Let's come together on Reformation Sunday (don't forget to wear red!) not only to remember the past but to look ahead with faith and hope for what God will continue to do through us.


We are approaching our annual meeting on November 17 following worship service. At that meeting, we will be electing new officers and council members to serve Fellowship for 2025 and 2026. Our **nominating committee** has been working since June to call servants to fill the roles of president, vice president, secretary, and three at-large council members. We thank the nominating committee for their time and efforts in calling a strong set of leadership and pray that our members will support them as they lead us into the future. We also thank those who have accepted roles in the incoming leadership for their willingness to serve our church.

Fellowship's annual Congregational Meeting will be on Sunday, November 17, 2024, immediately following worship service. At that meeting we will elect our officers and council members for 2025-26 and will also vote on the proposed budget for 2025. More details on the meeting, notably the proposed budget and the proposed 2025-26 leadership, will be provided to all members prior to the Congregational Meeting for review.

The nominating committee has also worked to call a new treasurer, a position which is appointed by the church's Executive Committee (Pastor, president, vice president, and secretary). We look forward to accomplishing this before the end of 2024 to allow a transition from Todd Engen as treasurer to a new person in that role. We thank Todd for his time, effort, and dedication while serving as Fellowship's treasurer for the past few years.


