CASE STUDIES

Case study- 1

i. Livelihood Promotion for poor families

(Skill development & income generating activities)

IGA : Petty Shop

Beneficiary : Mrs. Jyothi

Village : Perumalapalli

Jyothi comes from a poor family background lives with her husband and 2 children in a low cost government house in Perumalapalli village. Jyothi is illiterate, and her husband works as a labourer loading and unloading mud in the villages. Jyothi has 2 children (a boy and girl), her son studied upto 10th class, unable to continue studies due to their family situation, he now goes to tractor driving for daily wage work, seasonally. Her 5 year old daughter is physically challenged and does not go to school. Jyothi cannot go for labour work as she takes care of her daughter at home. Her husband spends his



money on drinking alcohol and does not support the family economically.. The family does not have land and livestock asset.

SUCHI field staff was in the process of identifying deserving BPL families for the livelihood programme with support from SCINDeA . The village committee gave Jyothi's name for Livelihood programme support as Jyothi and her family were struggling financially. Jyothi decided to start a small shop with Rs. 7000 from SUCHI SCINDeA, and she mobilized Rs.3000/ to purchase items for the shop.

She takes care of her daughter at home and manages the petty shop business without any disturbance. Jyothi gets Rs.250 to 300 per day out of which she takes 100 for the family and with the remaining she purchases goods for shop.

She expresses her gratitude to SUCHI SCINDeA for the timely help to open the petty shop and earn with self dignity and to support her family .



Case study- 2

(Skill development & income generating activities)

IGA : Tailoring Machine

Beneficiary : Mrs. Varalakshmi

Village : Thimmereddy palli

Varalakshmi 35 years w/o. of Damodar has 2 children. Her husband is mentally disturbed with sugar issues and high BP and does not work. Her children study 9th class and 8th class in the village government school. Due to poor economic condition and her husband's health problems, it is a great challenge for Varalakshmi to bring up her two children without her husband's support.

Varalakshmi with no hope in life, started to go for agricultural seasonal labour work. Many days were spent without food in the family, she borrowed money from neighbours. In this situation, through government tailoring training scheme in the nearby village, she learned tailoring skill. She could not use her skills to get an income as she could not afford to buy a tailoring machine. During this period SUCHI staff identified as an IGA beneficiary through village unit support. She was given the IGA support of Rs. 7000/ by SUCHI-SCINDeA to set up tailoring unit. She mobilized Rs. 3000/ as her contribution and soon she started her own business in the village. Now she is taking care of her husband and children at home with her income. Varalakshmi expresses in her life that the day that she got the tailoring machine of her own was the happy day. She developed self confidence, her life style soon changed, routine in the family changed. Her income increased day by day. Now she earns an average of Rs.1400/week. She is confident that she will move forward. She expresses that she is grateful to SUCHI-SCINDeA.



Case study- 3

(skill development & income generating activities)

Skill Training : Four Wheeler Driving

Name : Prabu Prasad

Village : Vijayanagara colony ST.

Prabu Prasad is 22 years old, completed his +2 and lives with his parents. His father is the breadwinner of the family through his daily labour.

Due to poor family income Prabu Prasad was unable to continue higher education, hence stayed at home. As a young boy, Prabhu went into wrong company and never listened to parents.. Due to this, his mother went into depression and started psychiatric treatment.

The family lives in a small thatched hut with no regular income

Family struggled a lot even for a meal a day as the family has to spend a lot on the mother's treatment.

The family was very much in need of financial and moral support. But since Prabu Prasad was unskilled there was no guarantee in getting support except going to the high caste, land owners and money lenders for support.



It was at this time the SUCHI staff shared and explained about SUCHI-SCINDeA Skill training project.

The village committee taking into consideration the family situation and the situation of Prabu Prasad decide to give him the opportunity to undergo skill training in 4 wheeler driving.

The SUCHI staff regularly visited the family, discussed and motivated Prabu Prasad and encouraged him to enroll for the 4 wheeler driving.

The father / family decided to avail this skill training by providing him travel cost, food expenses and 2 wheeler license which came up to @Rs.3500/ as their contribution.

