#### **LOCKERS**

6<sup>TH</sup> – 8<sup>TH</sup> grade students will be assigned a locker. It is highly recommended that students bring a combination lock for their locker. Either a spare key or the combination for the lock that they bring will need to be shared with the teacher. Students may decorate their locker, but **NO STICKERS ARE ALLOWED.** Magnets are fine. Students will have 5 minutes between classes to get the necessary items from their lockers.

#### **TECHNOLOGY**

Our St. Anthony Jr. High program is highly integrated with technology. In most cases, students do not have hard copy textbooks for their classes. Instead, we use online "techbooks", .pdf books, and a variety of online resources to teach core subjects. Thanks to our Parent Involvement Program (*P.I.P.*), we have a 1:1 ratio of students to Chromebooks. Each student will be assigned a Chromebook and will be responsible for that Chromebook for the entire school year. Students are responsible for any damage to the Chromebooks. We will continue to refine our use of the Google Apps for Schools environment where students will be able to email, work, and save/share documents in a Cloud system.

#### UNIFORMS - BE SURE TO READ THE STUDENT HANDBOOK!

#### **SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS for MASS DAYS:**

- All Jr. High (6th-8th) boys are required to wear the Dennis Uniform long sleeved, white oxford button down, shirt (tucked in) and a Dennis Uniform St. Anthony School tie on any day we have Mass (usually Fridays). These need to be purchased from Dennis Uniform. If an undershirt is worn, it must be a solid white t-shirt. They must wear black slacks with a dress belt and black or dark shoes (preferably dress shoes or dress boots). Pants and shirts should be clean with no wrinkles.
- Jr. high girls need to wear a skirt on any day we have Mass (usually Fridays). Skirts should meet the guidelines set forth in our Parent/Student Handbook. If a girl decides to wear an undershirt, no more than one inch of that undershirt may be visible from under their uniform shirt.

## \*\*\*SPECIAL NOTE ABOUT UNIFORMS\*\*\*

It is very important that both students and parents understand the guidelines on pages 11-14 in the student handbook. Students that are not adhering to proper uniform guidelines will be sent to the school office to wait for a parent or family member to bring them proper uniform attire.

#### **General Items Needed:**

St. Anthony School uses the Gradelink system for student management including attendance, grades, assignments, billing, and general communications through email and text. If you don't have your login information for Gradelink, please contact the office and we can give it to you. Again, effective communication is key for a productive and successful school year.

#### **HISTORY & SCIENCE**

Jr. High students will be studying History and Science for the entire length of the school year. We are blessed to be using the **Catholic Textbook Project** curriculum for History. This history curriculum provides students with high-quality textbooks. By incorporating the Church into this curriculum, each lesson will guide students into a deeper understanding of historical events while creating connections between the role of Christ and the Church. We also have guest speakers Bob Higgins & Fr. Dan Kassis who will visit to deliver Catholic worldview enriched lessons on certain topics like the Reformation. For science we will continue with the use of <u>Discovery Education Tech Books</u> along with supplementary materials which enables an enriched multimodal curriculum to help our students learn.
