# 1. God's Perspective: Where Justice and Mercy Met

- God's justice demanded punishment, and His love provided the sacrifice.
- Romans 3:25-26 God is both just and the one who justifies.
- At the Cross, God's holiness and mercy collided.
- The sacrificial system ended with Jesus' once-for-all offering (Hebrews 7:27).
- Application: The Cross shows how seriously God takes sin-and how deeply He loves sinners.

## 2. Christ's Perspective: Obedience and Substitution

- Jesus willingly became our substitute (2 Corinthians 5:21).
- He didn't become a sinner-but became sin for us.
- The Great Exchange: He took our sin and gave us His righteousness.
- Application: The Cross is not just a story-it's a personal invitation to receive grace.

## 3. Satan's Perspective: Defeat Disguised as Victory

- Satan thought he had won-but was ultimately defeated (Colossians 2:15).
- The Cross disarmed Satan and destroyed the fear of death (Hebrews 2:14-15).
- Application: You fight from victory-not for it. Satan's accusations hold no power over you.

#### 4. The Church's Perspective: Message and Mission

- The Cross is our central message (Galatians 6:14).
- It defines our mission: to be ambassadors of reconciliation (2 Corinthians 5:18-21).
- Application: Are we living cross-shaped lives? Proclaiming Christ crucified in word and action?

#### 5. The Believer's Perspective: Redemption and New Identity

- Galatians 2:20 We are crucified with Christ.
- Romans 6:6 We are no longer slaves to sin.
- 2 Corinthians 5:17 We are new creations.
- Application: Stop living in chains Jesus already broke. Walk in freedom and purpose.
