MAEOP District Realignment

At the November 2020 business meeting there was discussion regarding the possibility of realigning the Districts from six to four. Annette Miller, Kim Brannon, Robin Weaver, Sue Roesch and Pam Steele agreed to serve on the committee to review the possibility of district realignment.

The Committee took the following into consideration: keeping the current AEOP's in the same district, if possible, and to look at travel times for members to attend their local AEOP meetings.

The initial attempt left one district quite a bit smaller than the others. The Committee did some more work on the boundaries and was able to reduce the districts from six to five. The updated District alignment map was presented to the Executive Board at the April 5, 2021 meeting and was unanimously approved.

The Committee also recommended the membership form be updated to add a space for the County in which the member works.

Below are the local affiliation reports that were given during the general membership meeting that took place during the virtual spring conference.

District 1

Cass County AEOP — Pam Hecker, President

We have 3 meetings on our agenda for the 2020-2021 year, down 1 meeting due to only 1 member at one school district -thus combining two schools sponsoring the meeting.

We have used Zoom for our all our meetings for 2020-21 10/15/2020, 12/16/2020 and will be using Zoom for the upcoming 4/7/2021 meeting.

Currently we have 18 members for our association, with 6 new members joining for the academic year, a 600% new member increase from last year. We have not had any additional members join throughout the academic year.

Any activities/fundraisers we are doing or planning for-

Fundraisers conducted: Chipotle Fundraiser which required no physical work - just sharing the information and link to the restaurant for a percentage donated to our organization. Due to COVID times, they also included sales from online orders.

One of our successful fundraisers has been a Jean's Week/Day to help support Breast Cancer in October. Due to schools either WFH or allowed to wear jeans for work, we chose to move the fundraiser to February, 2021 and support ALL cancers by selling all cancer bracelets for \$5 each and offering one \$15 gift card, name pulled randomly, to a local venue for anyone donating an additional \$5.

We have a variety of other fundraisers dependent on the status of COVID.

We are still working on a website for CCAEOP.

We will be sending out a Google Survey in April to help assist in determining what the members would like to see, have, do and be, from being a member of CCAEOP.

We continue to enhance the information shared to our members for their professional growth, inviting guests and speakers from a variety of professions that offer health tips, technology tips, stress relievers, and asking our members what they would like to learn more about, receive more training.

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Independence AEOP — April Claphan, President

IAEOP has 28 members. They are currently doing zoom meetings with 4 set for this year. They have not had any social events yet this year due to county restrictions. They have awarded 3 seniors from the 3 high schools the Debby Lewis Memorial which will be presented in May in a virtual award ceremony.

Northwest AEOP — Emmy Brown, President

NWMAEOP is an affiliation comprised of approximately 20 members. We are primarily a social group that meets twice a year to discuss school related topics. Information about workshops and conferences are distributed to members as it arrives. Everyone is encouraged to take advantage of these career enhancement opportunities. Our group communicates via email often to network and keep up-to-date on the latest changes in school law, finance, administration, etc. Most of the districts in this area use the same software, so we also use email frequently to keep abreast of the on-going changes and help each other problem-solve.

In the spring our organization awards one college scholarship in the amount \$100 to a senior who will be entering the business field. This scholarship is funded through donations, dues, and raffles. We also enjoy honoring those secretaries retiring with a gift from the group.

We appreciate our members who report on happenings at the state and national level, pending legislation, retirement issues and continuing education opportunities.

District 2

District 2 has not been able to meet for over a year. Unfortunately during this time they lost a longtime member and officer, Pam Biggs.

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District 4
