This month we will share the thoughts of a family who began to worship at Webster Church this past year and have become an active part of the church – the DeVoe family.

Anniversary Reminiscences

Our family moved to Harford County in 2018. My husband, Mark, was transferred from his office in Colorado Springs in February, but our son, JJ was a senior in high school, so the kids and I stayed behind to see him graduate. We moved to Havre de Grace that summer. One of the very first people I met was Heidi Pensell. Her children were in the same schools as mine and participated in similar activities. Eliana & Ella were in the school play together. Sam was in the band, on the football team and was asked to participate in the school play, where we met Julie Pensell as Miss Baltimore Crabs! The reason I give you all this background is because our very first experience of Webster Church and the concept of your radical welcome was embodied in Heidi and her whole family. Eventually, Sam even got a job at the marina!

We tried a little Episcopal church in Perryville, but their very welcoming pastor was required to retire a few months after we got there. We tried several churches in the area over the next few years, and maybe due to the pandemic, or just the new culture we were faced with, everywhere seemed to have enough people.

Then last fall, Heidi said, "come try our church." That first day felt so different than anything we had experienced since moving here. We sat in the back. We stayed in our seats during the peace. And you all came to find us. You asked for phone numbers and emails and when we could volunteer!!! After 5 years of being ignored on the first day of church, we were overwhelmed and didn't come back for six months. We tried a church with a youth group. Then one day, Eliana said to me, "can we go back to Heidi's church?" She preferred being with people who were interested in her and excited to see her. Of course, I immediately said, "YES!!"

Since May, we have volunteered at Grace Place, marched in the July 4th parade, peeled peaches, volunteered at the Pride Festival Booth and sung in the choir. People from Webster Church have attended Eliana's performances at Boordy Vineyards, in Baltimore and at her high school! When JJ, Eliana & I were in Fiddler on the Roof, Pastor Hugh even asked for our autographs.

Webster church is the most inclusive, welcoming, comforting environment we have experienced since moving here from Colorado. (It helps that some of you have lived there.) So, while our experience is limited to this wonderful 100th Anniversary year, we give you thanks for all our days at Webster Church!
