Greetings Fellowship members and friends!

Our Gospel lesson this past Sunday on the rich man and Lazarus, and a conversation with one of our members following our morning service made me think of Jesus' words in the passage above. Jesus makes it clear that we are to care for those in need - the helpless, the vulnerable, the homeless, the marginalized of society. One author writes, "Love of the other serves as a litmus test of the true measure of our love of God. This concern and action are not merely options for when we have spare time or some extra change. They are absolute imperatives." (Jerry Kearney, True Worship in The Upper Room Disciplines 2012).

On Sunday, October 16th, immediately following our morning worship service, we will have an opportunity to show this "love of the other" as we celebrate the life of Betty. Gayle Anderson, who joined Fellowship in the summer, welcomed Betty, a homeless woman, into her home for the last three years after being notified by her son of a woman in great need at Walmart. Betty recently died, and we will celebrate Betty's life on the 16th. Please join us for worship that day.

Thank you to all who helped out with the blessing bags for those in need in our community on God's Work. Our Hands Sunday. What a blessing you all are!

As I write this, I am reminded of seasons changing yet again and how our church goes through different seasons as well. The cooler air is a respite and brings with it anticipation of changing leaves and fun Fall activities. I really enjoyed the outdoor service in August. Cindy Frey always does a great job coordinating Congregational Life events. We also had a great turnout before church on Rally Day a few weeks ago. I loved seeing the enthusiasm as everyone came together to create so many Blessing Bags! Events like the remind me of what a giving congregation we are. I know that those Blessing Bags will be used often to help the increasing number of individuals seeking help from the church.

In September, an email was sent out regarding updating the Constitution to reflect Fellowship's current membership and leadership participation. I would like to thank members Ruth Albert and Mike Rankin for their hard work in going through the Constitution to provide suggestions. The proposed updated Constitution was approved by Council on September 15th and will need to be voted on at the special Congregational meeting on October 23rd. Please take time to read it and direct any questions/concerns you have to myself or any other member of Council. I hope that you all can make it to the brief meeting following service on October 23rd.

Council continues to discuss building repair challenges. We recently had our roof repaired which should fix the ongoing issue with leaks in the classroom. Fellowship recently had a visit from the Fire Inspector and we had to quickly make changes to install exit signs for doors leading to the Prayer Garden. We were able to make other needed testing updates with our vendor Koorsen. We remain hopeful to update the lighting in the Sanctuary as our special Capital fund allows. The updated system will allow for more energy efficiency and give us savings on our electric bills.

Outreach

The Blessing Bags are intended to nurture an individual who needs immediate support to get to a location of greater sustainment, such as a shelter and/or food pantry. Each bag received a verse or positive slogan of hope and resilience, as evidenced by the following examples:

- Trust God! For I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord. They are plans for good and not for disaster, to give you a future and a hope. Jeremiah 29:11
- ... those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary. They will walk and not be faint. Isaiah 40:31

A special 'thank you' goes to the Education Team (chaired by Dianna Roll), Congregational Life Team (chaired by Cindy Frey), and Bill Lude for the treats and decorations to celebrate our coming together. Twenty-nine (29) of us – adults and children - filled the room with joy, helpful hands, and early morning appetites. It was WONDERFUL, UPLIFTING, and FUN!

The Outreach Team elected to distribute funds from the financial gift of the sale of Grace Lutheran Church, Crescent, PA to Smoky Row Food Pantry, Life Care Alliance specified for Meals-on-Wheels, ELCA Lutheran World Hunger, ELCA Disaster Relief, and to Fellowship Lutheran Church (FLC) specified for the Blessing Bags. The gifted funds have been a blessing for the non-profit organizations that are struggling to support the growing population of homeless, food insecure, and immigrants who are escaping conflict and persecution.

John Votino Property & Stewardship September 2022

Property Updates:

Bélow is an explanation of projects completed since June and some unexpected Costs that we had to incur. We are getting closer with our Generosity Giving from the Team Fellowship Congregation to complete our final project at this time for the Lighting Repair.

Roof has been repaired above the classroom. Cost was \$6400 - paid out of the generosity Giving Capital account for lighting and roofing

Fire inspection - we had several code violations which we did bring up to code - basic upgrade for emergency lighting (replaced 9 batteries in our emergency lighting system) and having exit access from the prayer garden. The invoice total was \$930.14 - paid out of building funds. Also paid from our building funds, was \$503.39 to test and replace batteries on our fire alarms.

Cross electric completed the wiring and install of the exit signs. The invoice total was \$2160 - paid out of building funds.

Trimmed the flowers

I will be discussing a fall clean up in the near future - but the outside of the property is looking pretty good.
