

ACC announces SMU Basketball's 2024-2025 conference schedule

The Mustangs' first ACC game will be played on Dec. 7 against Virginia

Basketball season is approaching rapidly and the SMU Mustangs are looking at an entirely new slate of opponents as they enter their first year in the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC).

On Tuesday, the ACC announced the Mustangs' 2024-2025 conference schedule during the "Nothing But Net" special on the ACC Network.

SMU and new Head Coach Andy Enfield will host Virginia for their inaugural ACC game on Dec. 7. The Mustangs will also notably host Duke on Jan. 4 and Louisville on Jan. 21.

Before ACC play begins in December, the Mustangs will play an 11-game nonconference schedule which includes seven teams that made it to the postseason last

Following the regular season, the ACC will host its Men's Basketball Tournament at the Spectrum Center in Charlotte, North Carolina from March 11 through 15.

This will be the sixth time that Jerry World has hosted the Gold Cup, previously in 2009, 2011, 2013, 2017, 2021 and 2023.


The Gold Cup tournament will feature 16 men's national teams with a highly competitive environment between June 14

"As the last official centralized tournament in our region before the FIFA World Cup 2026, this Gold Cup will provide all participating federations with a great challenge and will be critical to their preparations for World Cup qualification and for participation in the FIFA World Cup itself, Concacaf President Victor Montagliani said. "The tournament will create a tremendous opportunity for fans across the confederation to engage with the sport at such a pivotal time for its development."

Additional Texas stadiums that will host matches for the 2025 Gold Cup include Q2 Stadium in Austin, and NRG and Shell Energy Stadiums in Houston.

Rangers championship reign ends during final home series of 2024 season

The Texas Rangers were officially eliminated from the playoff race as they clinched a losing season during their defense of the 2023 World Series championship.

There will be no October baseball for the Texas Rangers in 2024. Following a series loss to the Seattle Mariners in their final home series of the year, the defending World Series champions have been mathematically eliminated from any chance at the postseason.

Chances of them finishing with a positive record were also extinguished, as their loss on Saturday was their 82nd of the season. The disappointment from a seasonlong, team-wide slump finally coalesced as everything was made official.

With the season over but for the schedule requiring six more games, the plan now for the final week of the season is to give further opportunities for big-league experience to the likes of Wyatt Langford, Kumar Rocker, and Jack Leiter while the veterans of the club lick their wounds and gear up for 2025.

The biggest news coming out of the series against the Mariners wasn't Jacob deGrom's home debut, but rather that Max Scherzer, who returned after weeks on the IL with a nerve issue, was going back on the IL for the rest of the season with a new injury.

Scherzer was scratched from his penultimate start against the Mariners with hamstring tightness. While he wasn't with the team on Saturday night, manager Bruce Bochy said that the righty woke up with tightness after stretches the day before.

The move ends Scherzer's season, obviously, but with the 40-year old destined to be a free agent this winter, it likely ends his time with the Rangers as well.

With Mad Max out, the Rangers tabbed Dane Dunning for the spot start and he was decent after being reinserted into the rotation, going over 31/3 innings and surrendering two runs while striking out five in his first start since mid-August, but the Rangers' bullpen gave up considerably more runs, closing out the victory for the visitors.

Happy returns

Recovered ace deGrom did not really have to come back to pitch this season.

There was very little to fight for by the time he completed his rehab, and coming off Tommy John surgery, the Rangers were

going to take it easy with him regardless of the situation.

Nevertheless, the former Cy Young winner found it important to pitch in the big leagues this season to reacquaint himself before gearing up to go full bore in 2025, so he returned to the mound in Seattle last week and was able to make one, singular starter at Globe Life Field this season.

He was on a short leash again, as was expected, but still looked every bit the dominant pitcher that the Rangers coveted when they signed him prior to the 2023 season. Over three innings, deGrom struck out five, allowing one run.

Despite only a 58-pitch look, the home fans got a tantalizing glimpse at greatness. Slated for one more start before going into a full offseason of preparations for 2025, deGrom leaving surgery and rehab in the rearview mirror is one of the things to be excited for following a tough year.

A fun finish

There couldn't have been a better way to finish the home schedule, given the circumstances. Texas was able to walk off the Mariners in the finale of the series, completing their largest come-from-behind victory all season when they turned a 5-0 deficit into a 6-5 win.

While they still didn't offer any run support to starter Andrew Heaney, Texas

did get their starter off the hook after he exited the game and landed in the win column for their efforts.

