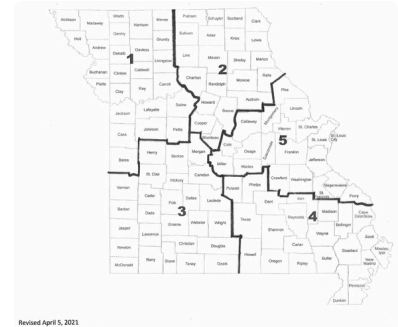
District #5

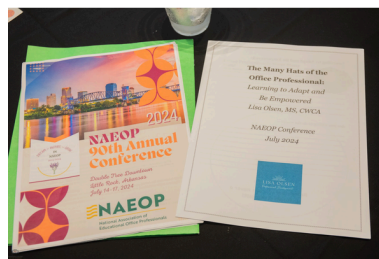

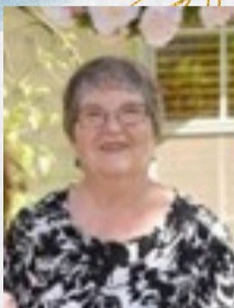

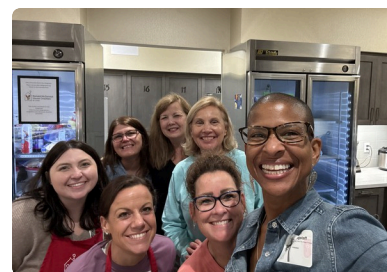


40 years in MAEOP and counting...
