Consumed Seven Days. One Flame. All In.

We weren't made for lukewarm living. We were created to burn — with passion, with purpose, with the unquenchable fire of God's presence. Consumed isn't just a devotional. It's a call back to the altar. For seven days, we're throwing off distractions, tearing down idols, and saying yes to the only flame worth everything. This is about total surrender — where our plans, our pride, and our past meet the fire of a holy God.

Our desire grows as we stay disciplined. We stay on fire for God the more we live for him. When we lack holy desire, it keeps us complacent. If you're ready to go all in, to be completely overtaken by His love, transformed by His Word and surrendered to His purpose — then let the fire ignite.

Therefore let us be grateful for receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, and thus let us offer to God acceptable worship, with reverence and awe, for our God is a consuming fire. - Hebrews 12:28-29

OUR GOD: AN ALL CONSUMING FIRE

Our God is an all consuming fire. A blazing fire. A presence of holiness and power to behold.

To be consumed, especially by fire, means to completely destroy. As God becomes the center of our lives, he should consume us. Dead is the old man. (2 Cor 5:17) But fire doesn't only destroy. It purifies. It refines. It transforms. This world is unstable. Shaken by sin, guilt, and shame. But Jesus has promised us a kingdom that will not be shaken. He has proven himself victorious. With this fire comes transformation. But transformation requires surrender. He invites us to lay aside every weight (Hebrews 12:1) - pride, hidden sin, distractions, idols. Why? Because He loves us too much to let anything less than holy remain.

We see fire only as something destructive. Not as something Holy. But God's fire is Holy. As He burns out the things of this world, He purifies our hearts and minds; refines us to be a holy temple for His Spirit. With reverence and awe, we are to rightly worship our God. A reverent fear and wonderstruck at the vastness of our God's holiness and power.

The more we surrender, the more we are purified. The more we are purified, the more clearly we reflect His glory.

I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect. - Romans 12:1-2

CONSUMED OR CONFORMED?

Believers are to live as a living sacrifice to the Lord. This is not a one-time dedication, but a continuous commitment. A journey to completeness and spiritual maturity. This cannot happen if we are constantly shaped by this world versus the holiness of God.

Conformed means "to be shaped by a pattern or mold". We cannot be molded by two - this world and God. We cannot serve two masters (Matthew 6:24). Everyday, what we watch, hear, and place our focus on, shapes or conforms us. This world constantly whispers its values: success without sacrifice, pleasure without purpose, actions without consequences, and truth we ourselves define. Temporary satisfactions that leave us empty inside. God calls us to make a choice for how we will live. His Word calls us to something far more powerful - total transformation.

Transformation is not a passive action. We must daily lay our life down, pick up our cross (Matthew 16:24), and live as a sacrifice. The battle between conforming to this world and being transformed is a battle of our mind. As Christians, we must think differently. God is the one that has made us "holy and acceptable" to himself. God is the one who renews our minds - through his word, prayer, and community. We are to deny ourselves, and live in holy submission to our God who has made the ultimate sacrifice - death on the cross, bearing all our sins.

DAY 03¹

Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." - Matthew 11:28-30

BURNING WITHOUT BURNOUT

"Come to me" Jesus says. His authority revealed as he invites us into His rest. He is calling those who labor and are heavy laden - those of us who take upon burden ourselves (labor) and those who have burdens placed on them by others (heavy laden). And sometimes, in our desire to be "on fire" for God, we carry more than He's actually asked us to. We serve, give, and go until we're drained—mistaking spiritual busyness for spiritual intimacy.

Jesus invites us to rest, but he also invites us to learn from him. We must be willing to be guided by him. Yielded to His spirit. We are called to "walk with him". True passion for God is sustained not by constant output, but by a consistent relationship. He fuels the flame when we pause to be with Him.

Jesus reveals his character - gentle and lowly. Our perfect example of having a servant's heart. This qualifies him to carry our burden. And when he invites us into his rest, it's a promise, straight from Jesus' mouth - "you will find rest". Rest in God does not mean laziness. It's being still in the presence of our God.

