from our presiding bishop, The Rev. Elizabeth Eaton, after this resolution was passed. As always,

A Message from Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton

Our call to love our neighbor is central to our faith. In our baptismal covenant we promise to strive for peace and justice in all the world. One of the ways we live out this vow is through our commitment to welcoming the stranger. With this declaration, we publicly state that walking alongside refugees and immigrants is a matter of faith.

- In its simplest form, becoming a sanctuary denomination means that the ELCA is publicly declaring that walking alongside immigrants and refugees is a matter of faith. The ELCA Churchwide Assembly, the highest legislative authority of the ELCA, declared that when we preach on Sunday that Jesus told us to welcome, we will use our hands and voices on Monday to make sure it happens.
- Being a sanctuary denomination does not call for any person, congregation or synod to engage in any illegal actions.
- We have a broken system regarding immigration, refugees and asylum-seekers. To declare ourselves a sanctuary church body is to say that we seek to provide concrete resources to assist the most vulnerable who are feeling the sharp edges of this broken system.
- Being a sanctuary denomination is about loving our neighbors. While we may have different ideas about how to fix this broken system and may have different ways of loving our neighbors, our call to love our neighbor is central to our faith.
- Being a sanctuary denomination will look different in different contexts. It may mean providing space for people to live; providing financial and legal support to those who are working through the immigration system; or supporting other congregations and service providers. We cannot mandate or direct our congregations to respond in specific ways. Each must work out what this means for them in their context.
- Our faith communities are already doing sanctuary work - hosting English as a second language (ESL) classes, providing housing, having thoughtful conversations about what our faith says about immigration, etc.
- Except for our members whose ancestors were here before European settlement or others who were forced to come to the U.S. against their will, The ELCA is an immigrant church. Our decades long work with immigrants and refugees is how we practice our faith in the world. Lutherans started Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service, one of the nine refugee resettlement agencies in the U.S.
- Through the AMMPARO (Accompanying Migrant Minors with Protection, Advocacy, Representation and Opportunities) strategy, passed by the last churchwide assembly, we are also working through our global partners in Central America to alleviate the conditions that cause people to migrate.
- Welcoming people is not a political issue for us, it is a matter of faith.

*But the one who had received the one talent went off and dug a hole in the ground and hid his master's money. **Matthew 25:18 NSRV***

This verse is from Jesus' parable of the talents. In our Discipleship Fest a couple weeks ago, our theme was putting our talents to work sharing God's love and grace. Whatever our talents are, God does not want us to hide and hoard our talents. He wants us to deploy them to share his love and grace and bring others into his gang of disciples. I encourage you to think about your talents and how you might put them to use for God and for Fellowship.

Things are getting busy at Fellowship for the fall. We had our Discipleship Fest, our Rally Day, Sunday School is starting up, pumpkins are coming October 13, our Stewardship campaign is coming soon, and we're having our Congregational meeting on Sunday, November 10.

The major order of business for the Congregational Meeting is to approve our budget for 2020. Last year, we made a lot of hard decisions about what to cut in order to make the budget work. We have had a good year so far. Our operating fund has stayed close to our original starting balance, even through the summer. Usually, summer is a time when our funds shrink. We are going into the fall with a healthy balance. We will send the proposed budget out prior to the Nov. 10 meeting. We will have an open forum following the vote on approving the budget. If there are other issues that you'd like to discuss, or motions you want to propose, please send them to me prior to the meeting.

Council will be preparing a budget request for this year. We have a number of things we'd like to do to start us back to restoring some of the things we had to cut last year. Remembering that everything we are doing goes to share God's love and grace, everything we cut or everything we can increase matters. Some things are sexier than others, but they are still necessary. You might think that routine things like doing upkeep on the building and grounds are not very missional. But, imagine if you invite someone to church, and the parking lot is rough, or not plowed, or the bathrooms or nursery are dingy and need paint, what is the likelihood that your invitee will want to come back? First impressions matter and so do the non-sexy things. We may have lost a potential disciple.

My vision for Fellowship, is that we would be vibrant, relevant, and involved in our local community, living our purpose statement of sharing God's love and grace through our words and actions. I and council would be very interested in what you think our priorities should be for this year. The next page has a survey on budget priorities. Please give some thought to what you think is important for us. There are things on the survey that council has discussed and room for you to add something of your own. If there are good ideas, there will always be ways to fund them. One way is to use grants from Thrivent as seed money as well as special requests.

_____ Provide raise for Sunday evening pianist – approximately \$1,300 annual

_____ Provide raise for organist – approximately \$300 - \$500 annual

_____ Begin increasing Pastor back to full time – Synod minimum increase (about \$500) plus \$1,000 to \$2,000 for 2020 (Recommended full-time salary for 2019 was about \$46,000, we are paying $\frac{3}{4}$ this year which is about \$34,000)

Aside from these above to rank, we also have some additional building work that needs to be done. We only replaced part of the roof. The remaining parts of the roof are between 23 and 30 years old. There are a number of other things like painting, drywall repair, etc. that need to be done in the next several years. How willing would you be to support a capital campaign to support these projects? The remainder of the roof repair is probably between \$40,000 and \$50,000. If we do it all at once, it would tend to be cheaper overall. Assuming a total of \$50,000, Spread over 50+ families in our congregation, that is about \$1,000 each. The other things that we know about are much smaller, but a little drywall repair can turn into a lot of drywall repair if there is more damage that becomes evident when repairs begin.