Prabu Prasad joined the training and the staff intensively made follow up visits and motivated him to continue the driving training. As a result, Prabu Prasad started to go for training regularly, gained confidence , learned the 4 wheeler driving skill. Learning the skill in driving changed him gradually. He became responsible and gave up the unwanted company with his peers. Seeing the change in Prabu Prasad and the family's struggle the local surpanch sanctioned a low cost housing scheme worth of Rs. 1,50,000/ Further this has encouraged him to take responsibility to build the house. The help and support of SUCHI-SCINDeA given to this young boy who was aimless in life, and a big burden to his parents and community turned him to become a responsible person and earn for his family.

Case study- 4

(Skill development & income generating activities)

Skill Training : Four Wheeler Driving

Name : Vinayakam

Village : Oddipalli - BC.

Vinayakam 27 years old, studied till Class 10, resides at Oddipalli BC village, Thavanampalli mandal, Chittoor District with his mother and his father is no more .

Her mother is the bread winner and goes for agricultural seasonal labor work in the village. Vinayakam goes as an acting tractor driver in the village for past 5 years without driving license, earning Rs. 300 per day. He got married 06 months before. His wife is a house wife, and they stay in a small, unfinished government house Financially he struggled, as he didn't have any lands or other assets.. He needed a permanent driving license to earn money and support his family but no there was no way to pay for driving license.



Sometimes he was forced to go far to labour in the agriculture field for their day to day necessities. This was a seasonal job and there was no steady or regular income. During this time, the SUCHI staff had a village unit meeting regarding the skill training programme for youth to develop their economic status. The Village unit member suggested his name for the skill training beneficiary for that village. The Programme Co-ordinator met him and motivated about the skill training and its value and he became one of the beneficiary for the driving training.

, As of today, he is qualified driver with a driving license and is working as a Tractor driver with a daily income of 400 Rs He expresses his sincere Thanks to SUCHI – SCINDeA organization for this opportunity and economic status.

Case study- 5

III. Rights based Child & Adolescent Development Life Skill Education - LSE

Name of student : Kiran

Parents : Chengalrayan and Baby

Kiran is 14 years old studying 9th in Government high school in his village E.Palakuru. Kiran has a younger sister studying 4th class in the elementary school in the village.

His parents are agriculture laborers with an average income of Rs. 6000/month but this is not regular because of seasonal labour.

The parents treated the boy with much concern and gave him all he wanted in spite of their poor family situation but Kiran started to misuse all the privileges given to him in the family and became a mischievous boy. He never listens to parents, teachers or elders in the village. His parents became very upset about him as it became very difficult for them to control him. He would not stay in the village/ house after school and parents used to fear about him.



SUCHI staff organized LSE group in the village and promoted Ganesh LSE group with 20 children; 10 boys and 10 girls. Kiran was one among the group members.

As part of SUCHI-SCINDeA LSE Module, the group was educated on “Relationship”. The module was introduced to them with practical incidents that happen in the villages among young children like, cutting classes, going for movies, indulging in bad habits etc. This brought about changes in Kiran’s behaviour and his parents also started to appreciate this change. Gradually Kiran became very attentive in the classes, teachers started to tell positive things about him. This further changed him a lot.

Kiran now attends classes regularly, completes home work and also helps his sister in her studies. He also listens to parents and helps them in house hold works.

His parents are very happy and they share in the village and parents meeting about the change in Kiran and express their thanks to SUCHI-SCINDeA for such a meaningful programme.

Case study- 6

IV. Health & Sanitation

Toilet Construction

Name of the Beneficiary : Umadevi w/o Govarthan

Village : Oddipalli BC

Umadevi lives in Oddipalli BC village with her family members –Husband, mother-law and 3 children (2boys, 1 girl) the eldest 10 year old boy is a differently abled child in the family and requires a person to stay with him all the time; Umadevi decided to stay with him.

The father is the only earning member who works in the quarry. In spite of his hard work in quarry the money he earns is very insufficient for the family as they spend a lot for the eldest son.



Need for toilet was one of the basic need for the family. Though the Government sanctioned few toilets in this village Umadevi's family could not get one because she joined the SHG much later and her name was not in the earlier list. Therefore, the village committee selected Umadevi's family for constructing toilet with the support of SUCHI-SCINDeA.

The family completed the toilet construction by adding Rs. 6000/ (expanding the toilet size as per the need for the family especially for their disabled son with enough space for bathing. Since this has been a much needed requirement for the family and SUCHI-SCINDeA made this happen, they express their deep gratitude to the SUCHI team.