Josh Smith, who was the Rangers' best player at the All-Star Break and, despite a drop-off in the second half, finished the homestand with a hit in every game of the series against Seattle. From last man on the bench to everyday replacement for injured Josh Jung, Smith has shown that he can be a regular in the big leagues. Over the weekend, Smith collected a home run, three RBI and three runs scored.

Wyatt Langford, meanwhile, continued his incredible month with the big blow in the comeback, a three-run homer to start the comeback bid. And it was Marcus Semien that laced the walk-off hit, his first with Texas. That run was scored by Leody Taveras, who was on fire the whole game, going 3-for-4 with three runs scored and the game-tying homer.

The Rangers were able to send the sellout crowd at their home closer happy. In a season full of forgettable moments, the last game at Globe Life Field certainly provided a pleasant memory to send off the Arlington faithful.

Now, the team travels to the West Coast to close out the season where first they will bid farewell to the Oakland Coliseum as the last visitors in Oakland.



Tom's Tip of the week: Free Fallin' Drill

As we enter the fall this is a great time to work on your game as the weather is much cooler.

One of the biggest issues golfer's struggle with is the takeaway. Because the hands are the only contact with the club that's where you feel pressure when having to hit an important shot. If the hands get too fidgety they could inadvertently disrupt the takeaway and create numerous problems. To safeguard against this improper action I have a great drill that help in preventing such bad habits.

In the photos is one of my male students demonstrating the drill. After taking his normal stance, I had him place the golf club out in front of his body (notice the top left photograph.) Now, just throw caution to the wind and sling the club head back and let the laws of physics and centrifugal force take over. If you just allow the club to flow naturally when you let it go backwards it will go on the correct swing plane relative to the size of the individual as long as you don't do anything to manipulate it. Needless to say he was surprised how well he hit the ball from such an awkward starting position with the club starting well out in front. He joked that maybe he should start playing golf that way.

This particular drill is designed to help free up golfers and allow the club head to just swing around the body instead of trying to guide or steer it. That's one of the main reasons why most golfers practice swings are better than their real swings because they don't have a ball in front of them that they are trying to hit.

The top right photo is of the golfer transitioning to the top of his backswing. When you made the correct takeaway the downswing will happen automatically in the proper sequence without having to try to do anything. This action in turn activates the legs to remain more flexed throughout the entire swing creating a dynamic pulling motion from the ground up instead of a hitting action that comes from trying to use too much upper body motion (hands or shoulders). Take a close inspection of the golfers legs after he has already hit the ball in the bottom photo. His right knee is kicked inward towards the target and his head is still down well past impact. Plus, he has tremendous extension with the arms and the toe of the club is pointing upwards meaning he has properly released the club head. The ability to stay down through the shot is one of the keys to becoming a great shot maker.

The essential ingredient to pulling off this drill is to make sure you don't come up, or out, of the posture established on the setup. Staying bent over from the waist as from start to finish will handsomely pay off in the long run leading to better shot making and solid contact.

The golf swing happens at such an incredibly high rate of speed that no one could make adjustments in a split second. That's why using this "free falling" drill helps free up the takeaway and allows you to swing in a smooth effortless motion.

After you get confident with the club out in front prior to swinging, go ahead

and lower the club down after the shot bringing it back down towards the golf ball. By working in reverse you can get that freewheeling feeling you're looking quickly.


So go with the flow and give this drill a try next time you're out practicing. You can let go of all your past inhibitions in the process and be free of anxiety.

This week on TOUR: Presidents Cup



The 15th playing of the Presidents Cup will be held at The Royal Montreal Golf Club for the second time

The Presidents Cup returns to Canada and The Royal Montreal Golf Club with a hungry International Team, led by Canadian Mike Weir as team captain, looking to defeat an American side full of the PGA TOUR's best, including FedExCup champion Scottie Scheffler.

This marks the 15th playing of the Presidents Cup, which returns to Royal Montreal for the first time since 2007 when the U.S. Team beat the Internationals 19.5-

Here's everything you need to know about this year's competition.

U.S. Team:

Course: The Royal Montreal Golf Club, par 70, 7,279 yards (yardage subject to change). The club, on Île Bizard about 35 minutes from downtown Montreal, lays claim as being the oldest club in North America. Founded in 1873, the course – which has moved locations twice - has been home to the RBC Canadian Open 10 times, most recently in 2014. Royal Montreal was renovated by Rees Jones in 2004 (a robust effort that included redesigning 17 greens and rebuilding 70

bunkers) and then again leading into this year's Presidents Cup by PGA TOUR design services. That team lengthened it by about 300 yards and reworked a few bunkers. The front nine has a classic parkland feel while the back nine boasts water hazards on six holes including the final five in a row.

