We are open daily for congregate lunch at the Fritz Hendrix Memorial Building Monday – Thursday 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and on Fridays, we serve brunch from 9:30 a.m. – 11:00 a.m. The Gracemont Congregate is located at the Assembly of God dining hall in Gracemont, OK. They are open Monday – Thursday 11:00 a.m. to 1 p.m. We encourage our Elders to come by and pick up a menu and/or check it out on our Caddo Nation AoA FB page.

Menu: Our menu items are selected by suggestions from our current participants at both Congregates and our deliveries. Suggestions are taken throughout the month and the menu is ready by the last Monday prior to the

1st of the month. Each day is planned according to the food pyramid for elderly adults and liberalized diets for the general elder population. (Condiments are available and some are high in sodium and contain sugar.) We will be continuing with comfort foods to keep everyone nice and full for the remaining winter months.

Our meals are made “from scratch” and this takes a lot of time and preparation, but we believe the outcome is worth it; I applaud my staff for getting the meals out in a timely manner. The compliments I receive on the taste and appearance speak for themselves. We try new menu suggestions as well as toss in some good comfort foods.

Funding: Our program continues to operate off of grants awarded through ACL; our FY 2025 began today April 1, 2025. ACL grants are Title VI – Part A, Title VI – Part C, NSIP and MIPPA. The Gracemont Congregate is no longer available due to funding cuts from the State of Oklahoma.

AARP SCSEP: Caddo Nation of Oklahoma had partnered with AARP to become a host agency who will train low income or unemployed elders, 55 and older, new skills that will assist them with making their way back in to the work setting through a training program. We here at AoA will assist elders in filling out the application for SCSEP and they can work here at the Caddo Nation of Oklahoma, if there are any available positions. In the occurrence that there is not any available positions, we can assist with trying to find placemen in other host agencies in the area. Please apply if interested, they are part time positions at minimum wage

You may sign any of these items out if needed. *Currently out of coccyx cushions, wheelchair cushions and bariatric supplies: wheelchairs & walkers. Must be in AoA service area.
RESPIRE PROGRAM/ ELDERCARE CHORES	No respite care members right now. No referrals for elder care have been written. These programs provide the opportunity to plan, develop, and implement family caregiver support programs for the benefit of non-paid family members (not living in the home) caring for their elders and grandparents caring for their grandchildren. Must be in AoA service area.
LAWN CARE	We are still working on a plan to assist our elders with lawncare.
WELLNESS CHECK	We have made 14 wellness checks, provided supplies for 14 of those participants, 2 transports for people this quarter; currently we are monitoring 1 elder in long term care facilities as well as monitored one elder for Social Services during our delivery to them. Our program continues to work with the CHR and Social Services program on various tasks. If we receive a call regarding an elder, then our team goes out and assesses them as needed and refers them to the appropriate people.
GENERAL ELDER ASSISTANCE	We have aided 8 participants this quarter with lending closet items and have given away PPE to 6 participants. I have aided 13 elders in completing paperwork/applications and have assisted 6 with. Elders come in to the office for this type of assistance;
EXPENSES	The expenses made were general monthly bills and employee wages.
GENERAL NOTES	The caregiver support program includes the Lawn Care/Chores Program, Respite Program, Lending Closet and Health Program. Please call the AoA Building for further information on any of our programs. * We work closely with the CHR Program, Social Services and Tribal Nursing to meet the needs of all our Participants.

The Caddo Nation's Community Health Program is funded by Indian Health Services on a yearly basis to assist Caddo Tribal Members with their health needs. The CHR Program's purpose is to assist eligible Native American individuals and families within our service area to gain access to comprehensive health care services.

All CHR staff members are trained in CPR, First Aid and EMS First Responder.

The CHR Program is often a vital link to health care services for our Native people in rural areas. Our work includes making and rescheduling appointments for clients, pick and delivery of medications, home visits, case screening and management, monitoring patients and health education.