The fire of God was never meant to burn you to ashes - it was meant to consume you, and burn in you, fueled by grace, not exhaustion. Jesus is calling us to himself. He is calling us to rest in Him.

Then he said, "Do not come near; take your sandals off your feet, for the place on which you are standing is holy ground." - Exodus 3:5

HOLY FIRE. HOLY FEAR

In a dry desert place, Moses encountered a bush that burned but was not consumed—a holy fire that didn't destroy, but declared. God commanded, "Do not come near". God's presence demands holiness. This was a holy place because God is holy God.

As Moses drew near, God spoke: "Take off your sandals." It was a simple act, but it showed Moses' humility and recognized the holiness of God. It was an acknowledgment of the reverence, surrender, and unmatched holiness owed to God. He invites us to come close. But we must never forget who we are approaching.

The ground was not holy because of its' location. It was Holy because of God's Holy presence.

Many of us want to be on fire for God, without the fear of God. We want his power without his presence. His blessings without holiness. We MUST remember that fire does not only draw us close, but it is meant to purify.

Holy fear is awe, honor, and humility in the presence of the Most High. This does not mean distance from God, but drawing near with the awareness that His is not like us. He is HOLY. When we lose our sense of awe, we risk approaching God lightly—when He is worthy of everything.

FROM SPARK TO BLAZE

Sometimes God is a mystery. The things He does and the things He says. And yet our hearts still burns for Him. As Jesus walked with these two men and shared scripture, their eyes could not recognize Him, their hearts burned. A spark was ignited.

Sometimes we wait for a cinematic experience - fireworks, neon lights, the works. But God works even in the small moments of our lives. The quiet moments. The simple moments. For these men, it came from walking, listening, and engaging with God's Word. A conversation, a small step, can lead to a heart ablaze.

All it takes is a spark. A small flame leads to a burning fire - one prayer, one verse, one step of obedience. His Word kindles something deep within us. It's a spark to the flame. Sometimes we cannot see a fire burning, until we are consumed by it. God often kindles in the quiet what He will later ignite in a full blaze.

Fire shall be kept burning on the altar continually; it shall not go out. - Leviticus 6:13

KINDLING THE ALTER

In the Old Testament, the altar was a sacred place. This is where sacrifices were offered to the Lord. There was one divine instruction that is repeated: "the fire shall be kept burning.". It wasn't a one-time blaze. It was a continuous flame.

Keeping the fire burning was one of the most important tasks of the priests. A perfect illustration of us putting the work into giving ourselves over to God, completely. Truly coming to Him as a living sacrifice. We are now the temple that holds the presence of God. Our heart is the altar. Our faith, the wood to keep the fire. And we are the priest who must tend to this fire and keep it aflame. It is not a one-time blaze, but a continuous commitment.

If we want to burn with steady devotion, we must bring to God daily - our time, desires, pride, comfort, or control. Feelings alone do not keep a fire ablaze. We must be faithful to the commitment we have made. We must be yielded, and willing.

In the Old Testament, when a sacrifice was accepted by God, it was consumed by a miraculous fire (Lev 9:24). We have been accepted into the beloved (Ephesians 1:6), ready to be engulfed. Consumed by the all consuming fire Himself.

By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to a place that he was to receive as an inheritance. And he went out, not knowing where he was going. - Hebrews 11:8

BLAZING TRAILS

Where Abraham was told to go, he could not see. The promise God gave to Abraham, seemed impossible. But by faith Abraham obeyed.

Abraham's faith was by no means a faith of sight. He could not see where God was leading, could not fathom the promise of a child, and would not live to see the generations of a nation he would be the patriarch of. But Abraham's faith stood on God alone. He trusted the One who called him.

Blazing trails means stepping into the unknown with full assurance - not in yourself, but in God's faithfulness. The fire inside you is not just a symbol of God's comfort. It is a nudge for movement. It's meant to guide, to ignite, and to help you walk boldly into your next steps of obedience for what God is doing.

If you wait to feel "ready," you'll never move. God honors obedience more than certainty. Spark a faith journey that changes everything, no matter how unsure your yes is. "Yes Lord" is obedience, no matter how small.
