LARRY KING MEMORIAL LECTURE

Disappearing Ice: Mass Loss and Dynamics of the Greenland Ice sheet by Beata Csatho

The Greenland Ice Sheet is at the center of attention for scientists and the mainstream media alike. Despite its potential to contribute dramatically to sea level rise in response to ongoing and projected change, resulting climate significant socio-economic impacts in the US and around the globe, the future behavior of the Greenland Ice Sheet remains largely uncertain. This uncertainty stems from our incomplete knowledge of pattern and timescales of the ice sheet's response to climate change. The retreat of outlet glaciers fringing the ice sheet has been observed and documented since the 1800s. However, satellite and airborne measurements, offering the first opportunity to characterize the mass loss and changes in ice dynamics of the whole ice sheet, only started a few decades ago. This lecture will present detailed record of ice sheet mass loss obtained from satellite altimetry and examine its pattern and significance compared to the long-term evolution of the ice sheet. Predictions of the future of the Greenland Ice Sheet advances in its remote sensing monitoring will conclude lecture.

ABOUT OUR SPEAKER

Dr. Beata Csatho is an Associate Professor in the Department of Geology at the University at Buffalo. Her research interest spans a large number disciplines, including geophysics, paleoclimate, remote sensing, photogrammetry, geodesy, spatial statistics, geographic information visualization, digital system, image processing, pattern recognition, and data fusion. She has served as a Science Team Member of NASA's ICES at and IceBridge missions and she is currently the Science Definition Team Leader of NASA's ICESat-2 satellite mission. Her research aims improving at understanding of ongoing changes cryospheric and developing better approaches for predicting the future of the polar ice sheets and their contributions to sea level rise. She has participated in over 10 field expeditions to Greenland, Alaska, and Antarctica.
