

Overview

The "Schools Can Stop the Wars!" initiative is designed to engage students, educators, families and communities in immediate action in support of the global peace movement. The programme can be used to empower schools as institutions - along with their numerous community-based, business and administrative stakeholders - to become active players in fostering peace and justice.

Schools Can Stop the Wars! runs under the slogan promoted by the Paris '24 Olympic
Truce Peace Parks Music Movement call to 'Make Ukraine the Last War – Apartheid and
Genocide No More!' It focuses on supporting all efforts to create a genuine and lasting
Peace in the Holy Land, focusing on actions to support:

- 1. an immediate ceasefire and implementation of UN General Assembly brokered Resolutions in Gaza led by a multi-national military force if necessary to restore humanitarian aid.
- 2. an end to the occupation of Gaza and the West Bank and
- 3. the prosecution of Israeli, American, British and European political leaders who have breached the International Criminal Court and International Court of Justice decisions on war crimes committed in the Middle East.
- 4. The right for journalistic freedom and free speech in the face of totalitarian state Orwellian messaging and citizen mind control.
- 5. Reform of the archaic post World War II Security Council UN decision making system to give power to the General Assembly.

Background: SDG16 - Peace, Justice & Strong Institutions



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The Schools Can Stop the Wars! program has emerged from 3 decades of work on the implementation of civil society's vision of Agenda 21, currently formulated in Agenda 2030 as SDG 16 - Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions The programme contents are practically aligned with the UN-sponsored Olympic Truce process, which calls for truce all conflicts during the Games, in symbolizing a global commitment to immediate peace. It builds on the UN WSSD (World Summit on Sustainable Development) 2002 recognition that to achieve a planet of peace and prosperity for all the people, the international system of global apartheid and its military-industrialfinancial governance by the elite and their

rapacious capitalist production system must be ended in favour of social development for civil society and environmental protection for the planet.

Never before have we needed peace more, and all of us can play a part in making it happen. The programme aims to build an **SDG 16** - *Schools for Peace & Justice* process to help protect the future of our children from becoming a world in perpetual war, on the brink of nuclear Armageddon, their lives being run by a ruthless totalitarian state military-industrial-governance elite. Millions of children are living under these conflict-ridden conditions already, and the situation is now exponential as the combined crises of Global Change – War, Disease, Hunger, Extreme Weather Events, Biodiversity loss, Pollution and Mental Illness converge on every nation state population.

Its time to step to these challenges, and schools and their stakeholders have a great role to play. Join your school up to the programme to give your children a chance to make the best of Global Change

Schools Can Stop the Wars! Programme Features

1. Learning Pack for Teachers: War and Peace in the Holy Land

This comprehensive learning pack delves into the complex history of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict, offering teachers resources to discuss the realities of war, peace, and occupation in the Holy Land. The materials present historical context, current realities, and paths toward peace, encouraging nuanced conversations in classrooms.

A vital component of the Schools Can Stop the Wars! initiative, this module introduces students and educators to the Boycott, Divestment, and Sanctions (BDS) movement as a peaceful means of resisting the Israeli occupation and apartheid policies. The programme educates on how boycotting Israeli companies, products, and services can apply pressure on the Israeli government to end its violent practices against Palestinians.

- Key Focus: Understanding how economic pressure can be used as a non-violent tool to achieve political change.
- Materials Provided: An App listing products and companies involved in illegal settlements, guidelines for boycotting products, and campaigns to divest from companies complicit in the occupation.

4. Monthly Digest: Current Affairs in Global Change

Dynamic monthly blogs and bulletins supporting teachers, parents and students to explore the state of global transition from a world shaped by war economies and inequality to a future of peace, fairness, and communal prosperity. This digest educates students and teachers on critical global shifts, such as the peace movements, social justice initiatives, and communitydriven solutions that are paving the way for a peaceful world.

- Key Focus: Providing support to you on your journey towards helping dismantle the warbased economy and fostering a society rooted in freedom, fairness, and equality within our lifetime in the shadow of our imminent Armageddon.
- 5. Educational Materials: Breaking Free from Nationalist Indoctrination Right View, Right Understanding, Right Speech

The programme provides carefully curated educational materials aimed at deconstructing nationalist ideologies that perpetuate war and division. These materials expose the **Orwellian** doublespeak found in political and media discourse, empowering students to critically



analyze and challenge the narratives that shape their worldview. The goal is to cultivate global citizens who advocate for peace and reject manipulation using humanist moral value systems guided by the Buddhist *Eightfold Path* and precepts of *Yama*.

