1. Community Based Child Development

Focus of this Project:

Child Development through parents and community Participation

Area Covered	:	75 Villages in 3 Mandals.
Children Reached	:	2736
Families Reached	:	6185
Parents Involved	:	21889

Outcome:

Children:

- ✓ In all 75 villages the school going children are engaged constructively after the school hours through time to play and evening tuition.
- ✓ School going children unlike earlier don't spend their evening hours in watching T.V. serial or indulge in wicked actions with friends.
- ✓ Children with much interest focus on academic and co curricular activities and have shown improvement in their performance in academic and co curricular aspects.
- ✓ Children improved in personal grooming, healthy relationship among the peer group, discipline in going to school, evening tuition and helping parents at home.

Parents:

Parents of all school going children / evening tuition, participate collectively in parents meeting organized in their respective villages once in 2 months / 3 months depending upon their decision.

- ✓ Parents actively participate in and contribute their valuable suggestion in the development of their children.
- ✓ Parents take responsibility to ensure regular attendance of their children to school as well to the evening tuition especially girl children.



- ✓ Parents periodically visit school as well the evening tuition to enquire their children performance.

Village:

- ✓ All 75 villages' collectively take responsibility to run the Evening tuition in their village by allotting a village volunteers to facilitate the evening tuition.
- ✓ Villagers ensure safe of their children and a clean environment to run the evening tuition.
- ✓ Villagers maintain conducive atmosphere in the evening without loud noise like T.V, gossip or quarrel.

- Improved intake of vegetables, minimised expenditure for family maintenance, clean environment with 20 Landless labourers through Family Farming in SUCHI-SCINDeA Project villages.
- Children gained knowledge on Health and personal hygiene, Savings, save water, Environment, kitchen garden, Child help line, gender equality.
- Community introduced to various resources within and outside the Government

3. Mothers in Small Rural Business towards Income generation

Through this project 100 Deserving mothers encouraged in small rural business like petty shop, Tiffin stall, goat rearing, cow rearing, tailoring etc.

All 100 mothers are involved in business and earn an average additional income of Rs 500 to 1500/week.

Out of the 100 mothers 74 have availed 2nd time loan to expand and upgrade their business towards sustainability of their business and 12 of them opted to continue the same and 14 are still on the first loan business.

All 100 mothers acquired skills and gained capacity to manage their business.

- Mothers are aware of selecting the appropriate small business, tips to manage the business and ways to sustain the business for their economic development.

4. Rural women and Youth Development:

Focus :

Women development and Carrier guidance to Youth.

No of women Involved : 75 women

No of Youth participated : 150 youth

No of women availed Govt scheme : 20 women

Through this project the most deserving women in the villages were provided with opportunity to acquire skill in tailoring, youth gain information on carrier development for their future.

During this reporting period 20 Rural Young women underwent skill training in tailoring out of this:

20 Rural Young women set up their own tailoring unit

20 Rural women have availed Government schemes worth of Rs. 10000/per women , set up their own shop to undertake dress making and earn Rs.1500/week.

One deserving rural girl assisted to join nursing.

75 Youth boys and 75 young women had underwent carrier guidance to avail Govt schemes for their

Project Evaluation :

During this reporting period Evaluation of projects had been carried out for the 3 ongoing projects as agreed in the project plan and agreement at the time of sanctioning the project following specific method of the donor agency towards the end of the project period.

Project (1) - Empowering communities through sustainable development supported by SCINDeA. An external team of 3 members visited villages had discussions with beneficiaries, discussion at a cluster meeting inviting more beneficiaries for interaction to do the project assessment.

Project (2)- Community Based Child development supported by Indienhilfe. Field officer / assigned field assistant visited the villages interacted with the villagers, families. Interaction with village volunteers/ Representatives.

Project (3) - Mothers in small Business for Income generation supported by Micro Credit for Mothers. Filled Pre Assessment Questionnaire submitted prior to the Assessment with finance and project monitory reports submitted. Online video conferencing with team.

Follow up project proposal has been submitted to all the above 3 donor agencies which was accepted for further support.