Case study- 7
Construction of Toilet

Name of the Beneficiary : **Lakshamma/o Krishnaiah**

Village : **Mallakunta-SC**

Mrs. Lakshamma 65 years old w/o. late Krishnaiah, belongs to Mallakunta SC village at Thavanampalli Mandal. This village is located beside a hill and river and is a very remote village. From Mandal head quarters to this village, is 30 kilometers. The people



are not aware of Health and sanitation. They use the nearby hills top and river as an open toilet. Lakshamma has only one son who is married and has 2 children. Lakshamma's daughter in law due to family problems left her husband and children and stays with her parents, hence he became addicted to alcohol with psychological depression. In this situation Lakshamma has to take responsibility of the grandchildren. Without toilet facility she faced lot of problems taking care of herself and the grand children to take them to open field daily.

During this period, SUCHI programme coordinator organized meetings in the village and explained about the importance of toilets for every family. SUCHI formed a village unit and further discussed about the importance of toilets for each and every family and motivated 15 beneficiaries for the construction of toilets.

Lakshamma started to construct the toilet at her home very happily. Her family members digged the ground for pit, formed basement foundation, hired mason for three days, purchased closing rock slab for the pit, provided food for the mason while construction was ongoing. Approximately she contributed nearly Rs.3000 .towards the toilet construction for her family. After the construction of the toilet she feels safe and is mentally free from the fear of using open fields. Lakshamma and her family members were much benefitted and expressed thanks to SUCHI – SCINDeA for this big support to their family.



Location of the village : Pattrapalli -AAW, Yadamari Mandal

My name is Chamundeswari studying 9 th class in Government high school at, kasirala . My parents are illiterates and they are agriculture labourers. My brother is studying 7 th class and my sister is studying 6 th class in government school, pachappur village. We 3 of us go by walk daily to school 2 to 5 kms. Though my parents are interested in our studies they are unable to extend their support as they are not studied and also the present day education we are unable to cope up due to our family background.



The family situation and due to lack of motivation I am not going to school regularly and not doing home work properly. I was engaged in domestic work and watching TV at home. In this situation SUCHI – INDIENHILFE organized tuition centre in our village . In our tuition



center 47 students are enrolled, our village volunteer volunteer's motivation and guidance helped me to attend the evening tuition regularly . I started to have interest in my studies .started reading , studying and doing home work in the tuition centre . I am going to school regularly . The tuton centre volunteer is very supportive and encourages all the children in our village. I am happy and confident in my studies. my classmates are very friendly. I am thankful to SUCHI – INDIENHILFE .

Location of the village : Nallappareddy palli - SC, Thavanampalli Mandal

My name is N.USHA , D/o. nagarathinam, mother name is sowdha , sister name manasa. I am studying 7 th class in Government Girls High school, Aragonda. Before conducting the SUCHI- INDIENHILFE Evening tuition center in our village , I used to go to school and help my mother in house maintenance and cooking in the evening time. 3 kms distance is my school. Every I travel with my village friends to attend school.



At my home I don't have facilities to study due to this reason I was not interested in my studies and my parents also never encouraged me in my studies therefore I was not very keen in my studies. My routine work was going to school with friends, doing domestic work and playing with friends without any idea.

SUCHI- INDIENHILFE started the evening tuition center at our village with a volunteer, I joined in this programme . 32 children enrolled in the tuition center in our village. After coming from the school, I wash my face and get ready to attend the tuition center with interestingly. Every day in the tuition center we are playing games, doing prayer, doing home work, reading , doubts clarification, participating in the co-curricular activities.

Through this tuition center I got confidence , interest in education, I participate in the cocurricular activities, developed discipline , communication well with every one , learnt moral education and good interpersonal relationship with my friends. My parents, school teachers and friends appreciated seeing change in my attitude , behaviour and character. Now I am very much happy and interest in my life. Myself and friends are economically poor to go tuition and pay money outside, through SUCHI organization this facility and opportunity gave good direction in our lives.. My sincere thanks to SUCHI- INDIENHILFE for providing this good opportunity to us.

Location of the village : Venkatapuram-SC, Puthalapattu Mandal

Manojkumar is a 13 year old boy living with his parents and older sister. Both his father and mother are not studied. Manojkumar's father is a daily wage worker in the Municipality. Mother goes for agriculture labour whenever it is available in her village.



