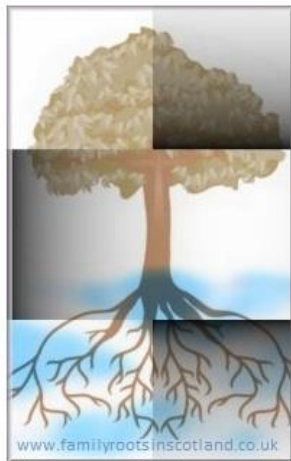

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# The Surname Name

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## Surname

This long-established and distinguished surname, having no less than seven Coats or Arms, and with several notable entries in the "Dictionary of National Biography", is of Old Surnameish origin ....

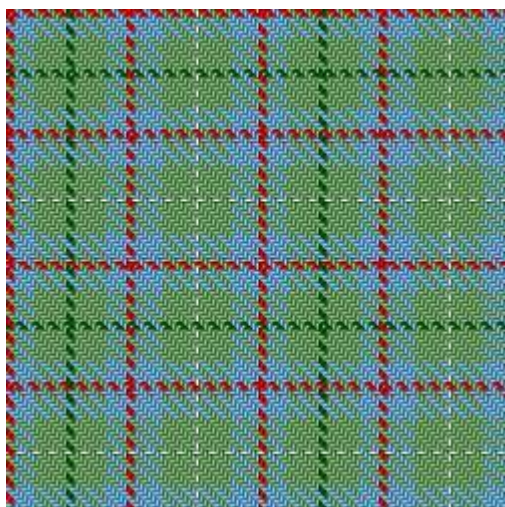
This surname was first taken in the 13th Century by the head of a cadet branch of the clan ....., their name being a patronymic form of ".....", Anglo-French forms of the ..... name ".....".

In 1205, ....., witnessed the gift of the Church of ....., second ....., and in 1230, he was granted a charter of the ..... George Surname (1516 - 1572) was a historian and Latin scholar of European fame.

The Coat of Arms most associated with this family is a ..... The first recorded spelling of the family name is shown to be that of ....., who witnessed ..... which was dated circa 1225. Surnames became necessary when governments introduced personal taxation. In England this was known as Poll Tax. Throughout the centuries, surnames in every country have continued to "develop" often leading to astonishing variants of the original spelling.

<b>Birth:</b>	<p>28<sup>th</sup> ....., 1719</p> <p>.....shire</p> <p>Assumption - the son of John Surname and Janet Surname</p> <p>The Assumption is based on whether William and Margaret followed the usual Naming Conventions for their children – taken from their firstborn son and second born daughter</p> <p>Source: <a href="#">Birth Record (supplied)</a></p>
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<b>Death:</b>	Unknown
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## Margaret Surname

<b>Birth:</b>	<p>13<sup>th</sup> ....., 1720</p> <p>.....shire</p> <p>Assumption - the daughter of John Surname</p> <p>Balfon is identified as her Parish at the time of her Marriage</p> <p>This is the only Surnameish Birth Record available for Balfon within suitable dates</p> <p>Source: <a href="#">Birth Record (supplied)</a></p>
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<b>Death:</b>	Unknown
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# Archibald Surname & Hellen Surname

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<b>Marriage:</b>	Their son, Joseph Surname below, is "Gotten in Adultery"  There is no Marriage record for Archibald and Helen
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<b>Family:</b>	Joseph Surname	see below
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## Archibald Surname

<b>Birth:</b>	<p>13<sup>th</sup> ....., 1749</p> <p>.....shire</p> <p>Assumed – the son of William Surname and Margaret Surname</p> <p>From Joseph's Birth Record below, Archibald's Witness was "William Surname". This ..... have been his father, or more likely his brother, William, born on 29<sup>th</sup> ....., 1751</p> <p>Sources: <a href="#">Birth Record (supplied)</a></p>
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<b>Death:</b>	Unknown
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## Hellen Surname

<b>Birth:</b>	<p>24<sup>th</sup> ....., 1754</p> <p>Remembering the era, and the multiple spellings of names, IF "Hellen" is correct, then a "Hellen Surname was born on this date, registered in .....shire to John Surname &amp; Ellen .....</p> <p>From Joseph's Birth Record below, Hellen's Witness was "John Surname". This ..... may have been her father, or perhaps a brother. John &amp; Ellen had a son, John, born on 15<sup>th</sup> ....., 1748</p> <p>Given Joseph's Birth record below, where he is described as "Gotten in Adultery", it is unclear whether Hellen's surname is a married or maiden name</p> <p>Sources: <a href="#">ScotlandsPeople</a>, <a href="#">Birth Record (supplied)</a></p>

