The Alberta Association of Harness Dog Sports was formally created in January 2022.

Since then the small but mighty board has accomplished a number of pivotal tasks in formalizing an association and regional organization for the province of Alberta.

## 2022

- Created AAHDS Logos
- Launched AAHDS Social Media
- Created and Launched AAHDS Website
- Created the Official Documents Listed
  - o Bylaws of the Alberta Association of Harness Dogs Sports
  - Code of Conduct for the Board of Directors of the Alberta Association of Harness Dog Sports
  - Code of Conduct, Ethics and Animal Welfare of the Alberta Association of Harness Dog Sports
  - Rules and Requirements for Participants
  - Rules and Requirements for Organizers
  - Rules and Requirements for Officials
  - Sanctioning Applications for both Dryland and On Snow Events
- Submitted and got approval to act at the Regional organization for the province of Alberta, operating under the umbrella of the Canadian Association of Harness Dog Sports (CAHDS)
  - This provides Alberta a board position on the CAHDS Board of Directors
  - Our Alberta Member of the Board of Directors to CAHDS is the Current CAHDS President
  - Additionally, this provides Alberta a Class A membership to CAHDS, with voting rights at the CAHDS AGM, and Alberta was present for the 2022, and 2023 CAHDS AGMs

- Launched a membership program to help provide benefits for Alberta Based Harness Dog Sports participants
- Secured Board of Directors and Small Event Insurance for Dryland and On Snow Events
- Secured a timing app 'Webscorer' for Sanctioned Event hosts
- Hosted the Members Speaker Series with special guests Karen Sargent

## 2023

- Partnered with Erich and Cathrine Touche to host our first officially sanctioned even,t the Running Dogs and Riverbend On Snow Event in Feb 2023. This event was well attended, received a lot of positive feedback, and served as a learning tool to improve the sanctioning process for future AAHDS Events
- Partnered with Mush for Fun to offer the first AAHDS sanctioned Dryland event, which also served as a Golden Ticket event for CAHDS Dryland Nationals in 2024.
- Renewed BOD and Event Insurance for 2023/2024 Event Season
