A Message of Thanks from Pastor Jim

Just a few weeks ago at the Congregational Meeting I mentioned that even though our 100th Anniversary Year is over, God will find something new for us to do. And because Webster Church is an open and affirming congregation and because we are known for our extravagant welcome, people are reaching out to us, and we have said "yes!"

On Sunday, January 7th we hosted a cabaret entitled "Here We Are," which was presented by BIPOC of Harford County. BIPOC stands for Black, Indigenous, and People of Color, and this group of local artists came together to create a two-hour show where they could perform showtunes that "made them feel joy, liberated and more." And our Webster congregation became the recipients of that joy and liberation. The singers were polished and talented and were ready to go to New York to audition for a Broadway show. We heard amazing solos and duets from "American Idiot," "The Notebook," "Hamilton," "Ragtime," "Wicked," and more. And not only did the performers have beautiful voices, but they were also great actors. And it was amazing to hear how excellent some of our favorite showtunes are when they stand alone from their musical's entire score. So, kudos to JJ DeVoe for making this event happen at Webster Church and kudos to our Official Board for welcoming these gifted performers into our church home. In these troubling times BIPOC will continue to be welcomed here, and we mean it.

Next, on February 21st, we will welcome 24 students and adults from Maine who will stay overnight in our building. They are members of a youth-mentoring program called Trekkers, who will be learning more about Boston, Philadelphia and Washington DC as they travel to those cities and are hosted by churches and community centers. "Trekkers is a youth-mentoring program that helps students build resilience, create community, and develop aspirations for the future." I imagine they reached out to us because they concluded from our website that Webster UCC is an open and affirming congregation. We are so open to welcoming the stranger and offering hospitality that once again we said "yes!" So, before we get so depressed by the latest current events that we can't even get out of bed, let's remember that God is working God's purpose out and that God has a plan for Webster Church. And sometimes all we must do to carry out God's plan is to say "yes!"

Webster Church has a special account at Sysco through the National Headquarters of Blessings in a Backpack which is used to purchase three rotating menu packs for the backpacks. Extra items are packed for the long weekends and winter and spring breaks. Doris and Gary Lyttle order the food and deliver the backpacks to the school. A special thank you to those who help pack the backpacks for each weekend.

The children are very grateful for these items as for some, this may be the only food they have for the weekend. \$175 will supply food for a year per child.
