Renovated DAC Gold Adds Luster to Dallas Powerhouse 36-Hole Golf Club

The recent reopening of the Dallas Athletic Club Gold Course, gives the longtime Dallas private club powerhouse two outstanding courses, both of championship caliber for a fast-growing North Texas membership.

The Gold Course, along with the adjacent Blue course which hosted the 1963 PGA Championship, originally opened in 1989 as a Jack Nicklaus layout.

The multi-million dollar renovation which reopened Feb. 1 to limited play, came from longtime Nicklaus associate Chet Williams, who has operated his own Texas architectural firm for more than a decade.

"I always felt this was a good course, but now it feels and acts like a championship course," said DAC head professional Lance Patterson.

"The movement on the course feels outstanding and the finishing stretch is simply great."

The Gold Course remains a par 72 test of golf, stretching 7,085 yards from the back tees, but Williams totally redesigned seven holes, 3,5-7 and 16-18, while adding bent grass 007 XL grass to all the greens.

He refurbished the bunkers, added 11 trees to the property while taking away others plus restoring a sense of challenge and strategy to the entire layout.

DAC completes Gold Course renovation

"We wanted to have a championship feel to the course, changing some holes, renovating others and really giving members and their guests a chance for enjoyment and challenge," said Williams, who is the designer of the No. 1 private course in Texas, Whispering Pines in Trinity, along with several other award-winning designs.

While the championship tees were moved back on several of the holes, the biggest changes come on several of the greens with added slope and movement.

There is also water on nine of the holes with some of the watery features shrunk or enhanced. In addition a new cart path was installed to the entire Gold layout, the tees were leveled, and bunkers filled with Arkansas Premium Play sand.

'We are so pleased with what Chet did as a testament to the championship character here," said DAC general manager Brent Burkhart.

Starting with the sunken Biarritz green on the par 4 14th hole and the sneaky short, but dangerous par 3 15th, the redesigned layout turns especially memorable for the finish.

The 16th is a long par 5 with bunkers, hidden from view off the tee, to the right of the landing area. There is water on the right side of the fairway with a large pond in front of the green and the bank in front it shaved down to repel any short shots into the water, much like No. 15 at Augusta National.

The par 3 17th has a running creek slicing along the right side with a large lake behind the green. The 18th is a par 4, 455 yards from the back tees, with water visible from the tee on both sides and with large greenside bunkers.

"We finally have the tools to maintain the course the way we should to showcase it," said DAC superintendent Travis Moore.

Mavericks acquire P.J. Washington from Charlotte

The Dallas Mavericks have acquired forward P.J. Washington and two secondround picks from the Charlotte Hornets in exchange for forward Grant Williams, guard Seth Curry and a top-two protected 2027 first-round pick.

Washington (6-7, 230) has appeared in 44 games (17 starts) with the Hornets this season and is averaging 13.6 points, 5.3 rebounds, 2.2 assists, 0.9 steals and 0.7 blocks per game while shooting 44.6% from the field. In his 17 starts, he averaged 14.7 points, 5.2 rebounds, 2.0 assists, 0.7 steals and 0.6 blocks per game.

The Louisville, Kentucky native recorded 43 points off the bench against Utah on Jan. 27, the most points by a non-starter in a game in Hornets history and the most points by a player off the bench in the NBA this season. He is one of three players in Hornets history to record at least 43 points in a game multiple times. In his debut game with the Hornets, he set a franchise record for the most points scored in a debut (27) and a league record for most 3pointers made in a debut in NBA history.

NCBWA preseason All-America teams



Texas Tech's Kevin Bazzell was selected as pre-season, first team, All America at catcher

Nation's best featured as NCBWA reveals 23rd annual 2024 NCAA Division I pre-season All-America teams presented by The Game Head Wear

In times when the NCAA transfer portal and NIL sometimes cause confusion in Division I athletics, the 2024 National Collegiate Baseball Writers Preseason All-America teams, presented by The Game Headwear, reflect loyalty to contending universities and some of the nation's most talented diamond standouts.

West Virginia's J.J. Wetherholt, Preseason Big 12 Conference Player of the Year, and Jac Caglianone, Southeastern Conference standout and fellow 2023 Dick Howser Trophy presented by The Game Headwear finalist, head a solid list of returning post-2023 NCBWA All-America selections

Wetherholt earned consensus DI A-A laurels with a nation-leading .449 batting average, 101 hits in 225 times at-bat, 24 doubles, 16 home runs, 60 runs-batted-in and 36 stolen bases (tied for 10th national-ly).

Caglianone posted similarly exceptional numbers with a .323 batting average, 738 slugging percentage, 91-for-282 plate work with 33 home runs (tops nationally), two triples, 14 doubles, 90 RBI, 74 runs, and four stolen bases. The 2023 ABCA Position Player of the Year also was a weekend starting hurler for the Gators with 18 starts, a 7-4 mound mark, 4.34 ERA, .190 opponents' batting average, and 87 strikeouts over 74-2/3 innings pitched for the 2023 NCAA runnerup to LSU.

Pitcher Josh Hartle of NCBWA-No. 1ranked for 2024 Wake Forest, leads the first team starting pitchers with an 11-2 mound mark, 2.81 earned run average, 102-plus innings pitched over 17 starts, 140 strikeouts, 91 hits allowed and just 24 walks for just 2.1 walks per nine innings.