Storylines: The Presidents Cup features four days of competition with five matches on both Thursday and Friday, eight matches on Saturday (morning and afternoon) and 12 singles matches on Sunday ... The U.S. Team is looking to win the Presidents Cup for the 10th time in a row ... World No. 1 Scheffler returns to action after capturing the TOUR Championship and winning the FedExCup for the first time ... Matsuyama, a two-time winner this season, is the International side's top-ranked player ... International Team Captain Weir picked three countrymen to represent the International Team at Royal Montreal: fellow Canadians Conners, Pendrith and firsttimer Hughes. Pendrith was the lone Canadian to make it to the TOUR Championship after his maiden victory earlier in the year. Weir defeated Tiger Woods in 2007 in Sunday Singles the last time the Presidents Cup was at Royal Montreal ... Bradley was picked by Captain Furyk to play on the team and will no longer be one of Furyk's captain's assistants (he was replaced by Brandt Snedeker) ... Day returns to the Presidents Cup for the first time since 2017. He was a captain's pick for the International Team in 2019 when it was in Australia but withdrew due to injury ... Scott, making his 11th Presidents Cup start, has played 49 matches in his Presidents Cup career ... Homa was a sparkplug for the U.S. Team in 2022, going 4-0-0. He is the only player on either side who has played in at least one Presidents

Cup and has not suffered a loss ... There are six Presidents Cup rookies this year (four on the U.S. Team and two on the International side) ... Medinah Country Club near Chicago will host the Presidents Cup in 2026 while Kingston Heath Golf Club in Australia will host in 2028 ... Justin Trudeau, who has been Canada's 23rd Prime Minister since 2015, has accepted an invitation to be the Honorary Chairman.

Last time: The U.S. won 17.5-12.5 at long-time PGA TOUR stop Quail Hollow Club in North Carolina. The Americans started hot, going 4-1 on the first day, and never looked back. They went 4-1 again on Friday's second day before the International Team staged a bit of a comeback Saturday, going 5-3 across the eight matches. Schauffele beat Conners 1-up in Singles to clinch it. Jordan Spieth was the biggest points-getter on either side, going 4-0-0. Im and Sebastian Muñoz were top performers for the Internationals with 2.5 points each.

2024 U.S. Presidents Cup Team

The United States team has a chance to extend the overall standings in the history of the Presidents Cup to 13-1

You can't win if you don't play. That familiar refrain crosses pursuits as serious as life and as hopeful as the lottery, but it also can be a rallying cry for the hosts of the Presidents Cup.

The Internationals represent the home team for the 15th edition of the biennial competition that alternates sites abroad with stages inside the United States. Back inside the friendly confines of The Royal Montreal Golf Club in Canada this week, the Internationals aren't just bidding to win for only the second time in history (1998), there's also the matter of ending an active losing streak that stands at nine. It included a five-point defeat, the first time that Royal Montreal hosted in 2007.

But is it fair that any of that matters this week? Beneath the individual team Power Rankings is an exploration of that thought, details of the course, a peek at the format and more.

NOTE: In a match-play team competition consisting of five sessions over four days, only one of which is Singles on Sunday, and with matchups and momentum determined in real-time, the ranking of the players below reflects projected impact on the event.

International Team Rank Players

12 Christiaan Bezuidenhout South Africa

The only South African for the second straight edition went 1-0-1 in 2022. Leans on his short game and putting more than most, so he can be insurance for an unnatural partner. Fresh off his best season on the PGA TOUR.

11 Byeong Hun An

South Korea

At 33, he's the elder statesman of the four South Koreans on the squad. His second appearance (2019) is a manifestation of his return to the PGA TOUR and advance to his first TOUR Championship this year. Fancy fit for Four-ball.

10 Jason Day Australia

This is the Aussie's fifth appearance but first in seven years, so he might have some feels of being a rookie again but with veteran leadership, and that's a good thing. A fresh approach with experience is a potent combination.

9 Mackenzie Hughes Canada

First-timer. The only debutant among the three Canucks on the team, but he might be best built among all 12 to craft a reputation as a force in this competition. Intense and steadfast with a short game to back it up.

