My goal is for you to walk away with your dream eyebrows, I have an understanding that as people we all have a different taste or preference in the way we like to do our makeup.

I want to create the eyebrows you were dreaming of, whether that be with my guidance as to what style will suit your face shape and bone structure, or you may have an idea in your head of how you would love them to look, you may wish for me to make them similar to how you draw them on. Whatever it is I will personalise a shape and style for you.

Some people suit very thick and fluffy eyebrows and this is their desired look, others would like their eyebrows to be super subtle and remain quite thin. I have been trained to achieve both of these looks which is evident in my portfolio of beautiful clients with varying shapes, thickness, and colour to their brows.

Many people have told me they would love microblading but are worried about walking away with very thick eyebrows compared to what they had before, for these clients I work with the existing hair to touch up the patchy areas without it being obvious the client has even had microblading done.

Professionalism & Infection Control

I carry a license issued by Surrey Heath Borough Council to perform microblading which is a legal requirement in the UK, I am also fully insured to practice and have received training from a leading semipermanent makeup academy in the UK - Blades Brow Academy, Birmingham.

I am a qualified midwife of over 4 years and therefore have an enhanced understanding of the importance of infection control, my premises is meticulously cleaned and disinfected between every client, the microblades used are sterile and single use to ensure there is no risk of cross contamination. Having a background in a medical setting should provide further reassurance as to my trustworthy, caring and professional nature, my aim is to keep you safe and make you feel fantastic about yourself.

What is Microblading?

Microblading is an aesthetic procedure undertaken to enhance the appearance of the face by targeting areas of the eyebrow that have been over plucked or where hair is naturally sparse. The procedure involves the use of a nanoblade to deposit pigment just beneath the epidermal layer of the skin, this is much closer to the surface of the skin than standard tattooing, therefore microblading is classed as a semipermanent makeup technique.

The Role of the Skin

There are 4 different skin types; normal, dry, combination and oily. The type of skin you have will affect the longevity of semi-permanent makeup. Oily skin types have larger pores and therefore will hold pigment for a shorter amount of time, oily skin types or those with very fair coloured hair requiring the use of lighter pigments will find that microblading can be unsuccessful and sometimes a 3rd top up will be required in these cases. People with enlarged pores and very oily skin are often better suited to a technique called 'powder brows' or combo brows if microblading is found to have not lasted long enough.

The Procedure

You will be required to undertake a patch test a minimum of 48 hours prior to treatment to reduce the risk of allergic reaction, however, allergic reaction although rare can still occur despite a normal patch test.

When you arrive for your treatment, photos are taken with your consent. Your eyebrows will then be mapped and your desired shape drawn as an outline with a black pencil to guide the overall look of the procedure. A numbing cream will be applied if desired, this will stay on for between 30-40 minutes, after which it will be removed and I will begin microblading natural looking hair strokes, this usually takes 2-3 passes per eyebrow. Once the hair strokes are complete, excess pigment will be removed with a special tattoo soap, and you will be shown your eyebrows to check you are happy, and once complete we will then take some after photos to compare.