The Caddo Nation Special Diabetes Program assists all Diabetic Tribal members with diabetic assistance. We have a Podiatry Clinic twice (2) a month. We provide diabetic (wellness shoes) once per year. We also provide diabetic supplies, medical assistance.

Caddo Nation Education Programs

The Higher Education Program provides scholarships to qualifying tribal member college students. Scholarship amounts vary according to unmet need (as determined by the Federal Student Aid Program), and range between \$500.00 and \$3,000.00 per term. Scholarships are funded on a first come, first served basis for **completed** applications.

The Education Programs fiscal year begins on January 1st of each year. In the Higher Education Program, for CY 2026, we have had:

The Caddo Nation Adult Education Program provides assistance to qualifying tribal members who are seeking short-term training (one year or less), literacy instruction, cultural enrichment, or basic skills. The amounts of assistance vary according to the costs associated with the type of training/courses that the applicant will be taking. The maximum amount of funding for the training/course(s) is \$4,500.00 per academic year (Aug. 01 through July 31). Applications are funded on a first come, first served basis for **completed** applications. Eligible tribal members must reside within the jurisdiction of the Anadarko Agency (Caddo, Kiowa, Comanche, Cotton, or Tillman Counties in the state of Oklahoma). The numbers of applicants for the Adult Ed. Program tends to be very low because of the jurisdictional boundaries, which is not negotiable in our contract.

The Caddo Nation Job Placement & Training Program provides Job Placement (Direct Employment Assistance) and Job Training (Adult Vocational Training) to interested, and eligible enrolled Caddo Nation members. It provides vocational training assistance and/or assistance for starting new employment. The JP&T Program provides short-term and long-term training assistance, and/or other forms of assistance that would enable participants to train, retrain, and upgrade underemployed and unemployed workers in skill areas for which there is a demand in the labor market. The JP&T Program provides bi-weekly stipends for AVT students to assist with household expenses while in training. The amounts of assistance vary according to number of dependents and need.

Applications are funded on a first come, first served basis for **completed** applications (all requested documentation has been turned in, faxes/copies are not accepted). Eligible tribal members must reside within the jurisdiction of the Anadarko Agency (Caddo, Kiowa, Comanche, Cotton, or Tillman Counties in the state of Oklahoma). The numbers of applicants for the JP&T Program tends to be very low because of the jurisdictional boundaries, which is not negotiable in our contract.

Re: Activities of the Emergency Management

January:

The Emergency Management staff and relocated back from multiple office locations into open office space within the EPA facility and re-established an Emergency Operations Center.

Met with representatives from American Red Cross who conducted an inspection of the Cultural Building and approved as a Warming Station and Temporary shelter, an agreement was signed with their organization and will provide personnel and material needs upon incidents and disasters. Recognized as the Norther Caddo Co site.

February:

Staff attended the 2026 Annual Oklahoma Emergency Management Association annual conference and training days at OKANA Resort.

Attended the annual pipeline safety training conducted in Caddo county, met with many representatives from companies and were provided information of location, type of product in lines and emergency contact information.

Staff members assisted with request for personnel assistance in EOC's in SW Ok at major wildland fire and weather incidents.

March:

Staff attended the Directors meeting and received the personnel and policy manual update. Was advised of the new pay system transfer from Paycom to UKG. Staff from Emergency Management discussed the recent evaluation for safety and preparedness. Each were provided with a Severe Weather Safety and Evacuation procedures and the exercise testing of the Outdoor Warning device (siren), the internal paging conference capability of the phone system and established regroup mass notification message for all facilities not at tribal complex. Exercise and testing is conducted on Monday mornings at 10:30 am.

Staff continues to attend the Intertribal Emergency Management monthly meetings held in McLoud, Oklahoma. We are involved in discussion with other Oklahoma Tribes on the matters that are concern to the Culture, History, Sacred items of Indian country. We also discuss creating alliance and leveraging to get Federal and State legislators to pay attention to the needs of tribes and especially when impacted by disaster.

Their annual conference will be held at River Spirit in Tulsa, Jun 30, Jul1 & 2.