8 Taylor Pendrith

Canada

With his drive to qualify, successful run to finish T14 in the FedExCup and profile, the 33-year-old could be the breakout performer in his native land. Although he went 0-4-0 as a rookie in 2022, experience still matters

7 Min Woo Lee Australia

First-timer. Casual fans of the sport could be treated to a showcase for why avid fans are giddy about his debut. The 26-year-old Aussie is confident, aggressive and fearless. He's exactly the kind of injection his team needs.

6 Corey Conners Canada

Canada's top-ranked talent wants to exorcise demons that yielded an 0-4-0 record in his debut in 2022. His ball-striking plays up on smaller greens, so he's poised for a reversal. Steady and ready to dazzle the home crowd.

5 Adam Scott Australia

Tied with Ernie Els for the most points (21) for the Internationals in Presidents Cup history, the 44-year-old Australian arrives with arguably the best form on the team with two seconds, a T4, a T10 and a T18 in last five starts.

4 Tom Kim South Korea

The darling of the 2022 edition at Quail Hollow Club went 2-3-0 in a losing cause, but the South Korean has risen rapidly as a cornerstone armed with another two years of PGA TOUR experience. Made some noise of late.

3 Hideki Matsuyama

Not only is he the only Japanese native on the team but he's also the only player from Japan in history with more than two appearances. Now in his sixth, the challenge is identifying the best partner. Two wins and a bronze medal this year.

2 Si Woo Kim South Korea

Among Captain Mike Weir's important orders of business should be to slot fellow South Koreans Si Woo Kim and Sungjae Im in an opening match of the opening session. They won the gold medal as a team at the 2023 Asian Games.

1 Sungjae Im South Korea

Given that he's a combined 5-0-1 in

Four-ball and Singles in two appearances, slotting him in the opening matches for the former and as a timely weapon in the latter has merit. Exceptional form in last five months, too.

U.S. Team

Rank Players 12 Max Homa United States of America

He'd love to tap into his 4-0-0 at the 2022 Presidents Cup or the 3-1-1 at the 2023 Ryder Cup, but he's a far cry from the kind of explosive form that yielded those monster performances. Usage will be curious but probably familiar.

11 Keegan Bradley

United States of America If you don't think that life comes at you

10 Russell Henley United States of America

First-timer ... finally. Crazy to believe that this is his first team competition as a professional. Does so many things so well but his strengths will be magnified at Royal Montreal. Natural fit with Brian Harman despite inexperience.

9 Brian Harman United States of America

First-timer. Presents so much flexibility across the roster despite his foray. Value in Foursomes with accuracy and putting is obvious, but a collaboration with former University of Georgia teammate Russell Henley is as well.

8 Wyndham Clark United States of America

First-timer. Given his firepower, Captain Jim Furyk would be wise to steal a page from the playbook of 2023 Ryder Cup Captain Zach Johnson and reserve Clark's energy for Four-ball. He went 1-0-1 in those sessions in Italy.

7 Sahith Theegala United States of America

First-timer. Unflappable, adaptable, humble and easy-going. It's not a reach to consider that anyone would want to partner with the 26-year-old in any format. Even inexperience hasn't been a headwind. Embraces everything.

6 Tony Finau United States of America

No matter the talent and ability, sometimes the best partnerships sidestep the quantifiable in favor of comfort. He's best suited to join forces with the scuffling Max Homa in Foursomes. The duo went 2-0-0 in the format in 2022.

5 Sam Burns United States of America

Trotted through the tape with a T12 at the TOUR Championship. It punctuated a run of almost four months of impressive form since becoming a first-time father to son, Bear. Still searching for footing in team competition, however.

4 Patrick Cantlay United States of America

Records in the Presidents Cup (6-3-0) and Ryder Cup (5-2-1) are extensions of his seamless partnership with Xander Schauffele, but Cantlay also, teamed with Wyndham Clark to win a point in

Foursomes at the 2023 Ryder Cup.

3 Collin Morikawa United States of America

Although he's a veteran of one Presidents Cup and two Ryder Cups, he's yet to forge a convincing partnership. Perhaps this is the time with Sahith Theegala. They share similar skill sets and both arrive in outstanding form.

2 Xander Schauffele United States of America

He and Patrick Cantlay are the plugand-play duo, but both could detach and contribute. Schauffele's tenaciousness best fits Foursomes, so a connection with Brian Harman is intriguing. Should also be an anchor in Singles.

1 Scottie Scheffler United States of America

The Internationals might be thrilled that he has to have a partner in the team formats because it's a deviation from his dominating norm. Not that that would rattle him, anyway, of course. Look for a reunion with Sam Burns.

