TECHNOLOGY

Our St. Anthony Jr. High program is highly integrated with technology. In most cases, students do not have hard copy textbooks for their classes. Instead, we use online "techbooks", .pdf books, and a variety of online resources to teach core subjects. Thanks to our Parent Involvement Program (*P.I.P.*), we have a 1:1 ratio of students to Chromebooks. Each student will be assigned a Chromebook and will be responsible for that Chromebook for the entire school year. We will continue to refine our use of the Google Apps for Schools environment where students will be able to email, work, and save/share documents in a Cloud system. We are very excited to continue teaching our students about cutting edge technology.

LOCKERS

 $6^{\text{TH}} - 8^{\text{TH}}$ grade students will be assigned a locker. It is highly recommended that students bring a combination lock for their locker. Students may decorate their locker, but **NO STICKERS ARE ALLOWED.** Magnets are fine. Students will have 5 minutes between classes to get the necessary items from their lockers.

UNIFORMS

Please read the Dress Code policy as detailed in the Parent/Student Handbook that can be found on the school web page at www.stantschool.org Please consult pages 11-14 for dress code details. Additional requirements for junior high students are as follows:

Jr. High boys need to wear a button down white shirt with a tie on any day we have Mass (usually Fridays). They will need to purchase a school tie from Dennis Uniform (link can be found under the "Family Info" tab on our website at www.stantschool.org) to wear on these days. Boys will need to make sure that all of their buttons are buttoned and that their shirts look presentable. Ties need to be worn correctly. Shirts should be tucked in and boys should be wearing a belt.

Jr. high girls need to wear a skirt on any day we have Mass (*usually Fridays***).** Skirts should meet the guidelines set forth in our Parent/Student Handbook. If a girl decides to wear an undershirt, no more than one inch of that undershirt may be visible from under their uniform shirt.

SPECIAL NOTE ABOUT UNIFORMS

It is very important that both students and parents understand the <u>guidelines</u> on pages 11-14 in the student handbook. Students that are not adhering to proper uniform guidelines will be sent to the school office to wait for a parent or family member to bring them proper uniform attire.

COMMUNICATION

Communication is essential for a productive and successful school year. It is very important that parents & guardians have an open line of communication with the teachers. St. Anthony School uses the Gradelink system for student management including attendance, grades, assignments, billing, and general communications through email and text. It is very important that all parents and guardians use the Gradelink system often and continually monitor their child's progress. If you don't have your login information for Gradelink, please contact the office and we can give it to you. Again, effective communication is key for a productive and successful school year.

SOCIAL STUDIES/HISTORY & SCIENCE

Jr. High students will study **social studies/history in the fall semester of 2022**. The year-long curriculum program will be taught during the fall semester (*we use twice the amount of instructional minutes by focusing on one subject each semester*). **Students will focus on science during the spring semester of 2023**. For both subjects, we will use <u>Discovery Education Tech Books</u> along with supplementary materials that deliver accurate historical content that is unbiased to our students. We also have guest speakers Bob Higgins & Fr. Dan Kassis visit to deliver Catholic worldview lessons on certain topics like the Reformation.