April:

Staff has been dedicated to the maintenance of vehicles and equipment and preparedness as severe weather season moves into the high point season.

Emergency Management Director (Polly Edwards) attended the Self Governance Conference in Arizona. Help provide guidance on re-alignment needs, but also ways that can continue to research funding to aid and enhance the EM program.

Staff has received information that President Trump has funded the Building Resilience Infrastructure grant program. Tribal funding was \$55 million, with grant not to exceed \$2 million individually. Staff is currently looking at 4 project areas and supporting documentation collection requested by the grant application. The E.M. will be submitting a request for funding.

Staff has also spent a lot of time during and after hours monitoring NWS Norman weather, NWS Chat, Radar and storm tracks, ready to issue any safety precautions prior to impacts and threat of life safety.

Since its establishment, the Caddo Nation Environmental Protection (CNEP) program has secured several grants through the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), including the General Assistance Program (GAP), Clean Water Act Section 106 (CWA), and Clean Air Act Section 103 (CAA). Additionally, CNEP has received funding from the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) to support climate resiliency initiatives, natural resource education, and invasive species management within the Caddo Nation's jurisdiction. These funds enable CNEP to take proactive steps toward protecting our Tribal lands against the growing impacts of climate change. In the coming quarters, CNEP plans to apply for additional grants through both the EPA and BIA to expand its programs and enhance services for the Caddo Nation.

During the second quarter of the year, the Caddo Nation EPA program has been in talks about the next steps for the roll-off program. After providing roll-offs for the past year, the EPA Regional Officer has contacted the Caddo Nation Environmental program to provide a one-time supplemental funding to purchase a new truck and trailer for our roll-offs. This will allow our team to conduct more clean-ups on our land.

The Caddo Nation Environmental Department is working towards completing and using our 40,000-gallon rainwater catchment system. This will allow our firetrucks or any local authorities to fill up tankers in a hurry in case of wildfire or any other need. The tank is set to be Usable Summer 26. This tank is located at the Caddo Nation and is one of, if not the biggest, rainwater catchment systems that any tribe in Oklahoma has, making it one of a kind.

The Caddo Nation Environmental Department has been working with teams at the University of Oklahoma to test orphaned/abandoned wells that the Caddo Nation has a vested interest in. Our goal in this is to test these wells for methane leaks and/or other carbon-emitting gases and calculate how much has been released based on the supposed capping date or based on inactivity.

Our role in this is to be the boots on the ground and provide local knowledge to the teams at OU for smoother operation and testing of the wells. We also reached out to the individual owners/tenants in preparation for these visits to receive permission to enter the land. The current goal of these tasks is to document what wells are emitting, log that into a database, and after which we can prioritize high vs. low priority wells and address those through remediation efforts.

During the Second quarter (January – March 2026), the Caddo Nation Environmental Protection Program (CNEP) provided Roll-Off Dumpster Services to Six Tribal members. This service assists community members with the proper disposal of large volumes of waste, helping to maintain cleaner homes and properties across the Caddo Nation jurisdiction.

The Caddo Nation Environmental Program is looking into Multiple new funding opportunities, including possibly a new Water Tower for the Caddo Nation Complex. This will allow us to have our own water system.

To ensure equitable access to this limited-capacity service, the following policy is in place:

“If you have received service within the same EPA calendar year (October – September), you will be placed on a waitlist until the next funding period.”

This approach allows more Tribal members the opportunity to benefit from the program. Roll-off services are offered on a first-come, first-served basis, with availability three times per quarter. Service is scheduled according to the following calendar:

- ***1st Quarter: October – December***
- ***2nd Quarter: January – March***
- ***3rd Quarter: April – June***
- ***4th Quarter: July – September***

CNEP also offers in-home mold inspection services to Tribal members. All CNEP staff are certified mold inspectors and provide the following:

- ***On-site inspections and environmental assessments***
- ***Air or surface mold sampling (as needed)***
- ***Education on mold prevention and safe remediation practices***

Our services are aimed at promoting healthier indoor/outdoor environments by identifying and addressing potential hazardous and mold-related health risks. For further information on any services provided or information on the CNEP programs, please contact us.

