Then, they bring their ideas to life and usually start a business to sell their ideas.

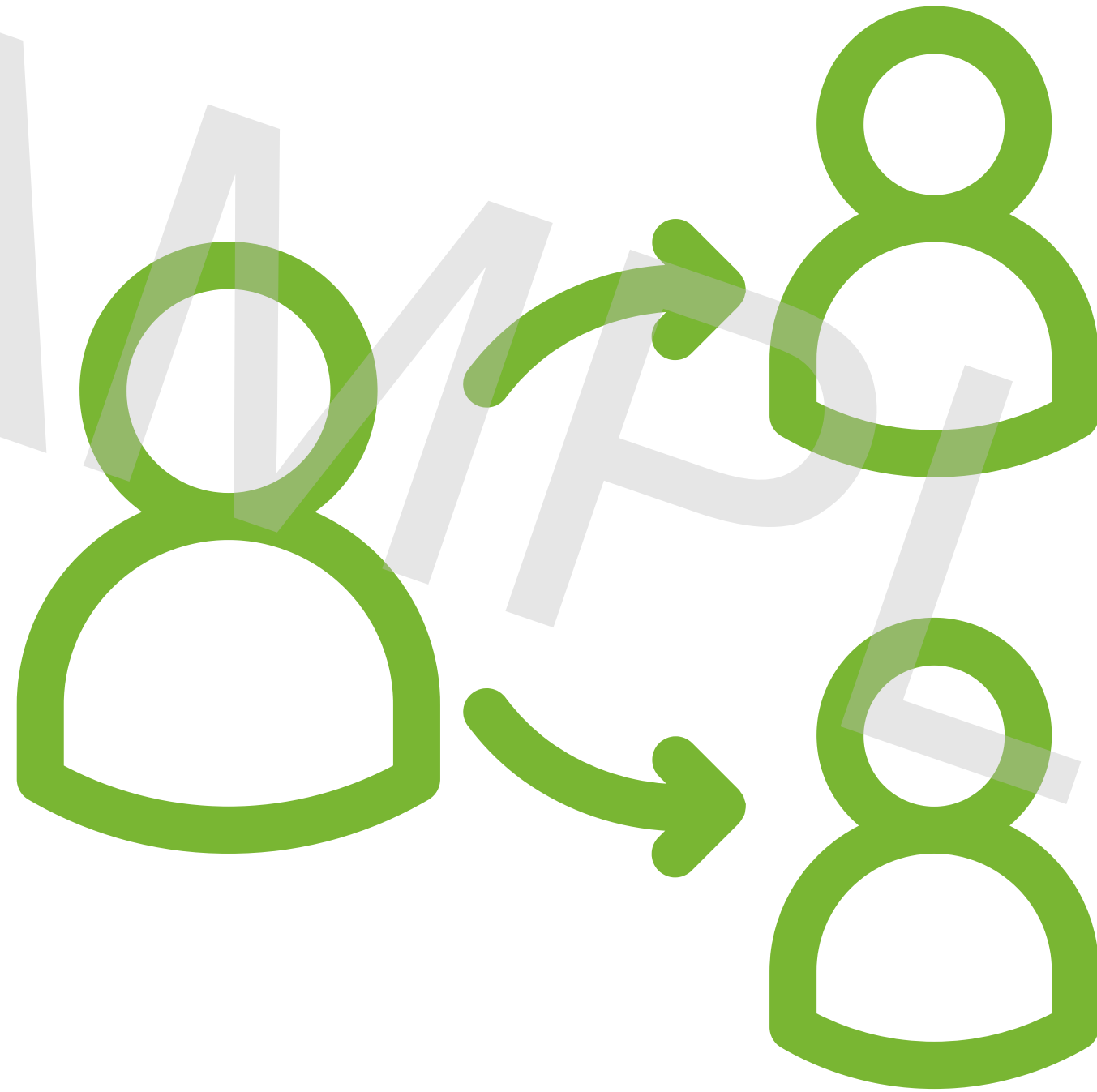

Money you
earn by
running your
business



Expenses

Money you need to spend to start your business.



Revenue

You will charge \$7 per sock puppet and plan to sell 10
(\$7X10=\$70)

Expenses (\$22)

- Socks (\$12)
- Stuffing (\$5)
- Thread (\$5)



How to Calculate Expenses?

Add up the price of all of the things you need to buy to start your business.



How to Calculate Revenue?

- You need to know **2 things!**
- Can you guess what **2 things** you need to know?



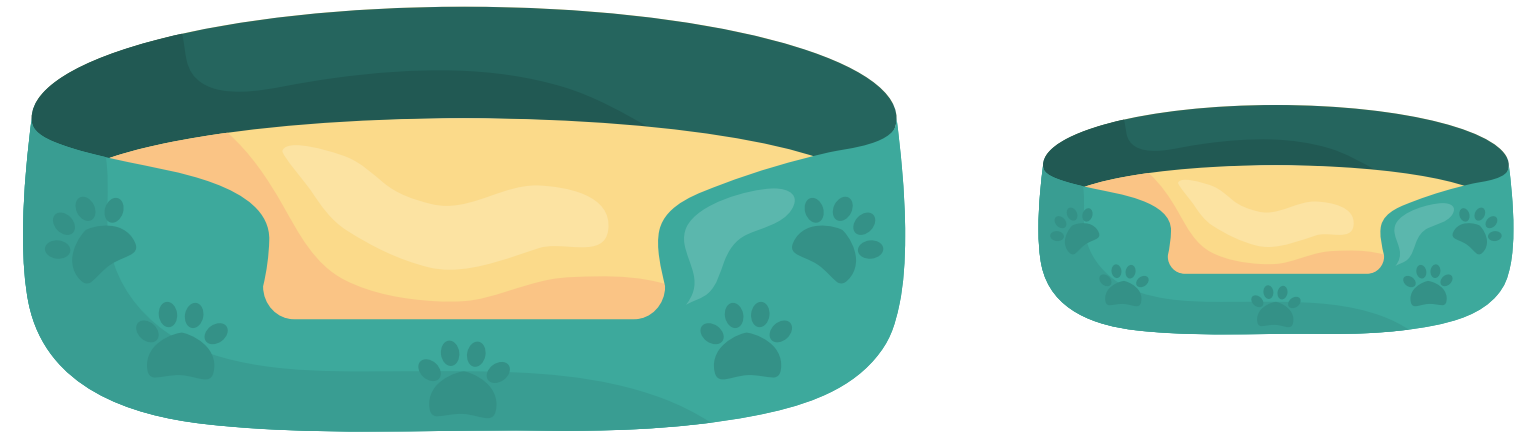
Singing Lessons

- **PRICE: \$50/lesson**
- **UNITS: 10 lessons**

REVENUE is $\$50 \times 10 = \500



Dog Beds




PRICE:

- \$50/ small bed
- \$60/medium bed
- \$75/large bed




UNITS: 10 small, 10 medium, 4 large

REVENUE is: $(\$50 \times 10) + (\$60 \times 10) + (\$75 \times 4) = \1400

Revenue & Expenses Profit or Loss?

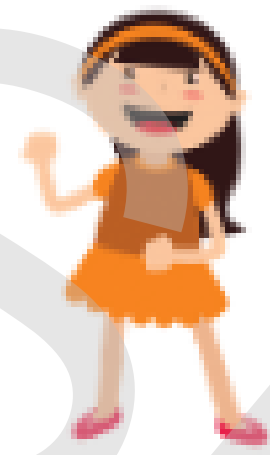
