We had a busy evening and school day May 10 and 11 at Science Exploration Days. The event is sponsored by the Central Western Section of the STANYS. and is hosted by St John Fisher College. RAS made a good showing in the exhibit hall with Astronomy, Fossil, Mineral, and Life Sciences Sections' display tables lining one wall of the Student Life Center's gym. Families visited in the evening and the school program was packed with 1600 junior and senior high students and their teachers.

Visitors tasted wild plant salads picked and mixed by Karen Wolf

of Life Sciences. Budding botanists learned about plants with the help of her colleagues Larry Hirsch, Liz Pixley, and Pat O'Neill.

The sky was clear during the school day, so Frank Bov of the Astronomy Section, took advantage of the opportunity and awed the students with telescopic views of the sun's surface as seen through a hydrogen-alpha filter.



In the exhibit hall, Dave Bishop and Mike Oppenheimer showed off another telescope and offered NASA pictures. Dave Bishop also gave a presentation about the starry sky during the school program.

The Mineral Section table was a flurry of activity as students

examined attractive minerals and useful ores, peered into a fluorescent mineral display box, and chose a take-away mineral.
