Kavin Alderman

My name is Kavin Alderman, but my middle name is Sam, and it is what I'm used to being called. I am a student at the University of Oklahoma right now, but I was born and raised in Tampa, Florida, and I studied organ with Dr. Hebert and Dr. Mardirosian at the University of Tampa during my undergrad years.

My undergraduate degree is a B.A. in Music, but now I'm completing two master's degrees simultaneously. I'm the first student at the University of Oklahoma to pursue an M.M. in Piano Performance and Pedagogy at the same time as an M.M. in Organ Performance (with a concentration in church music). To me, it is strange that I'm the first, and that others haven't done something similar.

Current artistic involvement in the Tampa Bay Area includes having accepted an Artist in Residence position at the historic Tampa Theatre in addition to currently teaching Sacred Music at Tampa Jesuit and serving as the Organist and Interim Director of Music at All Saints Episcopal Church in Lakeland, FL. I have known the region for a long time, first having visited about 15 years ago during the time that I was finishing my Doctorate at the University of Michigan to conduct research here and interview Rosa Rio regarding her early professional work in motion picture theatre (this was also my introduction to the Tampa Theatre). Since her passing at the age of 107 in 2010, I had become good friends and took over for her silent film performances.

Previous appointments have included several prominent churches and public institutions across the country over the years including as Organist and Director of Outreach (now Emeritus) for the world's largest pipe organ in Atlantic City, at the Cathedrals of Detroit and Philadelphia as well as previously having been on the faculty of the Organ Department at the University of Michigan.

All of my students there are embarking on a very special project this year celebrating the Vatican designated Ignatian Year May 20, 2021 – July 31,2022 which is a commemoration of the 500th Anniversary of the Conversion of St. Ignatius and the 400th Anniversary of the Canonization of St. Ignatius of Loyola. As a part of this work, the students have been granted access to a very special collection of scores from the Archive Musical Chiquitos of Conception Bolivia which preserves a large body of recently discovered music by Domenico Zipoli–the namesake of the competitive organ scholarship currently offered to students at Jesuit. All of the musical material and directed study covered this academic year will feature prominently as a part of the spring Sacred Music Concert this coming March 30, 2022 at 7:00 PM. This is the first event of its kind on that campus in the exceptionally beautiful and reverberant Italianate Chapel.

Andre Botero


Hello, my name is Andre Botero, and I am a young organist joining the Tampa Chapter for Organists. I am 16 years old, and I attend Jesuit High School in Tampa, FL. Through Jesuit High School's Scholarship Program, I was accepted, both this year and last year, as a Zipoli Scholar, which means that I was hand-selected to learn how to play the organ under Mr. Philip Jakob (last year) and Dr. Steven Ball (currently). In addition, I play for school masses and Sunday masses, accompany the orchestra, and perform at an organ recital every semester.