The five starting pitchers on the NCBWA first team had a combined record of 43-9 with 536 strikeouts in 443-plus innings while the exemplary relief corps compiled a composite 36 saves and average over one strikeout per inning pitched.

Some other returnees of note on the NCBWA dream team are Texas Tech catcher Kevin Bazzell with a .348 average, 10 homers and 62 RBI; Hartle's Wake Forest teammate 1B Nick Kurtz with a .353 hitting norm, 24 dingers and 69 RBI; Oregon State 2B Travis Bazzana with a .374 average, 11 homers. 55 RBI and 36 stolen bases; and outfielder Charlie Condon (2023 SEC Freshman of the Year) with a .386 average, 25 homers (tops among all NCAA Division I freshmen in 2023) and 67 RBI.

Defending NCAA champion LSU suffered some extensive player losses from '23 but still boasts returning All-America 3B Tommy White with a nation-co-leading 105 RBI, 198 total bases (third nationally) 102 hits (sixth in DI) and 24 home runs (tied for 11th in the country).

In all, there are 45 different schools and 16 DI conferences represented on the 2024 DI All-America teams, which also have individuals honored from 22 teams ranked in various preseason polls.

Previous NCBWA postseason All-America teams from 1996-2023 have featured the likes of several Dick Howser Trophy presented by The Game Headwear recipients: RHP Paul Skenes of LSU, 3B Kris Bryant of San Diego, P Stephen Strasburg of San Diego State, 1B Mark Teixeira of Georgia Tech, RHP Mark Prior of USC, SS-2B Rickie Weeks of Southern U., 3B Alex Gordon of Nebraska, P David Price of Vanderbilt, C Buster Posey of Florida State, catcher Mike Zunino of Florida, OF Andrew Benintendi of Arkansas and 1B-P Brendan McKay of Louisville, among others.

GOLF, ETC. WITH TOM WARD Introduced to America 60 years ago

This year marks the 60th anniversary of the Beatles first appearance on American TV, performing live on the widely popular Ed Sullivan show. The date was February 9th, 1964 and it was one of the most watched moments in television history at the time.

The event introduced four lads from Liverpool, England named John, Paul, George and Ringo launching Beatlemaniaas well as the wider British Invasion of American pop music.

In honor of their anniversary, I have two friends named Tommy Roe and Joe Sinnott who had a unique connection to all the hoopla surrounding the Beatles back then.

Tommy Roe was a popular singer/songwriter back in 1962 and had a big hit with the song Sheila. Along with fellow singer Chris Montez they were headliners touring England in 1963. Their opening act were the Beatles. Roe recalled,

"I knew from the beginning of our tour these guys, the Beatles, were on their way. The boys along with their manager Brian Epstein, had talked to me about how they wanted to release their records in the U.S. I told them I would try to get them a deal with my record label, ABC Paramount. When I got back to New York, I set up a meeting with my producer and the president of the label. The president put the record on "Please, Please Me" and preceded to tell me that this is garbage. I was shocked and devastated by their reaction. About 6 months later the Beatles got their record deal, and every time the executives at my label would see me coming, they would run for the exit."

Tommy Roe would go on to become a best-selling artist with hits like Sweet Pea, Dizzy and many others. Roe officially retired in 2018.

Joltin' Joe Sinnott was one of the top illustrators/inkers in the comic book industry in the those days mostly working for his friend Stan Lee at Marvel comics. When it became known that the Beatles were coming to America in 1964, the US agent for the Beatles management granted the rights to produce a 64 page color comic book biography of the Beatles to Dell publishing company. The call went out for a top notch illustrator and Sinnott had the honor of being chosen to illustrate the comic book. Sinnott told me the Beatles book was 64 pages and took him 30 days to finish. I asked Joe if he knew who the Beatles were? He said.


"They were so new it was hard to any reference to them. There were hardly any photos of them. Fortunately, someone found a picture magazine of them from England. After I started drawing, it was pretty easy for me to capture their images and I had them down pat."


The book cost a whopping .35 cents, back in a time when normal comic books cost .12 cents. That book is now a rare collectable. Sinnott would go on for decades drawing all the great superheroes that we know and love today. Joe Sinnott passed away at age 93 in 2020.

The Beatles would go on to unprecedented success as a group and individually for decades, while influencing other musicians along the way.

PGA TOUR This week on TOUR: WM Phoenix Open



winner Scottie Scheffler is looking for a third straight win

Waste Management Phoenix Open February 8 - 11, 2024 **TPC Scottsdale** Scottsdale, Arizona Purse - \$20,000,000 Winners share - \$3,600,000 **Defending Champ - Scottie Scheffler**

The PGA TOUR heads from the picturesque Pacific Ocean vistas of Torrey Pines and Pebble Beach to the electric desert setting that is TPC Scottsdale for the year's WM Phoenix Open.

And there could be some history in the making. With two-time defending champion Scottie Scheffler looking for a threepeat, along with the final spots for The Genesis Invitational up for grabs via the Aon Swing 5, this is set to be another special week in Scottsdale, Arizona.

Here's everything you need to know. FIELD NOTES: Scottie Scheffler is looking to become the first golfer since Steve Stricker to win the same PGA TOUR event three years in a row. Stricker won the John Deere Classic from 2009-11. Viktor Hovland, Sam Burns, Rory McIlroy and K.H. Leeall tried for three-peats last season but fell short. Scheffler also finished seventh at TPC Scottsdale the year prior to rattling off back-to-back victories. Only four players have won three WM Phoenix Open events in the tournament's 90-plusyear history (Arnold Palmer did so in three consecutive years, 1961-63). Hideki Matsuyama had his own shot at three-peating at the WM Phoenix Open in 2018 but was forced to withdraw due to injury...

