

Example: Steer

The buyer makes the highest bid at \$3 per pound on a 1,000 pound steer. The buyer will pay \$3000 and a \$400.00 processing fee for a total of \$3,400.00 for the steer. The animal is then sent to harvest at no additional cost to the buyer. It will be returned cut and wrapped in the “Standard Cut,” unless otherwise specified by the buyer on the cut sheet.

Example: Swine

The buyer makes the highest bid of \$4 per pound on a 250 pound hog. The buyer will pay \$1000 and a \$150.00 processing fee for a total of \$1,150.00 for the hog. The animal is then sent to harvest at no additional cost to the buyer. It will be returned, cut and wrapped in the “Standard Cut,” unless otherwise specified by the buyer on the cut sheet.

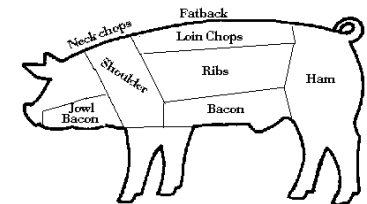
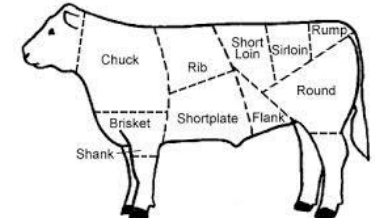

SILENT AUCTION

Throughout Fair Week, silent auction tables are open for bidding on Citrus Trees, Laying Hens, Meat Goats, and Market Sheep. Bidding on Silent Auction items closes at 5pm Sat., 3/18. Bid winners will be contacted after 5pm and payment will begin to be accepted at 6:00pm. Citrus Trees and Laying Hens are taken home by bid winners Saturday evening, after payment. Silent auction Meat Goats and Market Sheep will be processed with live auction market animals, and buyers will be notified of meat pick-up date and location.

LIVE MARKET AUCTION

Registration for the Live Auction will take place from 3-5pm on Sat., March 18th.

The Live Market Animal Auction will begin at 5:00pm.

In addition to ALL Steers and Swine, the Grand and Reserve Champion Citrus Trees, Laying Hens, Market Rabbits, Wether Goats, and Market Lambs will be sold during the Live Auction.

ABOUT THE SHOW & AUCTION

The Livestock Show & Auction is held each year to provide student exhibitors with the opportunity to exhibit project animals to the public and to sell their market-ready animal at auction.

For the exhibitor, the Show & Auction is the culmination of a year's hard-work with their animal, in their club, and with community involvement.

WHAT YOU WILL RECIEVE: QUALITY

The show animals available to purchase are high-quality market animals with excellent meat. IRCYLH exhibitors typically purchase higher quality market animals, higher quality feed & supplements, and a greater amount of veterinary supplies than normal production calls for, in an effort to be competitive in the show ring. Exhibitors also have a great amount of time invested in the care and training of their project animals. We hope buyers are willing to reward our student exhibitors for their hard work with auction prices that reflect a profit for the youth and encourage them to pursue education and involvement in agriculture in coming years.

BENEFITS TO YOU

When buying an animal, any amount above market price may be considered a charitable contribution to the IRCYLH program and a tax deduction. Buyers also receive high-quality pork or beef, as well as the knowledge they have encouraged a student exhibitor in his or her educational endeavors.

HARVEST & RETURN OF MEAT

As a buyer, you do not have to worry about arranging the harvesting, cutting, or wrapping.

IRCYLH will notify the buyer of the time and location of meat pick-up.

THE 100% CHARITY "RESALE"

As the buyer of the animal, you have the option to donate the auction animal back to IRCYLH to be resold.

The second time the animal is auctioned, 100% of the purchase amount goes toward offsetting the cost of the Show & Sale—a donation.

Your purchase goes directly to the exhibitor, the second buyer gets the meat, and your donation benefits all IRCYLH exhibitors.
