

If it grows, it goes!

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Materials NOT ACCEPTED in Winnetka's Food Scrap Composting Program

Landscape Waste



Yard waste, Leaves, Weeds, Grass clippings, Christmas trees

Compostable in at-home yard waste collection, but not in this program

Packaging



Microwave popcorn bags, Frozen food boxes, Plastic bags and containers, Juice boxes

Not compostable due to chemical concerns

When food and other organics decompose in landfills, they don't break down properly, they release greenhouse gases that trap heat, and they contribute to

climate change.

The EPA estimates that in the United States in 2018, more food was sent to landfills than any other single material in our everyday trash.

Human and animal feces, Small animal cage litter, Cat litter, etc.

Not compostable due to health concerns

Miscellaneous





Gum, Treated wood and sawdust, Plant-based #7 serviceware, Cigarettes, Clothing

Not compostable due to chemical concerns
