# Miracles Fair

All Saints Day - Nov. 1st

All students are welcome to participate in the fifth annual **St. Anthony School Miracles Fair**. This is a great opportunity to research, learn, and present about a Saint. **Projects should include details, facts, and information about a Saint chosen from the assigned lists (*attached*).** **Projects must include associated Miracles along with any interesting information that the students have learned in their research.**

We will have 3 divisions participating in the competition.

- Division I: PreK to 2nd (*Participate as a class and produce one presentation board for the fair*)
- Division II: 3rd to 5th (*Individual or partner submission*)
- Division III: 6th to 8th (*Individual or partner submission*)

Project displays must meet the following guidelines:

- Depth (*front to back*) - 30 inches (*76 cm*)
- Width (*side to side*) - 48 inches (*122 cm*)
- Height (*floor to top*) - 108 inches (*274 cm*)

**Projects must be submitted by 10:30 a.m. on Tuesday, Oct. 31st** for judging and display in the Hall.

## PRIZES:

**Division I:** Winning class will receive a “Lunch in the Park” field trip.

**Division II:** 1st Place: \$70 fee credit\* & \$30 Walmart gift card & Free Dress Day for Class

2nd Place: \$50 fee credit\* & \$20 Walmart gift card

## DEFINITION OF A SAINT

The term 'Saint' is used in Christian religions, including the Roman Catholic religion, to describe a person who is perceived as being an example of great holiness, virtue, and considered capable of interceding with God on behalf of a person who prayed to them. A person who has died and has been declared a saint by canonization. The Roman Catholic Church has an official process for creating saints.