Competing on a major medical extension, Bud Cauley will make his first start on TOUR since the 2020 Fortinet Championship. Cauley has been on the sidelines for most of the last half decade after suffering injuries in a car accident in 2018. He played in back-to-back events on the Korn Ferry Tour earlier this year to shake the competitive rust off and finished T21-T35. He has 27 starts left on his Major Medical Exemption and needs to earn just over 391 points to keep his card... Justin Thomas is back in action coming off two consecutive top 10s with the Aon Swing 5 within grasp. He's currently 50 points back of the magic number to automatically qualify for The Genesis Invitational via the Aon Swing 5. If Thomas doesn't qualify via the Aon Swing 5, he will have to rely on his OWGR standing (the top 30 qualify for all Signature Events; Thomas currently sits at No. 19).... Wyndham Clark is back in action after his win at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am. He made the most significant jump in the FedExCup standings of anyone so far this season with his Signature Event victory... Clark is one of six top-10-ranked golfers who are set to tee it up in the desert including Scheffler, Max Homa, Matt Fitzpatrick and Brian Harman. HIGHEST-RANKED PLAYERS IN THE FIELD

This is the final event to try to earn a spot in The Genesis Invitational via the Aon Swing 5. Matthieu Pavon, Grayson Murray, Christiaan Bezuidenhout, Kevin Yu and Stephan Jaeger are the current top five... Jake Knapp is No. 6 and trails Jaeger by 48 points. Nate Lashley and Thomas are tied with 145 points and trail Jaeger by 50 points... Yu is an ASU grad and lives about 10 minutes from TPC Scottsdale. He's off to his best career start on the PGA TOUR and is inching closer to achieving his biggest dream of 2024 representing Chinese Taipei at the Olympics... The Aon Next 10 for The Genesis Invitational was determined via the standings in the FedExCup Fall. **COMCAST BUSINESS TOUR TOP 10** UPDATES: On the back of his victory at the weather-shortened AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, Clark made a massive jump to No. 3 in the Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10 from No. 61. This was the biggest jump of any golfer this season in the ranking... Pavon continued his fine play in the early part of this season, backing up his win at Torrey Pines with a third-place finish at Pebble Beach. He is now No. 1 on the Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10 and becomes the first Frenchman to do so. Three other golfers made a move into the top 10 after Pebble Beach: Scheffler went from No. 11 to No. 5, Ludvig Åberg zipped from No. 41 to No. 6 after his runner-up result at Pebble Beach, and Jason Day went from No. 22 to No. 10... This is Aberg's first time in the TOUR TOP 10 in his career... Keegan Bradley is just one point back of Day at No. 11... Five different countries are represented in the

Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10. FEDEXCUP: Winner receives 500 FedExCup points.

COURSE: TPC Scottsdale, par 71, 7,261 yards. Opened in 1986, the Jay Morrish/Tom Weiskopf design has been the host club of the WM Phoenix Open every year since 1987.

72-HOLE RECORD: 256, Mark Calcavecchia (2001), Phil Mickelson (2013 18-HOLE RECORD: 60, Grant Waite (Final round, 1996), Mark Calcavecchia (Round 2, 2001), Phil Mickelson (Round 2, 2005; Round 1, 2013). LAST TIME: Scheffler successfully defended his WM Phoenix Open title after a 6-under 65 in the final round. Nick Taylor kept pace with Scheffler until an illtimed mishit on the rambunctious par-3 16th led to a late bogey. Scheffler saved his own par with a clutch 15-footer on the same hole and would go on to birdie No. 17. Taylor's birdie on the 72nd hole of the tournament wasn't enough as Scheffler won by two shots and returned to No. 1 in the world. It was Scheffler's fifth TOUR title. He became the seventh person in tournament history to go back-to-back. Jon

TPC Scottsdale's Stadium Course

They come out in droves for the WM Phoenix Open, which hosts more than 700,000 spectators annually and close to 200,000 for Saturday's third round alone. This year, the stakes are even higher in the PGA TOUR's most raucous environment. In addition to a Sunday finish just hours before and miles from the Super Bowl, this year's WM Phoenix Open is a designated event with a star-studded field competing for a \$20 million purse. The winner will earn \$3.6 million.

Here are five things to know about TPC Scottsdale's Stadium Course, which has been the tournament's venue since 1987. **1. AN ODE TO THE HOHOKAM**

That's the name of the Native American

people who created a network of canals here more than 500 years ago, their engineered effort to bring agricultural life to the desert. Now many of those same watercourses form part of the 336-mile Central Arizona Project, which also borders the Stadium Course's 15th, 16th and 17th holes.

The life brought to this arid ground has been thriving of late. In 1960, Scottsdale's population was only 10,000. Now it's 250,000. Without that canal connecting metro Phoenix (and 80% of the state's people) with the Colorado River, there would be no lush, green turfgrass for the many courses that have helped make the region a booming resort destination.

TPC Scottsdale, the sixth club built in the TPC network, is at the center of that, geographically and figuratively, with 43,000 rounds notched on the Stadium Course last year and 57,000 on its adjacent Champions Course.