They lace up spikes and press tees in the ground because you never ever ever ever know. Golf is a four-letter word, but romancing the possibilities is the heartbeat of the hype for the International Team to reverse course in the Presidents Cup. While there is a potential for the weight of the losing streak in the team room, every squad is unique, so the only objective is to win one in a row, for this team, for this time. Objective simplified.

Yes, everything is always easier said than it is done, and especially when the opponent presents as formidable as the Americans. Then again, the road team also has to hit the shots. What's more, while losing would constitute an upset for the Yanks, consider the pressure of having arrived with the pride of being called upon to uphold the winning streak that spans the first quarter of this century.

If that seems like a long time, consider that The Royal Montreal Golf Club is the oldest of its kind on the continent having just celebrated its 150th anniversary last year. The Blue Course is the standout on the property that boasts two 18-hole tracks and a nine-hole walk. The stock par 70 can stretch to 7,279 yards, which is not long by any professional's standard, so accuracy from tee to green supersedes muscle no matter the format. Targets covered with bentgrass are just 5,000 square feet on average.

In addition to the 2007 Presidents Cup, the Blue Course also has hosted numerous RBC Canadian Opens, the most recent of which in 2014. Tim Clark, the diminutive sharpshooter from South Africa for whom it could be assumed never won a long-drive contest, emerged with a one-stroke victory at 17-under 263. He missed a field-low nine fairways and squared only two bogeys all week. Of this week's two dozen participants, only Taylor Pendrith (T43) and Corey Conners (MC) competed in that

tournament, both as amateurs.

While the Blue Course inherently forces cause for pause off the tee, if Captain Mike Weir's strategy for the setup is to let the bluegrass rough grow, thus taking drivers out of the hands of the visitors, the psychology of attrition through ball-striking from similar distances on approach could emerge as a tactic by Sunday's Singles. Given his position as the leader of the underdog of the battle royale, Weir will want to keep things close with 12 of the 30 points totaled by both teams up for grabs in the final session. In the interim, he will be navigating nine matches each of Foursomes and Four-ball across three days, all the while committing to a passion and a potion of merging 12 charges representing five countries all to pull on the rope at the same

As it often does in this outdoor activity, the weather could be a headliner for Thursday's opening session as rain and potentially storms could linger long enough to disrupt the schedule, but there will be enough daylight until at least 6:40 p.m. local time to allow all five matches to finish. Close to zero concerns for the remainder of the competition, however, as a dry pattern locks in. Daytime highs will flirt with 70 degrees and wind will not factor once the early energy exits.

Pick: Jets 24, Broncos 17

Philadelphia (2-1) at Tampa Bay (2-1) Sunday, 12 p.m. / Fox Line: Eagles -2.5 / 45

This is a rematch of last year's NFC wild-card matchup, which Tampa Bay won 32-9 behind Baker Mayfield's 337-yard, three-TD performance. So, why are the Eagles favored? Saquon Barkley is averaging 5.6 yards per carry, and that has given the Eagles balance around Jalen Hurts. Linebacker Zach Baun, who ranks second in the NFL with 37 tackles, had anchored an improved defense that has allowed 204.3 yards per game. Tampa Bay's Week 3 flop also influences this pick a bit.

Pick: Eagles 31, Eagles 28

Cincinnati (0-3) at Carolina (1-2) Sunday, 12 p.m. / Fox **Line: Bengals -4.5 / 48**

Andy Dalton will face his former team again. Dalton has faced Cincinnati with three different teams (Dallas, Chicago, New Orleans) since leaving, and he is 2-1

with a 100.8 passer rating in those games. The Bengals, however, should stay on track here with a pass rush led by Trey Hendrickson and a healthy connection between Joe Burrow and receivers Ja'Marr Chase and Tee Higgins. The Bengals are 6-4 ATS as a road favorite since 2022.

Jacksonville (0-3) at Houston (2-1) Sunday, 12 p.m. / CBS Line: Texans -7 / 45.5

The Jaguars are looking to spice up the AFC South race against the Texans, who got their Week 3 reality check. Houston could not run the ball without Joe Mixon (ankle), and C.J. Stroud struggled as a result. The Texans split with the Jaguars last season, but Stroud averaged 292 passing yards with four TDs and no interceptions in those games. The Jaguars will keep it competitive off a short week, but Houston gets right at home.

