Maximum Electricity Price To Remain At 60 p/kwh for March 2026

The maximum unit price that Sark Electricity Limited (“SEL”) can charge for electricity will remain at 60 p/unit for March 2026.

This is because the demand for electricity reported by SEL for December 2025 and January 2026 has been c12-15% lower than the demand reported for the same period last year, and c12-15% lower than the forecast provided by SEL when the new price control was introduced from October 2025.

This level of demand reduction reported by SEL has been persistent since the start of the new price control. It means that the fixed costs associated with the SEL business have to be spread across a lower demand base and this results in a higher unit price.

Given that there appears to be no obvious macroeconomic reason for this material drop in demand, I have commenced an investigation into the data reported by SEL each month. This may extend to a full audit conducted at the SEL offices. To the extent that this investigation results in the need for a retrospective correction, this will be given effect in the price control correction mechanism in future months.
