Who Measured the Solar System, by Michael Richmond

We know now that the solar system is a very large place, thanks to our robot explorers and space telescopes. But even back in the days of plumb lines and shadow sticks, a few people managed to figure out the distance to the Moon and Sun. How did they do it? After telescopes were invented, and measurements grew more precise, improved astronomers their estimates of the distances to the planets. However, they lacked one crucial bit of information. explain what that was, and how it led to scientific expeditions around the world. You will learn how to repeat one of the crucial experiments this coming June.

About Our Speaker

Michael Richmond is a Professor of Physics at the Rochester Institute of Technology. Before coming to (cloudy) upstate New York in 1997, he spent time searching for supernovae and building robotic telescopes in Berkeley as well as helping create the Sloan Digital Sky Survey at Princeton University. He has enjoyed monitoring SN 2011fe this winter the RIT at Observatory.