2. IT'S GOT HISTORY

The WM Phoenix Open is one of the PGA TOUR's oldest events, dating to 1933. It's been played continuously since 1944 and landed at its current TPC Scottsdale site in 1987, where it has grown into the most well-attended golf event in the world. It's also arguably the cleanest, because tournament sponsor Waste Management, which took over the event in 2010, has been committed to cleaning up and recycling all of the trash from the grounds – including all of those beer cups.

The par-71 course, measuring 7,354 yards, has proven vulnerable to hot streaks – none more impressive than Mark Calcavecchia's wins in 1989, 1992 and

2001 by seven, five and eight strokes, respectively. But given the compression of talent on the PGA TOUR, the course has also seen a recent trend toward nail-biting finishes, including sudden-death playoffs in five of the last seven events. He shot 65-60-64 to tie the TOUR record for lowest score in a tournament's opening 54 holes (Justin Thomas, at the 2017 Sony Open in Hawaii, and Steve Stricker, at the 2010 John Deere Classic, have since lowered the mark by a stroke). Calcavecchia closed with a 67 to then set the TOUR's 72-hole scoring record (256, -28).

"I just don't see how I could top this," Calcavecchia said after winning the 11th of his 13 PGA TOUR titles. His record has since been bettered three times. Justin Thomas now holds the mark with his 27under 253 at the 2017 Sony Open.

3. OCEAN'S 11TH

With an average score of 4.24 at last year's WM Phoenix Open, the 484-yard, par-4 11th hole is by far the hardest on the course. It doesn't get much airtime, but it certainly gets the attention of players. That's because it requires the most demanding tee shot of the round. It's called a "reverse camber" hole, which means it doglegs one way while sloping the other. In this case the hole turns modestly to the right while the ground slopes from right to left – toward a flanking pond.

Reverse camber means that gravity and topography are working against the golfers, who face water left, trees right, and a vertical slope of 4-5 feet from the high-side (right) to the low-side (left). The tendency in fighting a draw here is to over-compensate and block it right off the tee. Even elite players get into trouble when they have to steer a shot, especially on the drive.

This hole also was the site of a unique ruling that led to a recent change in the Rules of Golf. Rickie Fowler won the 2019 WM Phoenix Open despite making triplebogey in the final round. After taking a drop from the water, his ball rolled back into the penalty area while he was surveying his next shot. This necessitated another drop and penalty stroke. That rule was changed in 2023, however. Under the new rule, Fowler would not have been penalized for his ball rolling back into the water after he had taken a drop. He would have been allowed to replace his ball without penalty.

4. THE RIVETING 17TH

The short par-3 16th and its stadium setting gets all that attention, but don't let that overshadow the next hole, which adds another element to a thrilling finish. The 332-yard 17th hole has a lot going on, all of it evident from the tee. It's a terrific place for spectators to watch the action because anything can happen. In short, the hole makes the best players in the world think. The green is readily reachable for most, but a slight tug left brings water into play, as we saw from Sahith Theegala as he was pursuing his first PGA TOUR title in 2022. A slight push and the ball will trickle into a fairway bunker or steep grass swale that present one of the hardest shots in golf, a medium-range pitch to a green guarded by water not only left but also long.

The smart play is to leave it just short and follow up with a chip shot, but even that requires properly navigating a small bunker in the center of the fairway that torments those seeking to play safe. There is a lot going on in the form of a green so artfully cut that it seems the approaching ball is always moving away from the center of it. The 47-yard-long putting surface also features a narrow tier on the back-left that is squeezed between sand and water. The subtle shot-making skills required here evoke the nature of classic links golf. The hole draws inspiration from the 12th hole at St. Andrews, fitting because the course architect, Tom Weiskopf, was a past champion of The Open (winning in 1973 at Royal Troon.).

5. A SPECIAL SHOWCASE

Ultimately, the appeal of watching golf at TPC Scottsdale is simply the pure power and consistency of the players treading upon perfectly manicured, overseeded fairways. The course was renovated in 2014, only enhancing its ability to recognize the best players. Seven of the past eight winners of the WM Phoenix Open are major champions; the lone exception in that span is Rickie Fowler, winner of the 2015 PLAYERS.

There's science behind the distances they achieve here at an average elevation on the course of 1,530 feet above sea level.

At an industry-standard reference point of 1.7% yards gained per 1,000 feet of elevation, they benefit from the thinner air to the tune of precisely 2.6%. That means an additional 7.5 yards per 300-yard drive, plus the bonus roll from these traditionally firm, fast-running fairways. The data confirm this.

The average PGA TOUR drive traveled 299.8 yards last season. Add in the elevation premium and the effect of closecropped, dry fairways and the average drive spanned 313.6 yards at last year's WM Phoenix Open. The numbers don't lie. These guys are good, and they are especially fun to watch at TPC Scottsdale.

From Tiger Woods to a robot, a collection of memorable shots at golf's craziest hole

It holds as many fans as most NBA arenas and sounds like a college football stadium. No. 16 at TPC Scottsdale is the only fully-enclosed hole on the PGA TOUR, and the only one where traditional golf etiquette is, well, not part of the traditions.

Fans cheer when balls hit the green. They boo when they miss. And the people absolutely lose their minds when the ball goes in the hole.

Since the WM Phoenix Open moved to TPC Scottsdale in 1987, nine TOUR players (and one robot) have aced the 16th. You've likely seen one of these aces more than once. So, to celebrate the 25th anniversary of the time Tiger Woods raised the roof at TPC Scottsdale's 16th hole, here is my list of the top five aces from golf's rowdiest hole.