CNDH is funded by an annual award through the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). This award allocation is to carry out an annual Indian Housing Plan (IHP) authorized by the U.S. Housing Act of 1937 (USHA) and the Native American Housing Assistance and Self-Determination Act (NAHASDA). IHPs are reviewed and approved yearly through the HUD Southern Plains Office of Native American Programs (SPONAP).

FY2026 Allocation: \$1,150,471.00 (Based on HUD formula allocation).

- CNDH staff completed three HUD-sponsored training events in the previous quarter.
- February 2026 – CNDH staff participated in NAHASDA Essentials training.
- A new Housing Manager was hired to provide intake services for our assistance programs.

The Caddo Nation Human Resources Department is responsible for:

1. Centralized Service Hub

- Below are goals we would like for the tribe. Currently we are evaluating what centralized hub will work best for what we need. I'm currently working with our media team to compare information we have gathered at the tribe to keep our website up to date.
 - . Create a single intake and navigation system for all tribal services. This would make sure tribal members are not turned away without being connected to a potential resource.
 - . Streamline access to programs in housing, employment, childcare, education...
 - . Create a Constituent Services page on the Caddo Nation Website

2. Case Management

- I am able to help constituents in directing them to services we have the tribe and help navigate services outside of the tribe.
- Ex. We no longer provide hunting and fishing licenses at the tribe in enrollment. We had a constituent call about land they wanted to hunt on. I was able to find out information on proper licensing for the land they wanted to hunt.
- Another Ex. A constituent was confused filling out a housing application. I was able to assist with that and confirm info they needed. I was able to work with the housing director and relayed how the application was confusing to the constituent. Their department was updating the application already and was able to make changes that I brought up as well.

3. Cross Departmental Coordination

 - . We have Department Director's meetings

- Collaboration with tribal, federal and state stakeholders
 - . I attend meeting with these stakeholders as they come up
- Highlight: While meeting with the housing department and getting up to date information, I was able to find out they now provide College Housing Assistance Program. Our Education Department was not aware of this service being added. Now the education director is able to pass this on to our college students in need.

Mission Statement: The Caddo Nation Victim's Services mission is to provide compassionate, culturally informed support and resources to individuals and families within our Tribal community who have experienced violence, trauma, or abuse. We are committed to honoring our heritage and traditions while offering confidential services, advocacy, and empowerment. Our goal is to ensure safety, healing, and justice for all survivors, fostering a supportive environment that respects and upholds the dignity of each person.

Services Offered: The Caddo Nation Victim Services Program offers the following services: Crisis Intervention; Intake and Assessment; Limited transportation assistance to assist clients to get to court, medical appointments, shelter placement, and other trips to meet the essential needs of the victim at the discretion of the Program Administrator; Assistance with completing and filing protection orders; safety planning Cultural and Spiritual Advocacy; Community connection resources; Building support networks; Assistance in locating an emergency shelter; Court advocacy; Assistance in locating medical services; Emergency transportation; SANE accompaniment; and Counseling referrals.

First Quarter Services Provided: The Program Administrator has provided the following services within this reporting period: Program Trainings; Victims Services Meetings; Transportation Assistance; Intake and Referral Services; and Referrals for services. The program Administrator also created and donated ribbon skirts to the Native Alliance Against Violence for their Sexual Assault Awareness Month Fashion Show. The program set up a resource table and provided program information at this event as well.

Vision and Future Plans: We are continuing community outreach efforts to inform tribal members that this program is available and here to support our members in anyway we are able to. Staff have completed a certification course in Victim Advocacy. The other building included in the patrol is shamrock financial which the tribe owns the building not the business. Also included is regency oak^s elder apartments and the activity building. The security department continues to patrol to the town of hinton for the child care center. Also located north east of the town of hinton on Methodist road by I-40 is offices for the tribal owned construction company this is also included in the daily patrols.

