God's Love and Ours

⁷Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. ⁸Whoever does not love does not know God, because *God is love*.

To understand love and to truly nurture your marital garden. You must understand rich soil produces life. God is the breath of life and **God is love!** To ensure growth in your marital soil, your marital garden must not only be implanted with both the breath of life and God's love, but it must be cultivated with a special loving touch such as a **green thumb** to be truly cared for.

Green Thumb Meaning. To be **naturally skilled** at **gardening**; to be able to **help** plants **grow well**. Origin. One theory is that this idiom came into being in the early 1900s and was thought to refer to the mud-stained fingers of gardeners.

In fact, the mud-stained fingers are Gods and the soil we were created in was embedded in love. God created man in love from the dust of the ground. It was within the Garden of Eden, where he breathed life into man; one of his many acts of devotion upon the creation of earth.

The Gift of Cultivation

Man-Made vs. God-Made

Creating an atmosphere of Initiation and Imitation of Love

1 Corinthians 3:7 Amplified Bible

⁷ So neither is the one who plants nor the one who waters anything, **but [only] God who causes the growth.**

Typically, in a man-made garden, the gardener must find the perfect conditions to plant and water the right seed. However, in the *Master Gardner's*, garden, He creates growth in the atmosphere to create the perfect condition to surround the marital garden. **That's what real love does!** It takes root! It sprouts and survives the most perilous conditions. The growth of real love and intimacy create an atmosphere of love to inspire those within that atmosphere to **imitate** their surroundings.

Be Imitators of God

5 Therefore become imitators of God [copy Him and follow His example], as well-beloved children [imitate their father];

Adam, from his inception was made in the likeness of God; like most children it was Adam's responsibility as a man to imitate God-to follow his example and cultivate his marital garden. Because man is the first in the heavenly hierarchy of the household and is also first in succession under the Lord, it is up to the husband to not only create the atmosphere of intimacy in his relationship, but it is the husbands' key role to be the initiator of love in his marriage.

The Husband Must Love His Wife

"The main responsibility of the man is summed up in three words: "Love your wives" (Ephesians 5:25). Husbands hold the key to a flourishing marriage. Men are to be initiators. The wife comes into full **fruition** and submission **in response** to the husband **loving her as he should**."

Understanding the gender roles within your marital garden is essential in blossoming not only romance in your marriage but increasing and defining foundational love as well. Love is not something that just happens overnight nor is the ability to pick the perfect mate. That is why God is the author and finisher of our fates. He knows the "number of hairs on your head" and "knitted you together when you were in your mother's womb". It makes sense, that he naturally knows the exact character measurements and emotional design of the perfect mates for us. However, in modern relationships impatience has taken the place of God's perfect will; causing the mate selection process to drastically move out of Godly order such as, moving in before marriage, sex before marriage, children prior to commitment, and lust before love.

To be clear, no one is perfect and statements such as these are not meant to condemn you or your mate if you have stepped out of Godly order in your relationship, these statements or Godly convictions are stated to remind you that God has your best intentions in mind, and He has from the moment he created you! He knows what you need, and he knows what you want! Trust in the Lord with all your heart that he will provide a helpmate that is **suitable** to you.

How A Wife's Submission Comes into Fruition

"You're not alone in wondering how to interpret biblical submission in marriage. It's a touchy subject, not least because it's often misunderstood as being sexist or no-matter-what obedience. Add in our Western culture — where a me-focused lifestyle is easy to come by — and the internal and external conflict you described is real.

A closer look at Scripture, though, shows the full picture of marriage: a relationship that mirrors the love between Christ and His Church. When a husband submits to the Lord, leading his wife with a servant's heart and nurturing her God-given talents, she can confidently submit to him — lean on him and trust his covering. That will always be relevant".

Marriage Like Christ and the Church

²² Wives, be *subject* ato your own husbands, as [a service] to the Lord. ²³ For the husband is head of the wife, as Christ is head of the church, Himself *being* the Savior of the body. ²⁴ But as the church is subject to Christ, so also wives should be subject to their husbands in everything [respecting both their position as protector and their responsibility to God as head of the house].

How to Increase Marital Garden Yields?

As a wife, the best way for submission to bloom in your marital garden is understanding that the word "submission" is not a bad word. Submit" means "to give over or <u>yield</u> to the power or authority of another. It does not mean that you as a woman are inferior, Ephesians 5:22-24 lays out the line of succession, in marriage, the heavenly hierarchy of the household. However, to be clear submission is not domineering either.

The truth is many wives would feel more confident in submitting to their spouses if their husbands cultivated the atmosphere of love around them better. Meaning, sometimes it is hard to submit to being led down the garden path if you do not trust where you husband is leading you to. Wives need a destination, a growth plan to understand where the future of their relationship is going. It is essential to a wife to know where she stands in her marriage, this cannot be a mystery. A flourishing martial garden must be rooted in submission to gain submission. *In Ephesians 5:21, it states, submit (or yield) to one another out of reverence for the Lord.*" This is where husbands and wives must water their marital gardens with "yielding" communication. As co-heirs to the throne of grace, make your feelings known to one another. Be "Naked and Not Ashamed" in your marital garden and tell each other what you need to feel safe. Submission in this context also mirrors Christ love for the church. Submission simply means "respect". Wives, will you respect your husbands' position in the household as initiator of love, as protector and as the spiritual head of your family? If you cannot...then why get married?

The Green House Effect

Don't Stunt Your Growth!

The grass is greener...where you water it! To attain your green thumb in love you must make sure your love is equal. Both the husband and the wife should be equally watered thus equally having an opportunity for growth. However, when you start your marriage garden on unequal footing, your marriage is often over before it even begins!

The Equally Yoked Mandate

¹⁴ Do not be unequally bound together with unbelievers [do not make mismatched alliances with them, inconsistent with your faith]. For what partnership can righteousness have with lawlessness? Or what fellowship can light have with darkness?

Why Introduce Pestilence into Your Garden?

Do not start your marriage of on the wrong footing?

Starting off on the Wrong Foot is an Understatement!

The Greek meaning of unequally yoked or **Heterozygous**. (**from héteros**, "**another of a different kind**" **zygós**, "**a yoke, joining two to a single plow**") – properly, different kinds of people joined together but unevenly matched; hence "unequally yoked" (not aptly joined) or "**mismatched**" attaching or binding yourself to someone in marriage that is running contrary to faith.

• Literally two individuals-running in two different directions at a high rate of speed while tethered together.

Adjust, the earlier metaphor of starting off on the wrong foot. Marrying an unbeliever is more like having one broken right foot in a race for your life. Realize that throughout your **marriage race** that a broken right foot is a painful burden; especially the longer you attempt to stand upright, injured-the less likely that right foot will be able to heal properly, over time it will become infected and will not only hold you back but will contaminate your entire blood stream.

What is the difference between a Contractual and Covenant Marriage?

Contract: What do I get? **Covenant:** What can I give?

Contract: I'll meet you halfway **Covenant:** I'll give you 110%

Contract: I have to do it **Covenant:** I want to do it