TIGER WOODS (1997)

"They're gonna go nuts when he hits this thing" is the best way to describe every tee shot at No. 16 at the WM Phoenix Open.

In 1997, the rowdy crowd at TPC Scottsdale hit new decibels as a 21-yearold Tiger Woods made his WM Phoenix Open debut. Woods had already won three times since turning pro five months earlier and was coming off a win at the Sentry Tournament of Champions, where he beat the reigning PGA TOUR Player of the Year, Tom Lehman, in a playoff. By Saturday, Woods was 10 shots behind eventual winner Steve Jones and his title hopes were mostly out of reach. But no one remembers that. They just remember his shot at No. 16.

Woods' playing partner that day, Omar Uresti, hit first and put his ball 3 feet behind the pin.

"As soon as it landed, I made the mistake of thinking to myself, 'Let's see you hit it closer than that," Uresti told PGA-TOUR.COM in 2015.

Tiger did. Using a 9-iron on the 152yard hole, Woods took dead aim and his ball took two soft bounces before falling into the hole. The Arizona crowd went bonkers, chucking beer all over the tee box.

"I think I broke Fluff's hand," Woods said of his high five for then-caddie Mike Cowan. He proceeded to whiff on Uresti's high five before famously raising the roof.

Woods eventually finished the tournament at 9-under, good for a T18 finish. The shot might be Woods' most memorable from a tournament he did not win. It's also a mainstay on his highlight reels and gave the world a glimpse of the Tiger Mania that would definite the PGA TOUR for the next 20-plus years.

JARROD LYLE (2011)

It had been nine years since No. 16 had seen a hole-in-one before Jarrod Lyle stepped up to the tee box during the second round in 2011. The big Australian played a draw with enough spin to pull the ball left upon landing and allow it to slide into the front portion of the hole.

Lyle threw his arms up in the air and even-

tually got the crowd going with some windmills.

The hole-in-one would serve as a trademark moment for a player gone too soon. Lyle had battled acute myeloid leukemia as a teenager. He was diagnosed with the disease a second time in 2012. He fought back to play in 20 PGA TOUR events from 2014-2016, but his leukemia would return again in 2017, and in 2018 he passed away at age 36.

At the 2019 WM Phoenix Open, a memorial was placed on the No. 16 tee box, along with an honorary yellow plaque. **LDRIC Robot**

Just 19 years after Eldrick Woods, better known as Tiger, had his hole-in-one at No. 16, a new LDRIC, a golf robot, made one of its own. Unlike most golfers who've made holes-in-one at No. 16, LDRIC played a baby fade with a one-handed finish onto the green.

The swing did feel a bit robotic though, if you ask me.

While LDRIC made the ace on its fifth try, the dynamics are impressive considering Golf Laboratories' Gene Parente gave the robot the wrong club. The San Diegobased creator of the 750-pound contraption thought LDRIC would be hitting a 158yard shot during the Wednesday practice round but LDRIC was actually asked to play a shot from 20 yards closer. Parente had armed LDRIC with a 7-iron, and rather than change clubs, Parente re-calibrated LDRIC's swing.

LDRIC's first shot went over the pin, but Parente was able to adjust the swing formula enough to go pin-seeking by the fifth shot.

"There was no science at this point, it was pure intuition," Parente said.

LDRIC stands for "launch directional robot intelligent circuitry." Or, in golf terms, Robot Tiger.

FRANCESCO MOLINARI (2015)

Want to see Francesco Molinari get pumped up? Yes, the famously stoic Francesco Molinari. Watch his hole-in-one highlight at No. 16 in 2015.

Playing in soft conditions from just 133 yards out on Saturday, Molinari sent a pitching wedge past the pin on the right side of the hole and spun it back for the bucket. A grinning Molinari raised his arms, gave high fives to Harris English and Brian Davis and even waved to the crowd to get them more hyped up. By this point, the gallery was already throwing bottles onto the hole, making it look like an updated version of Woods' hole-in-one in 1997.

Davis had to wait 10 minutes for tournament officials to pick up the foreign objects before he could hit his tee shot. And that was before they got to the green. Upon getting to the hole, Molinari tossed his ball into the stands (Who did he think he was, Mike Evans?), but a fan responded by throwing it back.

"They nearly hit Brian Davis," Molinari said. "A volunteer just raked it out of the bunker and gave it to me at the end of the round. It was nice to get it back. I don't know if I will keep it or give it to someone. I wasn't expecting to see it coming back from the stands."

Somehow, Davis did manage to par the hole. And he got to witness greatness in the process.

Molinari carded an eight-under 64 during that third round, tied for the secondlowest score of the day, but a 72 on Sunday dropped him into a T22 finish. **HAL SUTTON (1988)**


He's the trailblazer they're all trying to copy. Sutton is the man credited with the first ace on No. 16 in the WMPO. He did it in 1988, after winning the event in 1986 and finishing second the following year, in TPC Scottsdale's debut as the host venue.

Sutton played a slight draw into a thirdround back pin location. Correctly judging a stiff wind, he rode the right-to-left green contours into the hole.

The cheer sounded loud for a standard hole-in-one, foreshadowing the future of the iconic hole. Sutton, who opened 68-66, went 74-73 on the weekend to finish T26.

