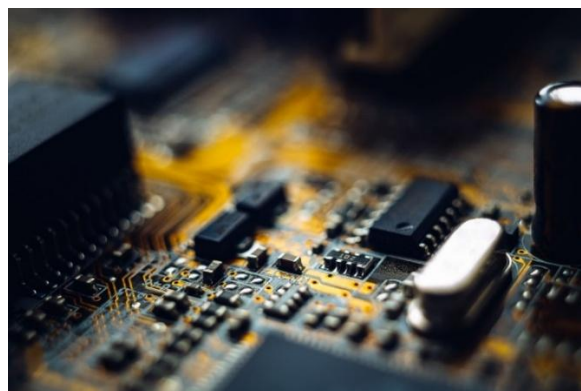


For Whom Do You Pray? 1Timothy 2:1-7