- **Key Focus:** Identifying and countering political and media manipulation, fostering critical thinking skills using Buddhist transpersonal psychotherapeutic concepts
- **Activity Areas:** Learning about the 4 Noble Truths and the Eightfold Path and how they give us a moral compass to guide our actions.

6. Introducing the Peace Parks Music Movement

This module connects schools with the **Peace Parks Music Movement**, a global initiative aimed at fostering unity and peace through resistance music. The movement calls for a worldwide ceasefire, promoting the Olympic Truce for peace in conflict zones like Gaza. Schools can participate by organizing music events and peace rallies to raise awareness of the global call for peace.

- **Key Focus:** Encouraging schools to host musical events that support the global ceasefire and peace movement.
- **Activity Ideas:** Organize a "Music for Peace" day, create peace murals, and hold student-led concerts supporting the message of global peace.

Information Pack Topic: Themes on War, Peace, and Global Liberation



This information pack section highlights critical themes around war, peace, personal empowerment, and global justice, offering insight into how individuals and communities can work toward liberation and lasting peace through your school.

The Global State of Humanity

Make no mistake about it, despite the gloss of life for 1 billion of us in consumer society, the majority world has been relentlessly impoverished by war and oppression. Now the Orwellian state of 1984 is here in all its modern technology city clothing. That 90% of us live as the materially and spiritually dispossessed – 1 billion near starvation daily, war and conflict in 59 UN member states and 5 1/5 billion consumer workers in cities, alienated, isolated and regimented into service of the state and corporations under banners of nationalism and patriotism and ruled with an iron fist – albeit cloaked in state sweet talk.

This allows the modern pharaohs - the 1% - to live in obscene luxury with their hi tech family fortune companies, countries with their armies of soldiers, police, politicians, lawyers, bankers and media moguls creating elite jobs for the boys and toys for the boys in the 5000 year old patriarchal warring settler colonial mentality that has given us our modern world, an economic system in full dialectical flux of finance capitalism and the dark condition of human alienation in the greed, ignorance and desire that globalisation has wreaked upon us in the guise of American Russian or Chinese democracy and freedom.

In a political world of dictators on display at every turn of media, the world has become the Orwellian totalitarian nightmare for many already. History teaches us that it is through Right Understanding – or Right Knowledge as some translate - that we can find freedom in this lifetime for the one and for the many. Right knowledge is the fruit of experience and wisdom combined. It is transmitted by educational interaction, exemplified in the past by Shamans or Elders who brought their life experience into the Rites of Passage of younger tribal members.

Can Schools Stop the War When the State Runs the Schools to Make the War Machine Work?

Educational interaction in our times is conducted through the school, which is part of the ideological superstructure of our capitalist society. Traditional schooling is designed to replicate the workforce that capitalism needs – the free public schooling model was set up in America by Rothchilds' and other elites to develop an industrial workforce from rural labourers. This his was no more apparent than when the British organised their educational system around the '3 Rs' Reading, wRiting and aRithematic' to produce the administrative clerks, soldiers, factory workers, care workers, engineers and managers of their empire. Each state has copied and improved that materialist and weighted blueprint to recreate their own nations of wage-slaves and private property owners, the lines now blurred by the complexity of finance capital's last bubble-blowing decades.

Schooling Our Children to Survive the System

Schools need to rapidly adjust to all of these fast moving trends and deep societal contexts. Parents need to understand what the state and the corporations are really doing with our children – and of course, have already done with us. Manipulation of the people was taken to a fine art in Nazi Germany, then improved by Russian, American and Chinese state-driven mass control by the bankers, financiers and autocratic ruling elite, who now have us trapped in permanent cycles of work, wages, rents, debt and dispossession.

The clever few of us who either use the system to survive or are beneficiaries of the system also will need to adjust to new levels of AI intrusion and control that will be here in a matter of years, not decades. By definition and design any nation state that is aligned to corporate interests and not linked to governance by Civil Society necessarily becomes an oppressive force to community and social need. Good education is crucial if civil society is to take over the control of the state to implement true democracy, develop equitable economies and manage the challenges of Global Change effectively, for a knowledgeable civil society can best run social economies.