While Sutton didn't get the beer shower his successors did, he is the first name on the statue beside the tee box that honors the aces. There's a first time for everything, and Sutton was the first to give the fans at golf's rowdiest hole something to scream about. SUPER BOWL LVIII

Chiefs have the edge in Super Bowl LVIII



The battle between two former Big 12 quarterbacks should be fun to watch

Super Bowl LVIII matchups, analysis and prediction: And the winner is ...

LAS VEGAS — Los Angeles Times NFL writer Sam Farmer breaks down the Super Bowl LVIII matchup between the San Francisco 49ers and the defending champion Kansas City Chiefs. Kickoff is scheduled for 5:30 p.m. Sunday and will be televised by CBS:

49ers pass offense vs. Chiefs pass defense

The 49ers are all about precision and play calling, which presents a different challenge than the Chiefs saw from AFC championship game opponent Baltimore, whose quarterback, Lamar Jackson could break a big play at any time. Kansas City cannot be overly aggressive with coolunder-pressure quarterback Brock Purdy because the 49ers have so many places they can go with the ball — George Kittle, Brandon Aiyuk, Deebo Samuel and Christian McCaffrey out of the backfield. So the Chiefs have to make sure that 49ers coach Kyle Shanahan's formations and camouflage don't mess up their coverages. Look for more conservative zone coverages than the Baltimore game.

EDGE: 49ers

49ers run offense vs. Chiefs run defense San Francisco can grind out those yards on the ground with McCaffrey, who is so versatile and dangerous. The Chiefs did a really good job of shutting down the run against Baltimore, but the Ravens were complicit in that too. The big problem defenses have with the 49ers is San Francisco has so many ways to go with the ball, so committing to stop the run means all sorts of receiving options pop open. The 49ers were third in rushing yards per game this season, whereas the Chiefs were 17th when it came to stopping the run - and 26th in giving up yards after contact. EDGE: 49ers

Chiefs pass offense vs. 49ers pass defense

Everybody knows the ball is going to Chiefs tight end Travis Kelce often, and rookie receiver Rashee Rice has stepped up in a big way. Now, who is the third option? That has been a mixed bag for quarterback Patrick Mahomes. That might be receiver Marquez Valdes-Scantling, and the Chiefs could test the 49ers by taking some deep shots with him. If the 49ers can mitigate the damage of Kelce and Rice, they will force Kansas City to rely on someone else. The wild card is Mahomes. He turns broken plays into big gains and can take off running at any point. The Chiefs have been more conservative with him this season, in part because their defense has improved. **EDGE: Chiefs**

Chiefs run offense vs. 49ers run defense

Kansas City doesn't have an overpowering run game but the Chiefs can use the ground game effectively at times. They did that in the divisional round in Buffalo, where Isiah Pacheco gained 97 yards against the Bills. The 49ers are so-so against the run and have been punished in the playoffs: Green Bay and Detroit averaged a combined 5.6 yards per carry. The Chiefs would love those numbers. CBS analyst Charles Davis said the 49ers need to focus on clogging the middle. "To me, it's got to be muddy up front," he said. "That defensive front has got to give their linebackers a chance. If they're meeting Pacheco four yards downfield, it's a lost cause and the chains are going to keep moving."

EDGE: Chiefs

Special Teams

Both teams have to applaud the fact this game is being played indoors and weather won't be a factor. The Chiefs have a seasoned veteran in kicker Harrison Butker, who has been in this situation before. That gives him a significant leg up on the 49ers' rookie kicker, Jake Moody. There are aspects to like about both punters, San Francisco's Mitch Wishnowsky and Kansas City's Tommy Townsend, but neither team plans to do much punting. **EDGE: Chiefs**

Coaching

This matchup features Kansas City's Andy Reid and San Francisco's Shanahan, two exceptional play callers. Reid broke through with his first Super Bowl victory four years ago, then won again last season. He's Canton-bound. Shanahan has a chance to redefine his legacy after epic fourth-quarter Super Bowl collapses to New England and the Chiefs. EDGE: Chiefs



Brock Purdy must take care of the football this week

Three 49ers you should know DRE GREENLAW, Inside Linebacker:

Greenlaw and Fred Warner form one of the NFL's best linebacker tandems. Although Warner has been a three-time All-Pro, Greenlaw has not received those accolades. Still, they have great chemistry working the middle of the field and that will be key in slowing Kelce. JAKE BRENDEL, Center:

Brendel is a solid, under-the-radar player whose challenge will be keeping the offensive line on the same page to counter the blitzes of Chiefs defensive coordinator Steve Spagnuolo. Brendel also will need to help to neutralize Chris Jones so the Chiefs lineman doesn't wreck San Francisco's plans the way he did in the Super Bowl

four years ago. DEOMMODORE LENOIR, Cornerback:

Charvarius Ward is the more decorated of 49ers corners, but Lenoir is a young player who continues to improve. He isn't big but Lenoir can make those big hits and game-changing plays. He starts on the outside but moves inside to the slot in clear passing situations.

Three 49ers who must come through BROCK PURDY, Quarterback:

This one is obvious. Purdy needs to take care of the football and be a distributor, making the right decisions and taking advantage of all his playmakers. He's done that for most of the season, although he had four interceptions against Baltimore and has been somewhat hit-and-miss during the playoffs.

