E-LEARNING SNOW DAY PLAN

Total Time: Approximately 90 minutes (flexible & self-paced)

1. Reading (20 to 30 minutes)

- Students choose:
 - Independent reading (home books, Epic, Storyline Online)
 - Family read-aloud (adult or older sibling)
- **Teacher Reading Response Expectation:**
 - Draw/write about your favorite part or character. (1 sentence for 1st graders and 2 sentences for 2nd grade)

2. Math (20 to 30 minutes)

- DreamBox: 15–20 minutes
- Choose one number activity:
 - Fact practice (flash cards ((addition, subtraction, multiplication, division), math apps, etc.)
 - Skip-counting (Count by 2's to 50, 5's to 100, 3's to 60, 10's to 200)
 - Estimate/ measure objects (estimating household objects, then measure with a ruler, if you have one)
 - Build numbers with household items (building numbers with household manipulatives- beans, beads, paper clips, etc.)
- **Teacher Math Response Expectation:**
 - Post a photo upload or a short 1 sentence response of what activity you chose.

3. Writing or Practical Life (20 to 30 minutes)

- Students choose one:
 - Snow-day journal entry (minimum of 1 sentence for 1st graders and 2 sentences for 2nd graders)
 - How-to writing (e.g., “How to Build a Snow Fort”, “How to build a snowman”, “How to shovel the driveway”, etc.)
 - Practical Life activity: cooking, folding, sorting, cleaning, organizing
- **Teacher Writing Response Expectation:**
 - Post a chosen writing choice or short list of practical life options you've chosen.

4. Optional Enrichment

- Art: draw/ paint something from nature
- Science: observe the weather changes, record temperature, measure snowfall
- Movement: GoNoodle, yoga, or play outside (weather permitting)
- Cultural/ Geography studies: explore a map, identify continents, research a holiday or tradition
