The SCCW ladies for their Mother's Day outreach project provided a bag of personal care items and chocolates for the 19 mothers at Harford Family House in Aberdeen. Thank you to everyone who helped us with this project.

In May the SCCW was finally able to complete an event that was originally planned before the pandemic. After a bag lunch and a brief meeting at Webster Church we traveled to downtown Havre de Grace to the Havre de Grace Colored School Museum and Cultural Center for a tour of the school and the memorial tribute in honor of the life and legacy of the late George T. Stansbury, M.D. Dr. Stansbury attended and graduated from the Colored School and became a doctor who returned to Havre de Grace to practice. He was the first African American granted privileges at Harford Memorial Hospital. However black patients were limited to the segregated areas of the hospital. He could treat white patients at his office, but if they went to the hospital, they were reassigned to a white doctor.

A quote from his tribute read:

"No disease was too painful or difficult.

No patient was too poor and no amount of time was too great for Dr. Stanbury to give his knowledge, medical skills, and of himself to make others comfortable and well"