Pick: Texans 24, Jaguars 20

Washington (2-1) at Arizona (1-2) Sunday, 3:05 p.m. / Fox Line: Cardinals -3.5 / 50.5

A couple of star rookies will shine in this game. Marvin Harrison Jr. averages 19.8 yards per catch with three TDs, and Kyler Murray should be able to connect for at least one more score here. Washington is coming off a short week, but the results with Jayden Daniels have been encouraging so far. This is a tricky line because the Cardinals are a favorite for the first time under second-year Jonathan Gannon.

Pick: Cardinals 27, Commanders 25

New England (1-2) at San Francisco (1-2) Sunday, 3:05 p.m. / Fox Line: 49ers -10 / 49.5

It's a huge spread, and it's key not to over-value last week's performance by either team. The 49ers let a late lead slip, and they need stars Deebo Samuel and George Kittle to get healthy. There have been two NFL games with spreads of nine points or more this season, and the underdog has won straight-up both times. New England pulled that off in Week 1. This time, the 49ers pull away in the second half behind Brock Purdy, who averages 280.7 passing yards per game with a revolving-door supporting cast.

Pick: 49ers 31, Patriots 17

Cleveland (1-2) at Las Vegas (1-2) Sunday, 3:25 p.m. / CBS Line: Raiders -1 / 37

Who gets well here? Cleveland has a non-threatening offense, and Deshaun Watson has taken a league-high 16 sacks. The Raiders are coming off a messy loss against Carolina and have the worst rushing offense in the league (51 ypg.). Which defensive star makes the game-changing play — Myles Garrett or Maxx Crosby? The Raiders have won the past four meetings in this series.

Pick: Raiders 25, Browns 19

Kansas City (3-0) at L.A Chargers (2-1) Sunday, 3:25 p.m. / CBS Line: Chiefs -8 / 39

What does Jim Harbaugh add to the Chiefs-Chargers' rivalry? Los Angeles will try to slow down the Kansas City offense with the running game, which was ineffective in Week 3 against the Steelers. Justin Herbert (ankle) will hopefully be healthier here, and the Chiefs have been scraping by with one-score victories each week. The Chiefs have a -2 turnover ratio. The Chargers are at -3. Los Angeles could pull off an upset here, but we will settle for a close game. Kansas City has won four games at SoFi Stadium by a combined total of 11 points. If the line ticks up, jump on the Chargers.

Pick: Chiefs 24, Chargers 19

Buffalo (3-0) at Baltimore (1-2) Sunday, 7:20 p.m. / NBC Peacock Line: Ravens -2.5 / 46.5

The Bills are coming off a short week, and the Ravens avoided a 0-3 start with a victory at Dallas. Both are forever chasing Kansas City in the AFC race. How will Buffalo handle the tandem of Lamar Jackson and Derrick Henry? Together, they average 5.9 yards per rushing attempt. Buffalo has found a rhythm with Josh Allen and James Cook, and the Bills have avoided turnovers. Buffalo won 23-20 at Baltimore in 2022. Will Justin Tucker, who is five-of-eight on field-goal attempts, knock down the game-winning field goal as time expires?

Pick: Ravens 31, Bills 28

Tennessee (0-3) at Miami (1-2) Monday, 6:30 p.m. / ESPN Line: Dolphins -1 / 36.5

The Titans are in disaster-control mode. Tennessee has a -7 turnover ratio, and they have averaged just 16 points per game as a result. Skyler Thompson averaged 5.6 yards per attempt in his first start for Miami in Week 3, and, if his rib injury is healed, he will be asked to do more because the Titans have a tough run defense. It's a true pick 'em, but we'll favor the home team. Miami might be limited, but they are taking care of the football.

Pick: Dolphins 23, Titans 20

Seattle (3-0) at Detroit (2-1) Monday, 7:15 p.m. / ABC Line: Lions -3.5 / 47

The Seahawks' defense, which has allowed 14.3 points per game, has been the key to a hot start. The Lions have been dealing with key injuries, including tight end Sam LaPorta (ankle). Detroit has played three one-score games to this point, and this will be another one that tests Dan Campbell's mantra of "grit." Detroit is 9-3 S/U and 7-5 ATS as a home favorite at Ford Field since 2023, and the prime-time spotlight will help.

Football historians and fans unite: The Knute Rockne Memorial Society and the Notre Dame Club of Atlanta are honored to co-host a special event on Friday, Oct. 18 the 100th anniversary of the famous Notre Dame-Army game which gave the Fighting Irish backfield its iconic nickname...The Four Horsemen - at the NFF Chick-Fil-A College Hall of Fame. "Outlined against a blue-gray October sky the Four Horsemen rode again. In dramatic lore they are known as famine pestilence, destruction, and death. These are only aliases. Their real names are Stuhldreher, Miller, Crowley and Layden," penned sports writing icon and famed Vanderbilt graduate Grantland Rice in his nationally-syndicated account of Notre Dame's 13-7 victory over Army at the Polo Grounds in New York City on Oct. 18,1924.