Alternative educational processes that have arisen from the oppressed such as Paulo Friere Pedagogy of the Oppressed and Julius Nyere's KI-Swahili + Language = Revolution in the 70's when Ivan Illich's pre-scient claim then was that we would all be in schools without walls brings us to our current learning context. The internet rules, schools are becoming increasingly redundant in their role to produce workers for the Empire of today with all its AI jobs now high in the Clouds.

Teenagers have embraced the poisoned chalice of screen time fully and gullibly, minds are being shrunk down to virtual consumer mode as we speak, and most parents themselves have no real idea of the future paradigm shift our children are inheriting. Their work collaboration and competition with be with AGI (Artificial General Intelligence) or even ASI (Artificial Super Intelligence). It will be as though each person has a very clever person standing next to them and helping them to make informed choices throughout their lives. This is the game-changing reality we are now evolving without truly comprehending its possibilities and problems.

Themes on War, Peace, and Global Liberation

The following material covers several themes students can contemplate as they build their current affairs and world view knowledge.

1. Understanding War and Peace: Levels of Terror under Patriarchy

Patriarchal societies breed violence at multiple levels. It starts with sibling terror, such as bullying in families. Conjugal terror occurs through the psycho-physical subjugation of partners. Family terror, or domestic violence, follows, spreading into community terror, with gangs and criminal groups instilling fear. Finally, state terror manifests through the machinery of nation-state warfare, where governments wage wars on each other and suppress dissent at home.

2. Understanding Zionism as the Spearhead of Settler Colonial Empire Building

Zionism emerged as a nationalist movement in Europe, gaining momentum under British and U.S. imperialism, eventually leading to the formation of the Israeli state in 1948. Seen as the vanguard of settler colonialism, Zionism involved the dispossession of Palestinians and the building of a state backed by Western powers. It remains central to understanding how imperial projects are advanced under the guise of national identity, deeply tied to broader colonial practices.

3. 'Hasbara' and Right Speech at the End of Times: Orwellian Totalitarian Control of How You Think and Feel

Hasbara, Israel's public relations strategy, can be seen as a form of Orwellian control—aiming to manipulate how the public thinks and feels about the Israeli-Palestinian conflict. By controlling narratives and language, states and corporations perpetuate falsehoods while erasing critical thinking. This extends to wider totalitarian methods, where technology and propaganda strip individuals of their ability to think freely, questioning truth itself.

4. Understanding History: The Role of War under Capitalism

War has long been a tool of empire-building under capitalist systems. The British Empire expanded through military conquest, followed by the rise of the U.S. military-industrial complex, where war became profitable for industries and elites. Finance capital emerged alongside this militarism, fueling global conflicts. Today, wars remain integral to maintaining capitalist dominance, often justified by ideological imperatives like "freedom" or "democracy."

5. Global Apartheid as the System of Oppression of the Individual

The concept of Global Apartheid reflects the structured oppression where race, class, and power dynamics keep individuals and entire populations subjugated. This idea stems from the



settler colonial mindset applied to Palestine, where systemic inequality and occupation mirror earlier British and American practices of segregation and domination. The Israeli-Palestinian conflict is a modern representation of this ideology, reinforcing hierarchies on a global scale.

6. The Role of Knowledge, Education, and Learning for Personal and Societal Liberation

In a world dominated by high-tech state systems, knowledge and education are key to liberation. Individuals need to be equipped with critical thinking, self-care practices, and alternative methods of learning to counter the alienation and control imposed by a hostile socio-political order. Education must go beyond institutional frameworks, fostering personal growth and community empowerment to create a foundation for societal transformation.

7. War and Global Change: The Death of the Biosphere as We Know It

War and environmental destruction are inextricably linked. As wars escalate, so do their effects on the biosphere, bringing the planet closer to an ecological catastrophe. Nuclear threats, pollution, and the exploitation of natural resources contribute to the **death of the biosphere**. Global conflicts not only harm human societies but also devastate ecosystems, threatening all life on Earth.

