What: End of the Year- FAMILY FIELD TRIP

Where: Knoebels Amusement Park

When: Friday, May 15, 2026



We are inviting you and your family to join us for an end of the year field trip. We hope that your family will travel to Knoebels and enjoy a day of rides with other CACS families! Arm bands will be sent home with students in May.

Cost: Free to enter the park. You may pre-order ride passes for \$25 per CACS student (subsidized by PTO) and \$30 for all other family members.

Dress Code: Modesty is expected. Shorts must be fingertip length with no holes or fraying. No spandex. No spaghetti straps, halter or bare-midriff tops or swim wear. Students may want to bring layers and/or a change of clothes for the Giant Flume or Skloosh.

Food: Packed lunches are permitted in the park and may be stored at the pavilion. Food is also available for purchase. CACS will reserve a pavilion. (Details to follow). CACS families meet at 12:15 p.m. to enjoy lunch together as a school.

Transportation: CACS will provide limited transportation (First Come- First Served) to those students whose families are unable to attend. If needed, students must arrive at school at normal time (7:55 a.m.) The CACS bus will leave at 8:10 a.m. Return time will be approx. 8:00 p.m. Check Facebook for updates. (Students must ride BOTH WAYS! The bus will NOT be stopping for food.)

Supervision: Students will be supervised by their parent/guardian. Gr. K-6 students who ride the bus will be supervised by a teacher or volunteer chaperone. Gr. 7-12 students who ride the bus will be required to check in with a staff member at set times during the day.

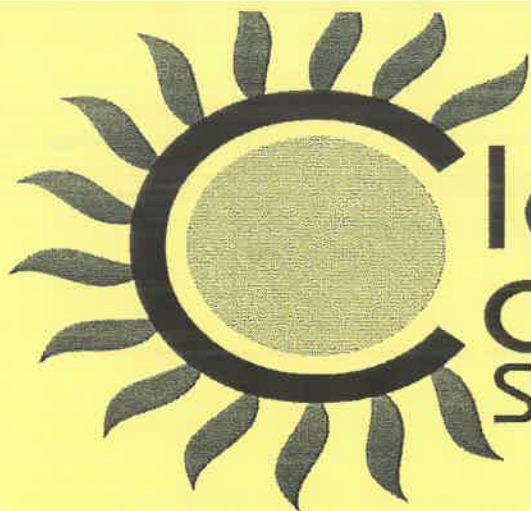

Summer, 2026 is just around the corner, and the Clearfield Community Swimming Pool is the place to cool off on hot summer days!

Membership rates increase after opening day, so buy your membership today. Beginning May 4, memberships will be available at the pool, 415 Polk Street, Clearfield, Monday through Friday from 9:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. Please complete the form printed on the back side of this page and bring it with you to purchase your membership. If you wish to purchase a membership by mail, please complete the form printed on the back side of this page and mail it to the Clearfield Swimming Pool Association, P.O. Box 686, Clearfield, PA 16830. All memberships purchased by mail will be available at the pool after opening day.

The pool is located in Clearfield Borough, near the South Park neighborhood, and is a modern recreational facility with a separate pool for children, a large dual waterslide and diving board. For updated information throughout the year, like us at www.facebook.com/clearfieldpool.

*A family membership includes up to five (5) people all living in the same household, with a maximum of two (2) adults per family membership. Additional children living in the same household may be added to a membership at a cost of \$30 per child before opening day, and \$35 after opening day. The Clearfield Swimming Pool Association reserves the right to require proof that all persons listed on a family membership live in the same household. There is no charge for children under age 2.

We also offer swimming lessons and swim team.

Swimming lessons are held on weekday mornings at the pool, beginning in early June. Sign-up at the front gate of the pool after opening day.