On Oct. 18 multi-media presentation at 2 p.m. (EDT) in the GameDay Theatre of the College Football Hall of Fame will honor the legendary game, team and season. Coach Knute Rockne's 1924 Notre Dame squad was the first football team to play games in New York City, Chicago and southern California (the 1925 Rose Bowl) in the same season while sweeping to a 10-0 record and the school's first consensus

national championship.

From the swarm of fans descending into the Polo Grounds, the march of the Corps of Cadets, through four quarters of spirited battle, and finally Rice's words in the gloaming from an open, unheated press area, the event will relive the experiences of one of the most iconic days in college football history.

The \$25 admission for the day includes an All-Access Pass to the College Football Hall of Fame, effective at 3:30 p.m. (EDT) following the presentation featuring Jim Lefebvre, award-winning author of Loyal Sons: The Story of The Four Horsemen and Notre Dame Football's 1924 Champions. Lefebrve will inscribe and sign copies of the Special Centennial Commemorative Edition of the Loyal Sons book at an autograph session afterwards.

The Nos. 11-12 seeds by the CFP formula were Penn State and Liberty to replace AP Top 25 Nos. 11-12 Ole Miss and LSU...FOX's Kansas State-Arizona football telecast on Friday, Sept. 13, had Nielsen Ratings at 15 percent above broadcast the average ratings for FOX's summer WWE Friday Night SmackDown shows...ESPN related that the Pat McAfee Show has been a profit center with network advertising and popularity...Award-winning Ralph Russo and Associated Press researched that \$75 million is being paid out in game guarantees to opposing teams such as Northern Illinois (Notre Dame) Kent State (Tennessee), Jacksonville State (Louisville), Toledo (Mississippi State), Akron (Ohio State) and dozens of other home squads...ESPN NBA Insider Adrian Wojnarowski is leaving the network to become general manager for St. Bonaventure men's basketball in a major hiring coup for College Sports Communicators Hall of Fame member and beloved Bonnies vice president and AD Bob Beretta...The Athletic's Bruce Feldman surmises that Memphis and Tulane also may be future membership targets for the Pac-12 or Mountain West Conferences...247 Sports says there is a rise from previous years in compensation for general managers and player personnel directors for college athletics - new positions founded after the advent of the NIL in 2021...CBS Sports columnist and award-winning Dennis Dodd has been told by multiple sources that the four MWC teams moving to the Pac-12 likely will be the only MWC members taking the new plunge. The Athletic's Stewart Mandel speculated about the re-establishment of the Pac-12 Conference as a Power Five circuit member and the post-2026 impact on College Football Playoff selections...The Korn Ferry Four Dimensional Leadership Assessment survey brought in 24 ADs and received their opinions about current challenges in college athletics and ways to find solutions to these issues through strategic management...JohnCanzano.com opines that the current plan is for the Pac-12 Conference to settle with nine members starting in July 2026 to allow for an eightgame intra-league football slate and 16contest basketball double round-robin. Canzano.com did not speculate on 2-3 additional Pac-12 football members but hinted at St. Mart's (Calif.) and Gonzaga as possibilities for all sports outside of football...WFAA-TV in Dallas celebrated its 75-year anniversary of opening on Sept. 17, 1949, with famed sports anchors Verne Lundquist, Dale Hansen, Joe Trahan, and many others describing the best of college, high school and professional athletics in Dallas-Fort Forth and nationwide for eight decades...The Athletic's Scott Dochterman surmises that North Dakota State, South Dakota State, Montana, Montana State, UTEP; New Mexico State, Idaho, Sacramento State, North Dakota, South Dakota, and Northern Arizona might consider moving up to NCAA FBS (for the FCS possibilities) and joining the Mountain West Conference...CBS Sports columnist Matt Norlander related how Gonzaga might be a player in both Pac-12 and MWC expansion plans...Extra Points publisher Matt Brown and others noted that California and Stanford remain entrenched in ACC membership and definitely will not reconsider their departures from the Pac-12...Dr. Jason Penry, founder of Penry Advisors, gave college ADs and fundraising members several pointers about success in athletics funding, principally involvement precedes investment, relationships work across all industries, doing things for the greater good makes it easier to put in the time, and never promise something you can't deliver...UFC CEO Dana White explained how the group's Noche live events from The Sphere in Las Vegas will include movies and other entertaining light shows...Sports Illustrated's Kevin Sweeney glanced at the implications and possible power ratings for the four new Pac-12 Conference members as they relate to men's and women's basketball and the College Football Playoff starting during the 2026 season...The San Jose (Calif.) expanded College Football Playoff...Some of the most viewed telecasts in recent weeks have been Georgia-Kentucky (ABC) 6.6 million Nielsen Ratings; Alabama-Wisconsin (FOX) with 5 million-plus, LSU-South Carolina (ABC) at 4.9 million; Colorado-Colorado State (CBS) with 3.2 million...Bloomberg's Peter Robison and Noah Buhayar gained access to a story of a possible student-athletes' boycott by Michigan State football prior to the MSU-Iowa game in 2023 because the NIL collective Spartan Dawgs 4 Life discontinued NIL payments for some Spartans...Last week Sports Illustrated named Caitlin Clark of Iowa and the WNBA Indiana Fever to the list of the 50 Most Influential Figures in the Sports World ...John Canzano.com mentions 4-5 additional schools that could be candidates for membership in the revised Pac-12 Conference with Tulane, Memphis, USF, UTSA, and possibly Air Force in the mix...The Field of 68 website acknowledged men's and women's basketball possibilities with multiple expansion partners for the Pac-12 Conference...On3.com's Nick De La Torre gained insight about a possible Florida boosters' group meeting to discuss the Gators head coaching situation...

