Monroe Community College hosted the annual RAS Fall Paper session on Saturday, October 29th. Dan Robertson, chairman of the Chemistry and Geosciences Department, was ably assisted by a group of faculty, staff, and students from the departments of Chemistry and Geosciences. Biology, Engineering Science and Physics, Campus Events, Sodexo Food Service. A luncheon and the annual Larry King Memorial Lecture followed the morning of posters and talks. Dr. Beata Csatho of the Department of Geology, University at Buffalo, presented *Disappearing Ice! Mass Loss and Dynamics of the Greenland Ice Sheet.* She described the changes taking place in the Greenland Ice sheet based on her research that encompasses data collected on the ground and with satellite technology.