Manojkumar is studying 8th class in the high school which is in 10 km distance from his village. He goes to school along with his friends by public bus by using free Government bus pass.

Manojkumar due to his family condition was very reluctant in his studies never valued his studies. Often likes to play and watch Television. Did not like to go to school. Used to get bad remark from his teachers as he never spent time in completing his school assignment nor read his daily lessons after school. Parent's could not guide him or correct him as they were illiterates.

Not only Manojkumar but as many as 25 such children in this village were with similar situation. Because of this SUCHI – Indienhilfe implemented tuition programme in this village. Manojkumar though did not like in the beginning to attend the evening tuition programme in their village later he became very interested in attending the evening tuition.

Now he is participates actively in his academic and co curricular activities. Goes to school regularly. he is up to date in completing his school assignment and gets appreciation from his school teachers. Parents are happy and Manojkumar is happy and encourages all other children also. He thanks SUCHI-INDEINHILFE for this support.

Location of the village : Chinabandapalli - SC, Puthalapattu Mandal

Prakash is a 14 year old boy living with his parents along with his older brother who is attending his graduate school. He is 2nd son in his family. His parents have studied up 8th class and they are agriculture labourers. The family is living in their own house built with Government low cost Schemes

Prakash is Studying in 9th class in a high school located in 2km distance from his village. Prakash goes to school every day by walk. While doing so he has to cross a railway track, state high way and national high way .His parents are agricultural labourers.

Prakash used to be very dull, never showed interest in his studies and he used to be a back bench students. Always used to get scolding from his teachers because he never used to complete his school work assignment. He used to spend his evening time in watching Television Prakash never used to mingle with his age group, shy and timid.

It was after he started to attend the evening tuition centre things started to change with Prakash. When the evening Tuition started in his village with SUCHI –Indienhilfe support .There are 35 children attending the evening tuition in his village. In the beginning his village volunteer visited his house to enroll Prakash to the evening tuition later his parents also encouraged him to go to the tuition along with his friends. There he was encouraged in a positive way and made to be with his peer group and with his class mates. Through group work he was able to complete his daily school assignment this has made him to get appreciation from teachers and gradually he found that he improved interest in studies.

Now Prakash is very active, shows interest in studies, completes his school assignment and his teachers give good remark about him to his parents. Parents are very happy. Prakash talks with his friends, participates in group studies and active. Prakash and his parents are very happy and thank SUCHI – Indienhilfe for change in Prakash.



Project : CBCD 01

Location of the village : B. Ramapuram – SC, Puthalapattu Mandal

Sowmiya is 12 years old girl living with her grandparents (mother's parents) in Ramapuram village. Sowmiya mother not married therefore Sowmiya was made to be with her grandparents and her mother works in as helper in cooking at a small hotel in Thirpuathi - a town in 60 km distance to Ramapuram village. Sowmiya studies in class 7th in a high school located 5 km distance. This village has no bus facility therefore Sowmiya goes to school along with other children by a private auto rickshaw. Her mother visits Sowmiya once in 15 days, supports Sowmiya and her parents (Sowmiya's grand parents).

Sowmiya grew up with no support for her studies. She wanted to get coaching in her studies but it was not possible for her as she is living in a village, her grandparents are illiterate. With much difficulty Sowmiya was

struggling in her studies. Could not go to others house to seek help from her class mates. It was at this juncture in her village SUCHI- Indienhilfe started the evening tuition in her village for school going children. This was a great opportunity for Sowmiya to get support, motivation to study in group with her class mates.

She found the evening tuition very interesting and useful to freely discuss and learn from her classmates. Apart from studies the evening coaching programme has given her opportunity to become capable of participating in co curricular activities. She also won prizes in the school in speech competition. The evening tuition volunteer friendly approach and motivation encouraged her a lot to actively participate in her studies and as well in co curricular activities. In her village every Saturday as part of evening tuition they have co curricular activities. By this children are very happy to attend the



Sowmiya is very happy and she says that she gained confidence in herself, in studies and in co-curricular activities. Being a single girl in her family with no support from mother for her studies or in her development she feels the evening tuition has contributed a lot to establish good and healthy relationship with her peer group, got a good volunteer who is friendly in running facilitating the children through evening coaching. Sowmiya expresses her gratitude to SUCHI-Indienhilfe for this great support through evening coaching.