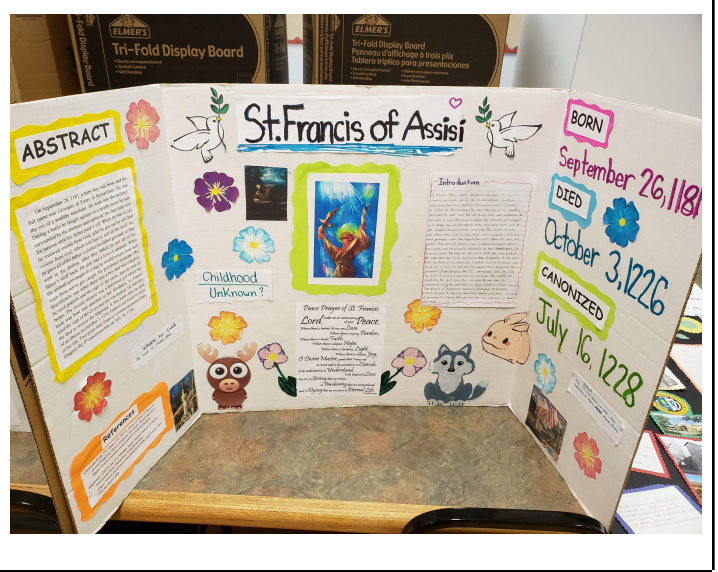
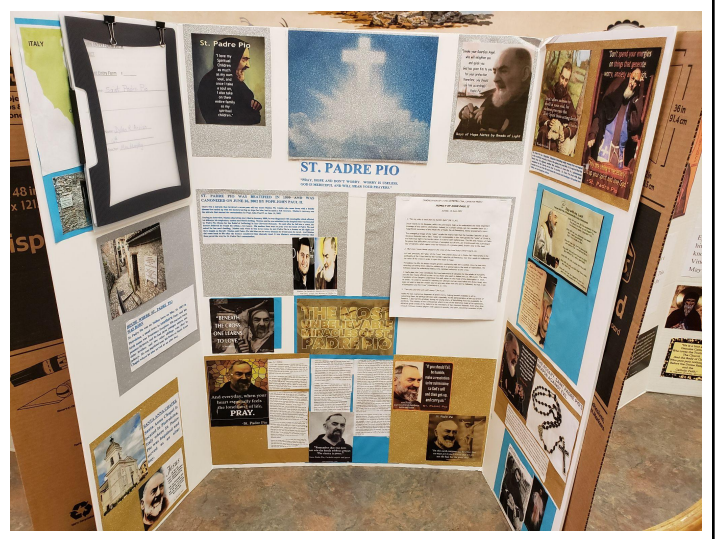
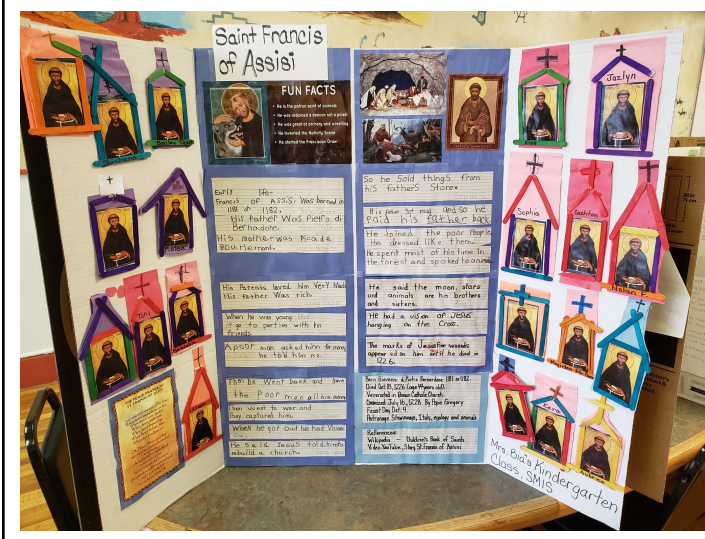
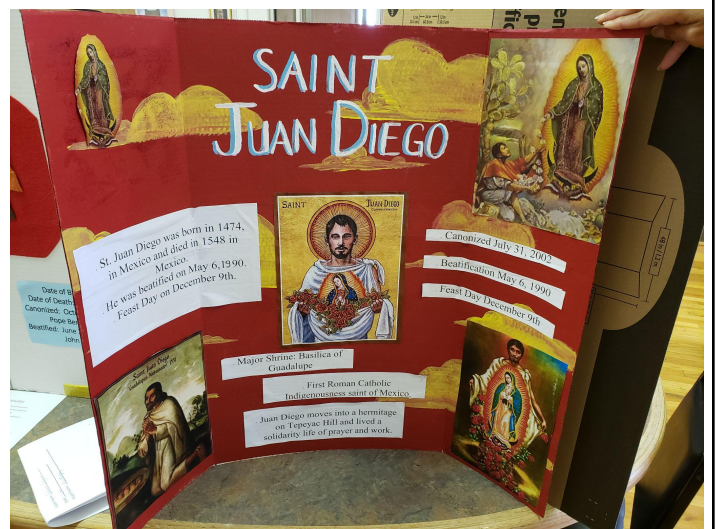
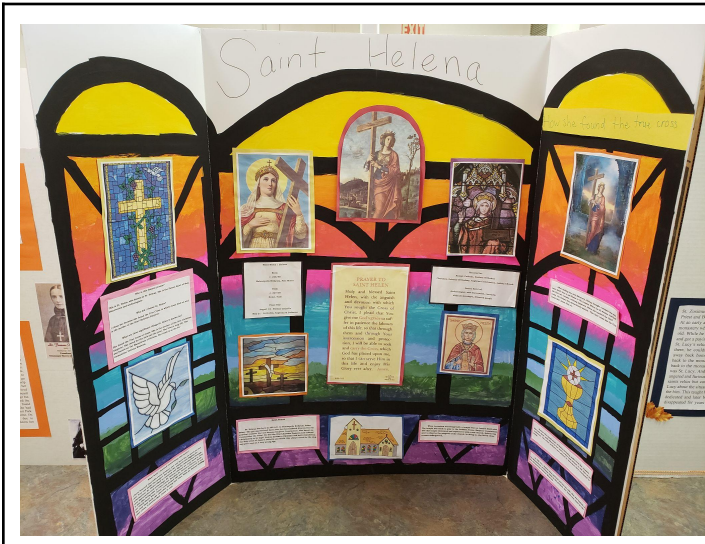
**Canonization** is the act by which the Orthodox, Oriental Orthodoxy, Roman Catholic, or Anglican Church declares that a person who has died was a saint, upon which declaration the person is included in the canon, or list, of recognized saints.

The process goes as follows: When a person dies who has "fame of sanctity" or "fame of martyrdom", the Bishop of the Diocese initiates an investigation. One element of investigation is whether any special favor or miracle has been granted through this candidate saint's intercession. The Church will also investigate the candidate's writings to see if they possess "purity of doctrine", essentially, nothing heretical or against the faith. All of this information is gathered, and then a transcription, a faithful copy, duly authenticated and sealed, is submitted to the Congregation for the Causes of Saints.

The next step is **beatification**. A martyr may be beatified and declared "Blessed" by virtue of martyrdom itself. Otherwise, the candidate must be credited with a miracle. In verifying the miracle, the Church looks at whether God truly performed a miracle and whether the miracle was in response to the intercession of the candidate saint. Once beatified, the candidate saint may be venerated but with restriction to a city, diocese, region, or religious family. Accordingly, the Pope would authorize a special prayer, Mass, or proper Divine Office honoring the Blessed.

After beatification, another miracle is needed for canonization and the formal declaration of sainthood.