FWAA, CSC, NCAA, Etc.:

The FWAA-NFF Grantland Rice Super 16 FBS poll continues throughout the season and ends with the final survey after the College Football Playoff championship encounter on Jan. 20, 2025 and included No. 1-8 rankings on Sept. 15 for Texas (first No. 1 selection since 2009), Georgia, Ohio State, Alabama, Ole Miss, Tennessee, Miami (Fla.), and Oregon ... Toledo is the FWAA Cheez-It National Team of the Week after thumping SEC opponent Mississippi State 45-17 in Starkville, MissCollege Sports Communicators featured in major online or social media posts in recent days are Cody Bush of the Pioneer League, Kit Stetzel of Butler, Joel Beeler of Davidson, Dave Shindelar of Drake, and Mike Ferrraro of Marist...Arizona State, Florida, Florida State, LSU, Michigan State, Ole Miss, South Carolina State, Tennessee, UCLA, and USC are conferring with NCAA enforcement and compliance officials concerning possible challenges and probes at their respective schools ... NCAA Coordinator of Football Officials Steve Shaw emphasized that the college football two-minute "timeout" is a bit unlike the NFL's two-minute "warning" at the end of the first half and prior to the end of regulation. The NFL twominute warning was put in place in 1942 when game timing was kept on the field by officials and later to allow telecasts to have a final natural commercial break before each ending besides the natural breaks after scores or injuries...U.S. Sen. Richard Blumenthal (Dem-Conn) and U.S. Rep. Paul Tonko (Dem-N.Y.) are sponsoring the Supporting Affordability and Fairness with Every Bet Act to place regulations on wagering companies with limits

on certain sports wagers and other key provisions. Blumenthal also said that the entire sports gaming industry targets people wanting to earn quick dollars against major odds...The Johnson v. NCAA and the previous Berger v. NCAA case filed in 2014 have had different legal tacks taken by NCAA attorneys as jurisprudence continues on the U.S. District Court levels.... ...Attorneys on both sides have told judges repeatedly that both Clemson and Florida State did sign the original ACC Grant of Rights for multimedia contract through 2036 and that most courts consider that a continued binding agreement...Several MLB teams have denoted ticket packages and special occasions for the 2025 campaign as the '24 regular season comes to a close...House v. NCAA plaintiffs' attorney Jeffrey Kessler told media members that both parties are working on clarification of language of the final settlement with no timetables set...Georgia Gov. Brian Kemp signed an executive order to allow Georgia colleges and universities to pay NIL compensation directly to student-athletes rather than having to go through third-party NIL collectives...The NCAA Division I Committee on Infractions reported that South Carolina State did not monitor student-athlete eligibility forms during the 2021-22 academic year to cause studentathletes in three sports to be declared ineligible...The mayors of Dallas and Fort Worth again had friendly wagers riding on the outcome of last Saturday's TCU at SMU encounter.