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<b>Family:</b>	Mary Surname	b 23 <sup>rd</sup> ....., 1823, in .....shire d < 1829 1829 is the year Joseph and Mary's daughter - Mary - is born. Being the second use of the name Mary, it suggests this older Mary has died before 1829

	Elizabeth Surname	b 25 <sup>th</sup> ....., 1825, in .....shire m Andrew ..... on 19 <sup>th</sup> ....., 1846 at Lennoxton of Campsie d <1851 By the time of the 1851 Census, Andrew ..... (who was staying with Joseph & Mary Surname) was described as a Widower There is no Death record available
	James Surname	b 10 <sup>th</sup> ....., 1827, in .....shire
	Mary Surname	b 17 <sup>th</sup> ....., 1829, in .....shire

## Joseph Surname

<b>Birth:</b>	14 <sup>th</sup> ....., 1784  "Gotten in Adultery"  The son of Archibald Surname and Helen Surname  Baptised  <a href="#">Source: Birth Record (supplied)</a>
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<b>Occupation:</b>	Innkeeper and Vintner  At the time of the 1861 Census, he is described as a "Chelsea Pensioner"  Described as a Grocer on his Death record  Described as an Army Pensioner on Mary's Death record  <a href="#">Source: various Census records (supplied)</a>
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<b>Death:</b>	1 <sup>st</sup> ....., 1862, aged 78  Died of Cancer after 9 months, at Main Street, ....shire  Death registered by his Grandson Joseph .....,  <a href="#">Source: Death Record (supplied)</a>
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## Mary Surname

<b>Birth:</b>	<p>2<sup>nd</sup> ....., 1789</p> <p>Birth registered in ....shire. Baptised on 7th ....., 1789</p> <p>Aged 45 at time of 1841 Census Aged 60 in 1851 Census</p> <p>The eldest child of Thomas Surname and Catherine Surname</p> <p><a href="#">Source: Birth Record (supplied)</a></p>
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<b>Parents:</b>	<p>Thomas Surname (Carrier/Miner – c1762-1819) and Catharine Surname (1769-1825)</p> <p><a href="#">Sources: Mary's Birth, Marriage and Death Records (supplied), ScotlandsPeople</a></p>
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<b>Other:</b>	<p>Her younger sister, Catherine (aged 25 then 35) is staying with the family in both 1841 &amp; 1851 Census. Along with Catherine, another sister, Margaret, appears in the 1861 Census</p> <p><a href="#">Sources: 1841/1851 Census Records (supplied)</a></p>
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<b>Death:</b>	<p>10<sup>th</sup> ....., 1870, aged 81</p> <p>Died of Disease of the Stomach at .....shire</p> <p>Her Death record identifies her father as Thomas Surname, a Miner, and her mother as Catherine "Surnamex" - but Mary and Catherine's Birth records identify their mother as C(K)atharine Surname</p> <p>Death registered by her Grandson Peter ..... (who would never have known his Grandmother</p> <p><a href="#">Source: Death Record (supplied)</a></p>
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## Archibald Surname

<b>Birth:</b>	29th ....., 1824  .....shire  The elder son of Joseph Surname and Mary Surname  <a href="#">Source: Birth Record (supplied)</a>
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<b>Occupation:</b>	Brewery Engine Keeper  Described as a Millworker at the time of his Marriage  <a href="#">Sources: various Census, Marriage and Death Records (supplied)</a>
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<b>Death:</b>	9 <sup>th</sup> ....., 1880, aged 56  Died of Intestinal Obstruction at .....,  Death registered by his son James  <a href="#">Source: Death Record (supplied)</a>
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## Isabella Surname

<b>Birth:</b>	c1829  Born in .....shire. 1881 Census has an entry for Archibald and Isabella Surname, living at ..... Birth Year calculated from her age thereon  Family Search has Isabella Surname born in 1832 at .....shire  <a href="#">Sources: Various Census Records (supplied), Family Search</a>
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<b>Parents:</b>	John Surname (Blacksmith – 1803-1849) and Isabella Surname (c1798-1844)  <a href="#">Source: Isabella's Death Record (supplied)</a>
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<b>Death:</b>	7 <sup>th</sup> ....., 1889, aged 59  Died of Pneumonia and Failure of the Heart at .....  Registered by her son James  <a href="#">Source: Death Record (supplied)</a>
