

Tampa Theatre opened on Oct. 15, 1926 as one of America's most elaborate movie palaces. Like other lavish downtown movie theaters around the country, Tampa Theatre was enormously popular when it opened. For 25 cents the common person could escape into an opulent fantasyland cooled by "man-made air," enjoy first-class entertainment, and be treated like royalty by platoons of uniformed ushers.

Times changed and the theater was scheduled for demolition. By the time Tampa Theatre reopened to the public in January 1977, it had become something of a national model for how to save an endangered theater. It was named to the National Register of Historic Places in 1978, and as a Tampa City Landmark when the designation was created in 1988.

Nosferatu: A Symphony of Horror (1922) 1h 34m / Not Rated / Silent Horror

Nosferatu was the product of Prana Film, a German film studio. Nosferatu was the only film produced by the firm, as it declared bankruptcy shortly after the film's release. It's an unauthorized adaptation of Bram Stoker's Dracula, whose copyright-holders sued and won; the court ordered all copies of the film destroyed, but a couple prints made it overseas.

We'll see *Nosferatu* as close to how it would have been seen in 1922 as is possible. <u>Tampa</u> <u>Theatre's artist-in-residence</u>, (and a new Tampa Chapter AGO member) Steven Ball, will be performing the film's score live on our Mighty Wurlitzer organ, an experience not to be missed.


