#### A Pentecost Message from Pastor Jim

"So those who welcomed Peter's message were baptized and that day about three thousand persons were added to the community of believers." And that is the way that Luke concludes his account of the Day of Pentecost in the Book of Acts of the Apostles. The Day of Pentecost is important because it's the day we celebrate God's gift of the Holy Spirit, the preaching of the first Christian sermon, and the Birthday of the Church! We will also celebrate the Day of Pentecost at Webster Church on Sunday, June 8th, when we too will officially add some believers to our community. First the bad news: the number of new members will not be three thousand. Now, the good news: on June 8th we will welcome seven new members to our congregation! But the word "new" is a misnomer, because each and every one who is "joining" is anything but "new" to Webster Church. All seven have been with us for a long time and they all have been very active in our ministry, and I know you will recognize their faces. And yet, no congregation receives "old members" into the Body of Christ, so we'll just have to bite our tongues and welcome them just as they are. I hope you will make an extra effort to join us on Pentecost Sunday. If your love is strong, you'll wear something red. Fickle? Orange and yellow are appropriate also. If you cannot join us, please keep our "new" members in your prayers and we will see you over the summer months.

100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Quilt

The 100th Anniversary Committee decided to continue the tradition of creating a quilt for milestone anniversaries. Gwen Stolzenbach helped the committee to decide on a design that included the handprint of Anara Dooley. On each handprint the family name and the favorite bible verse of members of the congregation present and past were printed. The names of the individuals in the family were printed on the fingers. The outline of the church in the center and the symbols of our outreach projects and the UCC symbol were embroidered in each corner by Ellen Cavanaugh, a friend of Hugh Nash. Gwen organized and sewed the quilt together and the quilting was done by Diane Wetzell, a friend of Tony Dooley. This was definitely a church community accomplishment.

#### **Blessings in a Backpack – Support a Child**

Webster Congregational Christian Church continues to pack backpacks of nonperishable food to deliver to students at Havre de Grace Elementary School each week for 75 students. Once or twice a month a group of people braved the cold scout room this winter to pack several weeks' worth of backpacks. These volunteers are very important to the success of the program, and it is a time of fun and fellowship and exercise.

The children are very grateful for these things, as for some, this may be the only food they have for the weekend. \$175 will supply food for a year per child.

Even though the 2024-2025 school year will end on June 18<sup>th</sup>, funds will need to be raised so we can continue supplying meals next school year. This past school year \$11,000 was spent. At least that amount will be needed for the next school year to continue to feed 75 students.
