CAPT. JIM'S

TOON TIPS



It's summertime! It's hot! Humidity is through the roof! The perfect storm for MILDEW.

There are many remedies for removing mildew from your vinyl upholstery. However, most of the cleaners do not do a complete removal. I have found the use of soft scrub with bleach will remove 99% of all mildew.

It is very important to be very careful with this cleaner. First, clean all your vinyl with marine spray nine and a medium soft bristle brush. Then rinse with clean water. A spray bottle and towel will work.

For any areas of mildew left, as an example, on the top of the backs of the seats, apply soft scrub generously over that area and just spread it around with the brush. **DO NOT TO TRY TO DO ALL THE MILDEW AT ONE TIME. DO ONLY SMALL AREAS AT A TIME (2 TO 3 FEET).** Let the application of soft scrub sit for 20-30 minutes, DO NOT LET IT DRY. Come back and apply more soft scrub on top of that and spread around with brush again. Let sit for another 20-30 minutes. Come back with your scrub brush and brush in circular motion over all the covered area. Do this procedure as many times as needed to remove all mildew.

Wipe off all the soft scrub with a rag or paper towel. Take a spray bottle with water and rinse area and dry with a towel. Do this three times. If you have applied the soft scrub over any stitching, take the spray bottle and squirt the stitching where you applied soft Scrub. Dry with a towel, repeat this step three times.

When totally dry, coat the vinyl with either Maguires 57 or 303 rubber and vinyl protectant. Under normal circumstances you should be able to reapply the protectant about every month and a half without having to scrub or clean the vinyl. I know this is complicated but it will remove the majority of any mildew.

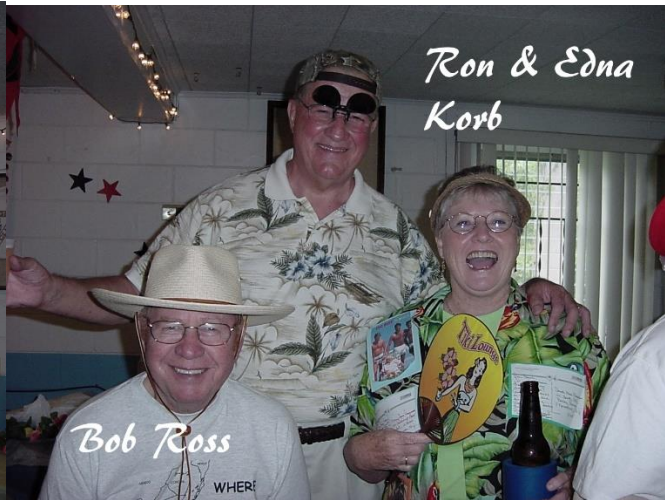

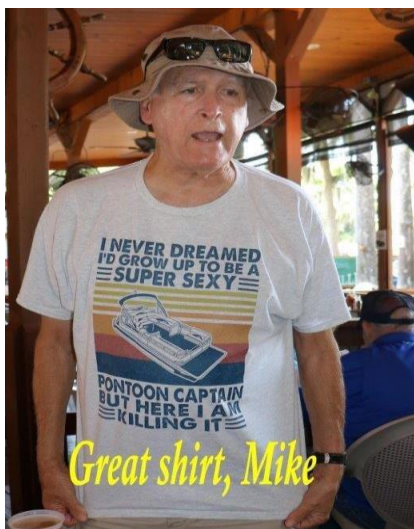
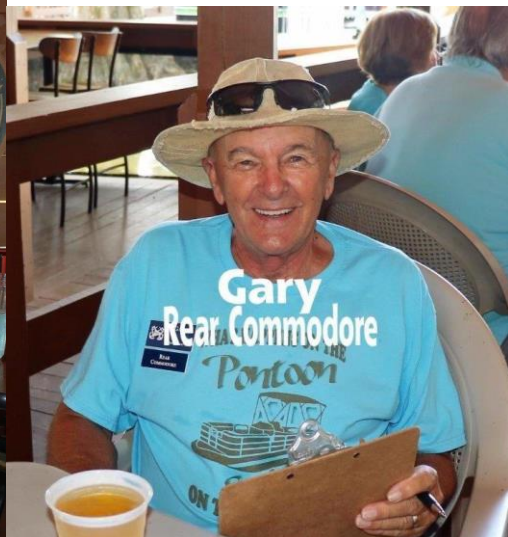
