Invasive species cost Americans \$137 billion annually to prevent, mitigate, or maintain infested areas. Populations in the Finger Lakes affect our environment, are a hazard to human health, and tax

our communities and our economy. Invasive species such as the water chestnut are exceptionally hardy and have traits that give them a competitive edge over their native counterparts. This presentation will discuss the biology of successful invaders, regulations to prevent invasive species from spreading, and how the Finger Lakes Partnership for Regional Invasive Species Management leverages collaborations and resources to #stoptheinvasion of invasive species in our region.

Hilary Mosher is the Coordinator for the Finger Lakes-Partnership for Regional Invasive Species Management (FLPRISM). She is committed to working with local, state, regional, and federal agencies, NGOs, private enterprise, academic institutions, citizens, and others to manage invasive species efforts on behalf of the 17 counties of the Finger Lakes region.

Her service to the broader community includes environmental education to non-profit corporations, citizen groups, and school groups covering a variety of topics from aquatic ecology to education for sustainability.
