



Bracelands campsite site rules

Thank you for choosing Bracelands campsite, we wish you a enjoyable stay. An information leaflet with these rules will also be handed to you on arrival, we'd appreciate you familiarising yourselves.

Dogs

- A maximum of 3 dogs per pitch are welcome and camp for free. There is a pet supplement of £20 per stay for dogs staying in the pet friendly glamping units (max 2).
- Only assistance dogs are permitted in the toilet blocks.
- Please always keep dogs on leads and use the dog waste bins provided. If there is an incident on-site involving your dog(s) you may be asked to leave the campsite immediately with no refund offered.

For the safety of all our visitors

- The main campsite gates are locked between the hours of 10.30pm and 07.30am, so no vehicle access is permitted, and we do not accept any arrivals.
- Please respect the sites one way system and adhere to a strict 5mph speed limit.
- Take special care when driving or cycling on site to keep all children and wildlife safe.
- E-scooters should not be ridden within the campsite grounds. Cycles are permitted on public roads and waymarked routes.
- Generators are not permitted on site.
- Washing lines, hammocks, tree swings or any other structure cannot be tethered to the trees and will be removed.
- Fireworks, the flying of kites and drones are also prohibited.
- To protect our beautiful forests, open fires are not permitted and no burning of natural wood before, during or after your barbeques. However, you may burn specialised eco-logs for a similar effect.
- BBQs may be lit, providing they are raised off the ground, in a suitable container and extinguished by 10.30pm
- Please ensure smoke and fumes do not annoy other site users. When the fire risk is high (dry weather), the use of barbecues may be restricted.
- Due to fire safety, you must pitch at least six metres away from other camping units. If this rule is not adhered to you will be asked to re-pitch. (Please see diagrams on toilet blocks around the site, or ask a member of the team if you are unsure)
- Think about your actions and impact on the environment, whether that's picking flowers or feeding the animals as this can make them poorly.



Emergencies

- In the event of an emergency please call the relevant services accordingly and alert campsite staff at reception or by ringing the doorbell on the site office door if unmanned.
- In the event of a blue light emergency please contact a member of staff who will be able to allow vehicle access if the gates are secured.
- The information leaflet given to you on arrival also contains a list of emergency contacts including human and animal hospitals.

Courtesy to all

- To respect the enjoyment of others, we ask that noise levels are kept to a minimum especially after 10pm
- Please refrain from driving on the campsite after 10:00pm. If you find you need to, please keep to the site speed limited is 5mph.
- Visitors are welcome on site (charges do apply, please ask at reception). Any visitors may arrive from 9am and will be required to depart the site by 9.00pm.

Extending your stay

- We ask you vacate your pitch by 11am
- Glamping departure time is 10am
- Should you wish to extend your stay or enquire about a later check-out time please contact reception before 10am on the morning of your departure.