Then the Registry Coordinator took the paperwork for the registration, and entered and updated the offenders profile to keep up to date on the TTSORS website.

The SORNA Department currently has 2 employees under the SORNA Grant.

Nyles Parton is the SORNA Grant Supervisor, which oversees the Grant and the work completed by the SORNA Registry Coordinator. Baylen Bullcoming is the SORNA Registry Coordinator, which enters the sex offenders' information and registration into TTSORS every time they come in to register. This includes criminal history, physical descriptions, driver's license employment history, employer address, and etc. The 2 SORNA employees are taking online training and classes for the SORNA Grant. The Registry Coordinator is in charge of keeping the sex offenders records up to date, if anything changes with the sex offenders. The SORNA Department has 2 sex offenders. 1 offender is currently incarcerated, and the other sex offender comes in regularly for registration.

The Caddo Nation Social Services, Indian Child Welfare, and Adult Protective Services programs are located at the Community Health Building at 211 west Main, Anadarko Ok., 73005. The SS ICW APS programs provide referrals for children and families to promote reunification and stabilization. These referrals are within the Caddo Nation and other providers through state and tribal entities. The Caddo Nation also works with Bureau of Indian Affairs Social Service Program, and The Southern Plains Court of Indian Offences and other state Courts when it comes to child and adult welfare issues. The Caddo Nation has seen a rise in investigations as to children and have assisted a family placing their loved in one in out of home care. The Caddo Nation continues to have funding for family stabilization; these are for children who are eligible or members of the Caddo Nation as a preventative to removal and placed in out of home care.

42 children in out of home care in state custody

35 children in out of home care in guardianships

Currently we do not have any adult guardianships or IIM supervisions

No APS referrals tribally or with the State this quarter.

The Caddo Nation has attended the NICWA training in OKC, SPCPT monthly meetings and Tribal State Meetings. The Caddo Nation has attended court hearings, family meetings in person and virtually in the State of Oklahoma, Nevada, South Carolina, Kentucky, and Colorado,

Currently the Caddo Nation SS program is not providing any crisis or Li Heap assistance. If you have family whose children are placed, in out of care, or have any questions in regard to Social Services ICW please contact me at 405-901-4066.

The Caddo Nation Tag Office is open Monday-Friday 8am to 4:15 pm.

Between February 2026 and April 2026, the tag office had 452 renewals and 153 new tags registered.

To renew your tag, we need your DL and current insurance. You can either come in, mail in or email your information in.

To register a new vehicle, you can mail in your information or come to the office. We need your title, purchase agreement, and lien entry form. Also, your Oklahoma driver's license, CDIB and the current insurance.

- Total Bridges Assessed – 2 (to be added to Caddo Nation Inventory)

Departmental Highlights

- Working on a new office move, 90% complete and currently working out of new office space.
- Attended contracts training hosted by The Office of Tribal Transportation in Fountain Hills, AZ
- Completed transportation budget to include the purchase of equipment to be used to maintain and repair roads under The Caddo Nation inventory.
- The Safe Streets for All grant, administered and executed by Rondo Kopepasah, has been modified extending the period for completion. This grant will provide a Transportation Action Safety Plan. Current status of the grant, getting a road assessment completed by an outside vendor. One has been confirmed will to take on the project of 638 complete road miles.
- Rondo Kopepasah working with LTAP OSU, free course offered and specialized for all aspects of the Transportation field; upon completion of these courses a certification of Road Scholar will be presented. *Classes completed 6 of 7 (final course has not been scheduled)*
- Installed parking blocks and safety bollards at the Caddo Nation Fire House
- Replaced 4 rural stop signs in cooperation with the County
- Researching application licensing that would allow transportation to apply weed killer around signage for more visibility.
- Emily Scheffler, Safety/Fleet Coordinator, has done a great job establishing the fleet program for the Caddo Nation by bring vehicles up to date on tags, registration, vehicle service, vehicle recalls, completing reports to finance, and finding cost efficient options for vehicle tracking.
