2010 Fall Paper Session

The annual RAS Fall Paper session on Saturday November 6 was hosted by the College of Science at Rochester Institute of Technology, and held at the Center for Integrated Manufacturing Studies building at the RIT campus. Dr. Harvey Pough, of the Department of Biological Sciences, assisted by RIT students, orchestrated a highly successful event attended by well over 200 people.

The eighty-six posters, presented in two sessions, provided students and others an opportunity to showcase their research studies. The forty oral papers consisted of two rounds of three concurrent sessions. The student monitors did an excellent job of introducing and keeping each speaker on time. The topics of the talks were diverse, including such broad areas as ecology, science education, sociology, political science, geography, physics, chemistry, astronomy,

genetics, climatology, cell biology, and others. Some talks covered traditional areas of study while others were about cutting edge topics such as thin film deposition and photovoltaics.

A luncheon and the annual Larry King Memorial Lecture followed the morning of posters and talks. Dr. Paula M. Mikkelsen, Associate Director for Science at the Paleontological Research Institution in Ithaca, gave everyone something to think about with her talk, Under Siege -Marine Life versus the Oil Spill in the Gulf of Mexico. She explained how the surfactants used to disperse the petroleum from the leaking well, and their having been deployed at depth for the first time, are having unknown effects on the marine ecology of the Gulf.