8. How Family Units Can Build Communitarian Processes for Supporting Positive Child Personal Development and Socialization

Families play a crucial role in building healthy communities by nurturing children in environments that emphasize equality, peace, and socialization. Alternative forms of education, such as **communal schooling**, can foster a sense of cooperation and shared responsibility, helping children grow into compassionate, self-aware adults. Strong family units, guided by shared values, are essential for developing equitable and harmonious local communities.

9. A Personal Moral Value System for This Immoral Socio-Political Order

In a world where moral decay and corruption prevail, individuals must ground themselves in a personal moral value system. Practices like **the Eightfold Path** in Buddhism and **Yoga's Astanga** emphasize nonviolence (**Ahimsa**) and truthfulness (**Satya**), offering spiritual and ethical guidance. These philosophies promote living with integrity in a world of injustice, helping individuals find peace and meaning amid chaos.

10. What Can We Do to Help Create a Lasting Global Peace Across All Local Communities?

Achieving lasting global peace requires both personal and collective action. Individuals must align their lives with spiritual morality, embodying humanity, compassion, and justice. Communities must organize around these principles, influencing political systems from the grassroots level. Through sustained efforts at peace-building and advocacy, local movements can challenge global structures of violence and create a more just and harmonious world.



A Conversation with School Parents – What Really Happened?

It's October 7th, 2024, one year after the 'Al Aksa Mosque' Hamas operation to capture Israelis to exchange for Palestinian detainees sparked the deadliest round of Middle East war this century for the occupied and besieged resident refugee population of Gaza and the West Bank, the remnants of Palestine since the 1948 *Nakba* or Catastrophe displaced 750,000 indigenous people to make *Lebensraum* for Zionist settlers, themselves running from their own holocaust at the hands of fascists in Europe during World War II.

One that day last year there was a suspicious and surprising breach of Israel's border fence security system, over1,200 people were killed by both the resistance forces as the abducted over 250 hostages. We now know that during the violent abductions it was also Israeli helicopter gunships that massacred their own people, then the government propaganda machine covered up and distorted the facts in a hasbara of lies that further demonised the Palestinians.

It conveniently signalled the rationale for full-scale military implementation of the 'Definitive Step' - the 2017 right-wing Zionist military government ethnic cleansing plan (designed by current Knesset ministers BenGivr and Smotrich). With full US support for full scale destruction of Gaza, the IDF and its MOSSAD intelligence department have shown all the world in the course of one year their appalling state terrorist credentials, whilst its PR claims it to be the MOST moral army in the world – NOT.



This Orwellian named defence force thrives on war, and has built the Israel state on that war machine, with Benjamin Netanyahu the last of the long line of Israeli state despots running the Zionist world domination project through a constant warring with neighbouring states and ignoring all UN peace resolutions to the point of becoming a rogue state in the diplomatic process, where it is clearly recognised by Israel's 59 Arab state neighbours that a diplomatic negotiated settlement is absolutely necessary to end permanent war, of which Netanyahu, the right wing settlers and the war manufacture and finance institutions and the sole beneficiaries.

For one year Fighter jets, missiles, bombs, tanks, machine guns and snipers have been let loose on civilian men women and children in the world's largest open air prison as Gaza was known from the start of the 2006 siege to the breaking point of October 7th. to the consequent deaths of over 40,000 people, mainly women and children civilians, with 2 million still living in the grey rubble with its grizzly remains of missing rotting corpses trapped in their bombblasted concrete tombs.

These tragic deaths include the deliberate targeting of journalists, academics, medics alongside military resistance fighters, including their families – how humane is that? All socio-cultural assets in Gaza, including libraries, universities, schools, hospitals and healthcare centers have been decimated, with water, electricity and fuel cut off and humanitarian aid cruelly withheld form starving children.

All under the social media spotlight, with the US UK and European governments running their lucrative Zionist project to its final phase of the apartheid Israeli military state outpost of hegemonic US Empire.

But the double standards of the West have been blatantly exposed as the world compares the war in Ukraine to the war in the Middle East. War crimes are being committed at every level and site of Western US led governance, taking us to one minute to Armageddon if not closer. Yet there is one law for some and another for others when it comes to the killing, maiming and starvation of women and children by the million.

It can provide you with perspectives that can break down state manipulation of the population, especially these days through misinformation campaigns.

A timeline of all the wars in Palestine and surrounding countries since 1924 up to now.


