Great Lakes Thematic Collection Network NSF Grant Proposal – A Great Opportunity for RAS

The RAS Herbarium will become part of an ambitious NSF funded project beginning in 2014, if a recently submitted grant proposal is approved. The project, spearheaded by Dr. Christopher Dick, Associate Professor, Dept. of Ecology and Evolutionary Biology at the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor, proposes a Thematics Collection Network of collaborators to create a database with images of vascular plants in the Great Lakes region. Relevant collections from regional herbaria will become unified for browsing and mapping purposes while a web portal eases access for students, researchers, resource managers and naturalists.

The "Broader Impacts" section of the proposal suggests the web portal "will ultimately transform the way many people identify plants because date, location, and simple features like flower color will permit browsing of species information and images with mobile applications." Another positive impact is expected by the Network's plan "to identify and recruit talented students from underrepresented groups to participate in herbarium internships, attend professional meetings, and develop independent projects." And, for organizations like the RAS, the Network's plan to "host workshops and social networking for small herbaria to address their specific infrastructure and educational needs" will be welcome.

Information about the RAS herbarium specimens from western New York will be entered in a computer database and the taxonomic name of the plant updated as necessary. Each specimen will be imaged with high-resolution digital photography. We will be sending our specimens to Cornell University for database entry and imaging. Researchers there, as well as at the University of Minnesota, University of Wisconsin, the NY Botanical Garden, among others, are collaborators on this proposed project.

Previous to the invitation to join in the NSF grant proposal, the RAS was already interested in digitizing information for our herbarium specimens. More than 2000 specimens of sedges in the genus *Carex* have been digitally databased by Steven Daniel. But digitizing on a larger scale, as

proposed by the grant, is too big a project for us to take on, hence the decision to rely on Cornell's facilities. We will be a subcontractor of Cornell University and Steve Daniel and I will serve as the principal personnel for the project.

Our work in Rochester on this project is still ambitious. We will need to separate out plant specimens collected in western New York and file them in separate folders. Since we have about 60,000 vascular plant specimens in the RAS Herbarium, this will not be a small job! We will be asking for a small army of volunteers (no specific plant knowledge required) to help us for the next four years should this grant proposal be accepted. We hope you will join the work parties!
