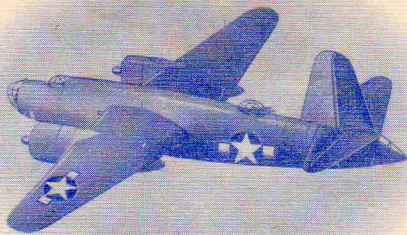
Dear Anne
