HIGHLY QUALIFIED FACULTY

St. Anthony School is proud of the highly qualified teachers that make up our faculty. Our Jr. High teachers all hold (*at minimum*) Bachelor's degrees and some have Master's degrees. All of our faculty are licensed through the Arizona Department of Education. With over 35+ years of teaching experience combined, our Jr. High program is top notch! UNIFORMS - **BE SURE TO READ THE STUDENT HANDBOOK!**

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS for MASS DAYS:

- **BOYS** (*usually Fridays, but may occur on other days of the week*) Black uniform pants, a white uniform shirt (*tucked in*) with a solid white undershirt and a plaid or burgundy school tie are required. Pants and shirts should be clean with no wrinkles. If worn, undershirts must be solid white. Black or dark shoes and socks are required (*preferably dress shoes or dress boots*). Uniform sweaters are allowed. Jr. High boys (*6-8th grade*) must wear the long sleeve uniform shirt option plus a black dress belt.
- **GIRLS** (*usually Fridays, but may occur on other days of the week*) A **plaid uniform jumper/skirt** with black, white, or grey bike shorts, tights or ankle length leggings and a white uniform blouse (*tucked in*) are required. Shirts should be clean with no wrinkles. If worn, undershirts must be solid white. Uniform sweaters are allowed.

*****SPECIAL NOTE ABOUT UNIFORMS*****

It is very important that both students and parents understand the guidelines on pages 11-14 in the student handbook. Students that are not adhering to proper uniform guidelines will be sent to the school office to wait for a parent or family member to bring them proper uniform attire.

SA JR. HIGH STUDENT SUPPLY LIST - 2026/27

General Items Needed: (*these will be given to **homeroom** teachers*)

- Student planner will be **provided by the school** & a Chromebook will be **assigned**.
- 1 pair of scissors
- Ruler
- One 3 pack of Clorox/Lysol wipes
- 3 boxes of tissues
- 3 rolls of paper towels
- 1 bottle of hand sanitizer

Language Arts Items Needed:

- 24 #2 pencils (*pre sharpened if possible*)
- **1 folder (2 pocket) (ALL 8th graders will need 2; one for LA and one for Religion)**
- **1 spiral notebook (ALL 8th graders will need 2; one for LA and one for Religion)**
- **1 composition notebook**
- 1 package of colored dry erase Expo markers (*any color*)
- 1 package of lined index cards (3x5 cards)
- 2 highlighters (*any color*)
- **1 box EACH** of: Gallon, Quart, AND Sandwich size ZIPLOCK BAGS
- 1 package of colored pencils (sharpened) **OR** 1 pack of markers

History & Science Items Needed:

- 24 pack of #2 pencils for each student

- 1 package of wet wipes (*science is fun - and sometimes messy*)
- College-ruled loose leaf writing paper
- 2 folders (1 for Science and 1 for History). 6th grade - another folder for Religion
- Box of latex or latex-free disposable gloves for science lab

Math Items Needed:

- 2 spiral College-ruled notebooks (**Math Journals**)
- 2 dual pocket Homework folders (**Math Homework**)
- Pens - At least 2 red ball-point pens (no felt-tip pens please)
- Pencils - No. 2 Wooden, or Mechanical 0.7mm or 0.9mm HB lead (no 0.5mm lead please)
- Erasers - 1 white hi-polymer eraser
- Calculator - 1 basic scientific calculator (square, square root, scientific notation)
- Protractor - 1 basic 0-180 degree plastic protractor (english and metric units)
- Compass - 1 basic 4" 0-180 degree metal compass (no plastic please)

TECHNOLOGY

Our St. Anthony Jr. High program is highly integrated with technology. Thanks to our Parent Involvement Program (*P.I.P.*), we have a 1:1 ratio of students to Chromebooks. Each student will be assigned a Chromebook and will be responsible for that Chromebook for the entire school year. Students are responsible for any damage to the Chromebooks. We will continue to refine our use of the Google Apps for a School's environment where students will be able to email, work, and save/share documents in a Cloud system. Students will participate in a code of ethics and online safety class at the beginning of the school year.

ACADEMIC INTEGRITY

At St. Anthony Catholic School, we are committed to providing a learning environment that is rooted in the Gospel values of honesty, respect, and personal responsibility. Academic integrity is essential to this mission. When students uphold these values, their work remains original, properly cited, and completed ethically. When students follow these principles, it prepares them not only for academic success but also for lives of integrity as faithful Catholics and responsible citizens.

We recognize that artificial intelligence is part of today's world and that students will encounter and use AI tools. However, submitting work primarily by AI IS a violation of academic integrity. All of our teachers are equipped to run assignments through a multiple of AI detection tools and will do so regularly.

- First Offense: The student will receive a failing grade on the assignment but will be given the opportunity to redo the work for credit.
- Second Offense: The student will receive a failing grade with no opportunity to redo the assignment.
- Third Offense: The student will face suspension and possible expulsion from St. Anthony Catholic School.

COMMUNICATION

Communication is essential for a productive and successful school year. It is very important that parents & guardians have an open line of communication with the teachers. If you ever have a concern or issue, please contact the teacher directly and work it out. Our teachers are highly qualified educators and can work with you through any issue that may arise. Only in a situation where the teacher and the parent cannot work out an issue, should the principal be contacted. **The principal is the final authority in all matters.** St. Anthony School uses the Gradelink system for student management including attendance, grades, assignments, billing, and general communications through email and text. **It is very important that all parents and guardians use the Gradelink system often and continually monitor their child's progress.** If you don't have your login information for Gradelink, please contact the office and we can give it to you. Again, effective communication is key for a productive and successful school year.

HISTORY & SCIENCE

Jr. High students will be studying History and Science with Mrs. Burchett this year. She will be teaching History the 1st semester and Science the 2nd semester. We are blessed to be using the **Catholic Textbook Project** curriculum for both History & Science this year. This curriculum provides students with high-quality textbooks that incorporate a Catholic world-view. We also have guest speakers Bob Higgins, Fr. Dan Kassis, & Fr. Luciano who will visit to deliver Catholic worldview enriched lessons on certain topics like the Reformation.
