Application to serve as a member of Three Rivers Montessori Board of Directors

In accordance to Minnesota state law, the board must include one licensed teacher who teaches at the school, one parent who has a child attending the school, and one community member who does not have a child attending the school and who does not teach at the school. In addition, a minimum of two at-large members who provide additional expertise in school management or governance can be elected. Board members will be elected by membership and certified during the annual meeting.

Terms are determined by the Board's nominations committee and will be for a three year period; unless applying to fill in for a vacant seat. Then can apply to be voted at the next school board election.

Commitments & Responsibilities of board members included but limited to:

- 1. Supporting and advocating for the Mission of the school.
- 2. Serving as good stewards of taxpayer dollars.
- 3. Preparing for, attending & participating in monthly, special, emergency meetings; as well as trainings and work sessions.
- 4. Serving on at least one board subcommittees; assisting other committees when needed.
- 5. Refraining from breach of confidentiality of student(s), families, staff, Board members or other private data.
- 6. Participating in mandatory training on finance, governance, and employee/hiring best practices & procedures within the first 12 months of being seated.
- 7. Agree to review, sign and uphold the **Board of Directors Commitments** on Page 4 & 5 of the BoD Handbook.