Figure 1. Table outlining significant wars in Palestine and the surrounding region since 1924, with estimated death tolls and geographical locations with October 7th in the timeline.

Background – the Inner Peace Forest School - Stop the War Programme Summer 2024



On June 21st 2023, we set up the Peace Parks Music Movement based at the Inner Peace Forest retreat in Southern Portugal.. At that time we protested the war in Ukraine with the campaign. 'Paris Olympics 24, Make Ukraine the Last War.' Since the escalation of military activities in the Middle East on October 7th, with the Ukraine war still in mind, our Olympic Truce focus has turned to Palestine, where as we all know the Israeli state - supported by the US and its Allied military and corporate rulers - with the private financier banking institutions such as Rothschilds - are running their war machine to the full by committing a callous and cruel genocide of the the Palestinian people. Today and over the coming days and weeks we will continue to witness 600,000 children - along with their mothers, fathers and carers totalling 1.5

million people - being systematically starved and beaten to death in front of our own eyes - and the eyes of our own children.

Since our 'Make Ukraine the Last War! launched we now wish to focus the call for Truce to call for a stop to the horror being caused by the right wing genocidal policies of the Israeli State, US, Britain, Germany and other nations imposing military-enforced occupation and apartheid on 1.2 million Palestinian children and another 1 million imprisoned refugee adults. We have now added to the Stop the War Campaign slogan...' *Apartheid and Genocide No More.*'

The Inner Peace Forest School 'Stop the War Paris Olympics '24' programme

The programme Is both a personal and professional appeal to the humanity of all parents in our school and others, parents of whatever nationality, religion or political interest, to put our human morality first and support this peace program in the spirit of empathy and compassion, and as an example to our children at school. Many of you would have read my Xmas 'Animal Farm Revisited' post Orwellian story at the end of the year, ending with the animals corralled at the end of the farm, no shelter, no food, no water, wounded, sick and



dying. This 31st March Equinox you heard me reiterate the '-Stop the War!' end of Spring term message.

Now more than 1 year into this online 24/7 ethnic cleansing of Palestinians, I am still disappointed in the response I have had from school families in my own school and from what I can see in schools in general. I am hoping the peace program we will now run at the school will compensate for a lack of action from the school and its community to date to speak up for the children being killed in our names by our governments. Not in my name please.

The activities programme will echo the current University protest movement at the school level and link to the Summer Olympic Truce message and the Stop the War campaign in the UK. We will present the programme in the school to raise the awareness of what is happening in the face of the government lies we all hear. One of the most disturbing aspects of this horror show has been the lies that our states tell us to cover up their collusion in this historic injustice. We will involve those students who voluntarily wish to participate in the 'BDS - No Vote Protest' and student actions, which we will also be asking you to support at home.

I am still particularly interested in any Jewish/Israeli families from the school or your friends who could represent the 'Jewish Voices for Peace' or 'If Not Now' Organization or similar. A call for a ceasefire and prisoner/hostage exchange benefits everyone except the military industrial war mongers. None of us wishes to see either ourselves or our children manipulated by the nation state war machine, especially as they all grow up to be of age when the state calls them in a future perhaps darker than this one.

We as parents concerned for humanity must at the same time confront our own nationalist indoctrination- to agree eith putting the perverse concept of 'national security' above the lives of 1.2 million children living in the same nation - this is moral no no, and we must collectively show our children a moral stance by example. And by deed. For caring words are not enough. So please join in the activities we will be running and really make an Olympic effort with me, our children and the wonderful international community we have here in Peaceful Portugal.

In practical terms worked toward a Summer Peace Parks Music Camp with our Algarve star Peyoti with his Zeitgeist song 'Palestinian Children,' and former music teacher Marek Juggler launching his 'World Peace' album of songs he wrote here.

The event ran from the 16th of July to the 20th of July and highlighted the start of the Olympic Truce on the 19th of July at the Pizza Party. Camp when celebrated the start of six weeks of global peace during the Olympic Games, calling for the Truce - just to make it happen in one country - Palestine - and stand up to our government's financial military, industrial stranglehold on our culture, our global culture before censorship kills free speech on this issue.

Then our schools and families – by bringing diverse communities together for the well-being of our children as its daily business - can truly provide a good example to them by being part of a historical and global positive force from a school that puts peace first. Other schools are now