NICK BOSA, Defensive End:

The 49ers already are planting the seed that the Chiefs hold on the offensive line and, in truth, that has been a problem at the tackle position for Kansas City. Bosa is a dangerous pass rusher, and the Chiefs will need to account for him at all times. He's

fast enough to catch Mahomes. **JAKE MOODY, Placekicker:**

Moody was a controversial pick in the third round — early to take a kicker. He has had a decent rookie season, although he has missed two kicks in the playoffs. He also missed a 41-yarder that cost San Francisco the game at Cleveland. Key for the 49ers is to make sure he's kicking extra points, not field goals.

Three Chiefs you should know MARQUEZ VALDES-SCANTLING, Wide Receiver:

The Chiefs have searched for that deep threat and appear to have found one in Valdes-Scantling, who has had receptions of 32 yards in each of the last two playoff games. He averaged 15 yards per catch this season.

JAWAAN TAYLOR, Right Tackle:

Taylor and left tackle Donovan Smith are hoping not to hear their numbers called in the Super Bowl, because that would mean something went wrong. Both have had holding issues, particularly Taylor, and that could be an issue against a ferocious San Francisco pass rush.

L'JARIUS SNEED, cornerback:

If Sneed doesn't put up eye-catching numbers Sunday, it's probably because the 49ers are throwing away from his side of the field. He's a smothering corner and that is critical against a team with so many receiving weapons. He made a key strip at the goal line in the win over Baltimore.

Three Chiefs who must come through PATRICK MAHOMES, quarterback:

A no-brainer. Mahomes, playing in his fourth Super Bowl in five years, already has two rings at age 28 and could one day eclipse Tom Brady as the greatest quarterback in NFL history. His ability to scramble and throw off all sorts of platforms and with so many arm angles make every snap a potential huge play. Just as dangerous

with his legs.

TRAVIS KELCE, tight end:

Even if he weren't dating Taylor Swift, Kelce would be squarely in the spotlight. Baltimore couldn't stop him, and that's not unusual considering the trail of wreckage the sure-handed Kelce has left in his wake. There figures to be a lot of action in the middle of the field.

The non-Mahomes, Purdy players to watch in Super Bowl LVIII

The big players holding the sharp money frequently wait to see the crush of public money on Super Bowl Sunday and react accordingly, finding value in the adjusted numbers.

We can't wait, so we are offering our three best Super Bowl prop bets

BetRivers shows only 30 percent of the money and 27 percent of the tickets on the 49ers moneyline, and 28 percent of money and tickets on the Niners spread. **People can't quit believing in Patrick**

Mahomes.

Mahomes is 14-3 straight up and 12-5 against the spread (ATS) as a starter in playoff games.

For his career, he is 10-3 straight up and 11-1-1 ATS as an underdog.

Playing the total? It's been bet up to 47.5, but ...eleven of the 49ers' past 14 postseason games have gone under the total points line. Six of the Chiefs' past eight games have gone under the total points line.

Finally, still thinking about betting against Mahomes? The Chiefs have covered the spread in five straight games. **Side note:** We're ignoring strange props such as these (available at BetOnline):

How many patties will be on Andy Reid's postgame burger? Over/Under 1.5

Over/Under 1.5

How many planes will be seen during the national anthem flyover? Over/Under 4.5

Our three best stabs at the props menu keep things pretty football-centric. **PROP BET 1**

PROP BEI

Brandon Aiyuk, 49ers wide receiver over/under 12.5 yards with his first reception.

San Francisco quarterback Brock Purdy doesn't need a safety-valve target so much as he needs a guy who catches intermediate routes well.

In his past three games, Aiyuk has nine catches for 125 yards (13.9 yards per catch). In the two games prior to that, he averaged 16.3 and 18.8 yards per catch.

The Chiefs will plan to stop Deebo Samuel's runs and receptions as well as wheel routes to Christian McCaffrey. They will hope to flex their newfound toughness in shutting down the middle of the field — Aiyuk's specialty.

The thought here is that there aren't enough defenders to blanket everyone and

CHRIS JONES, defensive tackle:

Jones is a terror in the middle, just as he was against the 49ers four years ago when he tipped three passes at the line of scrimmage. Despite missing training camp and the season opener because of a contract dispute, he earned All-Pro honors and finished with 10? sacks, second-most in the league for an interior defensive lineman.

that Purdy will find Aiyuk early for a tonesetting completion of 13-plus yards. **The bet:** Aiyuk's first catch over 12.5 yards (-105 at BetMGM).

PROP BET 2

Starting QBs alternate passing yards over/under.

The game script for these teams is likely for both to establish the run.

Strong lead ball carriers McCaffrey of the 49ers and Isiah Pacheco of the Chiefs will have a busy first half trying to grab the upper hand.

The clock will run.

Is there a world in which a Patrick Mahomes-led team is blown out in a postseason game? Leaning no. Therefore, here's the way this prop will work:

Kansas City succeeds in pounding Pacheco; San Francisco stubbornly stays with McCaffrey — running and receiving. Mahomes doesn't need to throw downfield to keep the Chiefs close, or in front.

Purdy will have more pass plays in the second half and should have no problem reaching 200 yards by early in the fourth quarter.

In a close matchup, the quarterbacks should both settle in around 230-250 yards passing.

The bet: Same-game parlay, alternate passing yards. Purdy over 214.5; Mahomes under 293.5 (-120 at DraftKings).

PROP BET 3

Travis Kelce catching the football. We know 13 is a lucky number for Taylor Swift . And we know that "49" is part of 49ers. And 4+9 is 13.

