

Romans 13:8-14 Do We Need Laws Like the Ten Commandments

Do you need commandments to keep you in line? Does only the threat of a big fine keep you going straight or driving the speed limit? Laws save lives on roads, especially when we drive them for the first time. I'm thankful for signs on mountain curves that tell me I shouldn't exceed 25 miles per hour.
