Starting with no existing clients in August 2015, to having to stop accepting new clients in 2019, the community has embraced the business as Dr. Beth and her staff continue to enjoy seeing and caring for furry family members of friends new and old.

“It is a fulfilling feeling to know your clients and patients by name and are able to provide the best care possible with a compassionate and capable team,” she said. “We are very focused on quality of life from a few weeks old through the senior years.”

With their focus on regenerative medicine, the clinic is able to provide laser therapy for painful joints, muscles, and injuries, speeding healing. After special training and purchase of special equipment, they are performing intraarticular Platelet Rich Plasma injections.

“Every day is dynamic, with new challenges and experiences, and that is what keeps this profession interesting,” she said. “We see a very diverse range of issues that one would never expect in a clinic this small and a town this size.”
