- Duration of your experiment (e.g. 8 weeks)
- What songs you practiced to, your tempo/BPM

RESULTS

- Presents the experimental data without interpretation
- Compare your before and after scores from the assessment questionnaire
- Summarise your findings in-context using tools like tables and graphs

DISCUSSION

- This is where you interpret the results of your experiment
- Did you see the benefits you expected?
- Document the significance and the limitations of your experiment research
- Make suggestions for next steps (maybe someone else will conduct their own experiment)

- Here is where you wrap up your ideas and summarise all of the data