And we know that this is Super Bowl 58, and 5+8 is 13.

But Kelce is No. 87. And 8+7 is 15.

And 15 is Mahomes' number. Is there a world in which Mahomes ignores Kelce? No.

This 7/70 same-game parlay is largely predicated on Kelce's postseason resurgence after looking very old (think Nick Nolte in "North Dallas Forty" ... Google it) in December.

But his past three playoff games have been a revelation. Kelce has 23 catches for 262 yards in those games.

Kansas City will need him to be great again. No cold hands, no Super Bowl cold feet.

Hot bet, people.

The bet: Same-game parlay: Travis Kelce over 6.5 receptions and 70-plus yards (+114 at DraftKings).

NFL teams with most Super Bowl wins



The Vince Lombardi Trophy is awarded to the victor of the Super Bowl. What franchise has the most trophies?

If it feels like the playoffs this season are packed with underdogs and up-andcoming teams, you'd be correct.

While some of the traditional powerhouses made it past Week 18, many of the teams in the playoffs were part of the new era of the NFL, from smaller markets and with younger histories.

What makes a traditional powerhouse? Hardware, and there's no bigger or brighter trophy than the Vince Lombardi trophy awarded to the Super Bowl Champion. Still, some teams stay in the conversation of contenders but struggle to win on the biggest stage.

What NFL teams have the most Super Bowl wins?

The Patriots and Steelers are the bluest of the blue bloods thanks to a record six Super Bowl trophies apiece.

All six victories for New England came in the 21st century under the leadership of Tom Brady and Bill Belichick. In the two seasons since Brady's departure, the Patriots missed the playoffs last year and were routed by the Buffalo Bills in the wild card round this season.

Steelers fans haven't been as fortunate recently. Four of their six Super Bowl titles came in the 1970s, followed by a 26-year drought. In 2005, rookie quarterback Ben Roethlisberger led Pittsburgh to its fifth trophy in a win over the Seahawks. They returned to the Super Bowl in 2008 in a showdown between Roethlisberger and Kurt Warner, beating the Cardinals 27-23 behind 131-receiving yards from game MVP Santonio Brown.

Closely behind the Patriots and Steelers, sits the Cowboys and 49ers with five Super Bowls each. San Francisco will have a chance to move into sacred ground with a win in Super Bowl LVI.

What NFL teams have the most Super Bowl appearances?

It's simple statistics -- the more chances you have at the Super Bowl, the more likely you are to win. And boy, have the Patriots had chances. Eleven, to be exact. In 20 seasons with the Patriots -- one of which he missed entirely due to a knee injury -- Brady made it to the Super Bowl a staggering nine times. He's already maintained that average in Tampa Bay, winning a Super Bowl in his first season with the Bucs.

NFF College Hall of Fame All-America wideout at Auburn Terry Beasley passed away Jan. 30 in Moody, Alabama. He was 73. Beasley was one half of one of college football's greatest pass combinations. He was a unanimous All-America choice and the primary target for late quarterback Pat Sullivan, the 1971 Heisman Trophy winner and a fellow member of the NFF Hall of Fame. That season Beasley finished eighth in the Heisman voting as he caught 55 Sullivan spirals, with an even dozen going for touchdowns. That fall the Auburn campus was flooded with "Super Sully and Terry Terrific" bumper stickers. The Tigers contended for the national championship in 1971, winning the first nine games of the season before losing to equally undefeated Alabama in the final game of the regular season. While Beasley is best remembered for his 1971 senior season, yardage-wise he was a better player as a junior for Coach Shug Jordan, as he gained 1051 yards exceeding his senior total by over 200 yards. His 20.2 yards per catch average tied an NCAA record. As a junior he won the first of two consecutive All-Conference honors and was recognized nationally as a second team All-America. His career average of 17.8 yards per catch and his pergame average of 83.9 yards receiving were SEC records. Beasley was also the holder of numerous Auburn marks for career receiving yards, touchdown receptions and 100-yard receiving games.

The participants in the 58th annual Super Bowl LVIII in Paradise/Las Vegas, Nev. are set for Sunday, with AFC winner Kansas City (fourth time in the last five seasons) tangling with NFC champ San Francisco at Allegiant Stadium with a 3:25 (PST) kickoff. Three former NFF National Scholar-Athletes are on Super Bowl rosters with OL Jake Brendel (UCLA) of SF, and OL Mike Caliendo (Western Michigan) and LB Drue Tranquill (Notre Dame) both with the Chiefs. Also, in a first for Super Bowls, Father and son Steve and Brad Freeman of Mississippi State will be the first father-son duo ever to officiate the title tussle (Steve in 2014 and Brad in 2024 both as back judges).

Veteran publicist (45 years in this role at Georgia and seven previous years at Georgia Southern with two NCAA World Series teams with ABCA Hall of Fame baseball coach Ron Polk) and winner of multitudinous national awards (including College Sports Communicators Hall of Fame) Claude Felton is retiring after a half-century-plus career in college athletics. From a personal friendship standpoint, Claude was one of the true Southern gentlemen throughout the world of college athletics.

The NFF Gridiron Club of Dallas (NFF Dallas) is partnering with the Dallas-Fort Worth chapter of the NFL Alumni Association for the club's second annual charity golf tournament. The tournament will focus on raising funds for college scholarships to benefit high school scholar-athletes recognized at its annual awards banquet each spring.
